

Mass Intentions

Every year around February 1st we begin taking Mass intentions for the following year. This year we are making a change! But before we get into the change, let's have a quick chat about Mass Intentions.

The purpose of a Mass intention is to call down the Grace of God on the person or people we are praying for. At Mass we are praying with the Communion of Saints (named Saints of the Church and family members and friends that have gone before us). Imagine that force of prayer coming at you!

Mass intentions can be offered for anyone living or deceased. It can be in honor of a Birthday, Anniversary, Date of Death, or other special day. When you request a Mass intention it can be for one person, a couple of people, or a family.

We often get the question: how much does it cost for the Mass intention? "The Mass offering established for our province (the entire state of WI) is \$10. (From the Chancery Newsletter)

So now that we have a basic understanding of what a Mass intention is, here are the new guidelines for Holy Angels:

- 1. The Mass Intention book for 2023 will not open until July of 2022. We will not take any Mass intentions for 2023 until July.
- 2. You will be allowed to request three (3) Masses; one

weekend Mass and two weekday Masses.

- 3. The First Friday of the month will be open for multiple intentions so that families with recently deceased members can get a Mass said within the year. (Doing this since 2020.)
- 4. All Christmas and Easter Masses will be for the Living and Deceased Members of Holy Angels. We will not be taking other Mass intentions for those days.

We are making these changes for a few reasons. First, for many years we have filled the entire year with Mass intentions before the year started. And 2022 is no different. We had to let people know that the entire 2022 book was full at the end of 2021. Cutting down the number of Masses each person can request will hopefully leave some more space for others looking for Masses to be said.

Second, it is harder and harder to find help-out priests for weekdays. If there is an emergency or the priest is on vacation and can't find a help-out we need to cancel the Mass and that intention needs to get moved. With no space left in the year, that intention would need to get moved a whole year away. Not ideal.

We know this is quite a change from years past but we believe it will work better for the Parish. Once July comes around feel free to come in or call to schedule a Mass. We will put a reminder in the bulletin. If you have a recently deceased family member or friend, know that the first Friday of the month is still available to you.

EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Family Connection: Jesus was the one sent by God to bring salvation to the world. Jesus announced that mission using the framework we hear in today's Gospel from the prophet Isaiah: glad tidings will be brought to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight for the blind, and freedom for the oppressed. Jesus inaugurates the Kingdom of God in his person—through his life, death, and Resurrection. We are charged with the task of continuing the mission that Jesus began. Jesus set the framework for all of us when he announced his ministry in today's Gospel. Jesus also gave us the helper we would need to enable us to participate in his mission. The Holy Spirit has been given to us so that we, the Church, might serve the Kingdom of God.

Gather with your family and suggest that they try to picture the vision that Jesus describes using the words of the prophet Isaiah as you read today's Gospel, Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21. Think about your neighborhood, your community. What are the situations and who are the people who most need to see this vision fulfilled? What steps would be necessary to make the vision a reality for them? Make a family commitment to pray for the Kingdom of God and to take a particular action that will address a need you see in your community. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you by praying the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.


