





#### RACIAL JUSTICE REFLECTIONS: DO YOU KNOW YOUR FAMILY HISTORY?

This month we celebrate Black History Month. I am not Black. Thanks to the efforts of extended family members, I can trace my family history back to Irish immigrants arriving in Milwaukee by way of New York, and Polish family members still living in Eastern Poland. This summer someone I met in West Bend discovered we are related on my maternal great grandfather's side. I am amazed! White people's ancestors, it seems, are comparatively easy to find.

When tracing family history, many Black people can't go any farther back than 1870. The names of enslaved people weren't listed on Census documents. Forced relocation, immigration, and premature death all blot out the histories of families of color. Racial disparities even infect the supposed objectivity of genetic analysis. Companies like AncestryDNA and 23andMe determine your background by comparing your DNA to the DNA in a "reference panel" of people of different ethnicities. Most of the DNA in that data set is from European -descended people, meaning results are significantly "more detailed for white people."

Do you know your family history? If you are fortunate in this regard, consider the reality of those who are not so lucky. This month, take time to explore Black History, and discover how Black Americans have contributed to our shared culture today. For more information, contact us at racialjustice@hawb.org.

#### **EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER**

**Sunday Family Connection**: Today's Gospel offers a contrast to many of the messages we hear in our society today. If we were to accept uncritically the "get ahead" messages of our culture, we would think that happiness means having money, being successful, and having many possessions. In this way, we are not unlike the people who heard Jesus teach on the day that he taught the Beatitudes. They too associated happiness with possessions and success. The report of the Beatitudes in Luke's Gospel, however, takes things one step further. Not only will we not find happiness through the "get ahead" messages of the world, but relying upon these messages will cause us harm. The warnings spoken are particularly challenging because they suggest that our way of life must change if we are to gain the lasting happiness of eternal life.

Talk together as a family about what society tells us makes a person successful. Make a list of the traits that you associate with a successful person. Then read together today's Gospel, Luke 6:17,20-26. Reflect on Jesus' description of blessedness in the Kingdom of God. Then consider the warnings. Why are these surprising and challenging? What, then, is the measure of success in the Kingdom of God? Together write prayers of petition based on your discussion. Pray these prayers together, asking God to help your family seek the blessings of the Kingdom of God.


