

Do What?

The call to conversion is always initiated by God. It comes when we least expect it, rarely is easy and asks of us what we initially believe to be impossible. Usually we end up asking God, "you want me to do what?" We don't necessarily

have to do what Abraham did, what Paul did or what the apostles did – sometimes the simplest act is the most difficult, yet it is what God asks of us. All the above, including Jesus in his own right, were called to respond to the voice of God in their lives, the readings give us insight into what that will mean.

We must trust that God has a plan, even though that plan may not make a lot of sense to us immediately, we are reminded, God's ways are not our ways. While trusting the plan, we trust at the same time God will be at our side as the plan is fulfilled. Conversion is a process, not an instant event and then it's over. We will be led through the process.

We must engage the plan and do our part. All the actors in the scriptures had to do their part in cooperating with the plan whether convenient or inconvenient as Paul would say. The more we engage the call, the more sense it makes over time. The disciples, the community of Philippi, and Abraham all had questions that over time were answered.

Just because we may get things wrong every now and then does not mean God gives up on us. God is not fickle like we are, and we must thank God for that. We may become tired, we may allow fear to stymie our progress, we may simply lose our way, but God is ever faithful and will get us back on track if we are listening. Such is the incredible love of God.

As previously mentioned, Lent is the time when we get back to being "doers of the word", of calling out in our distress and believing God will be there to address our need. Conversion may demand a lot from us, but it is the only thing that will bring us life to the full.

EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Family Connection: In today's Gospel, the voice from heaven speaks to the disciples saying, "Listen to him." The Transfiguration was a focused moment for the disciples when they heard God speaking to them and experienced Jesus in glory. They most certainly left this focused moment with a new appreciation for the importance of Jesus' words even if they did not yet understand everything that he had taught them. During Lent, we are invited to consider our attentiveness to Jesus and to one another. In the pace and noise that often characterizes family life, how well do we listen to one another? What opportunities do we have for quiet prayer?

As you gather as a family, count the number of pieces of equipment in your home that produce sound: televisions, radios, CD players, computers, video games, etc. Observe if sometimes more than one piece of equipment is playing simultaneously and how this might affect communication. Discuss the question: What is it like to try to talk with one another when this equipment is on? Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 9:28-36. Consider whether the noise and pace of your family life allows family members opportunities for quiet prayer. During Lent, it may be appropriate for your family to choose a time for quiet in the household by turning off televisions, radios, and CD players. Consider whether your family would like to establish such a time during this Season of Lent and suggest that it

might allow you the opportunity to listen more attentively to one another and to find time for quiet prayer. Spend a few such moments as a


