

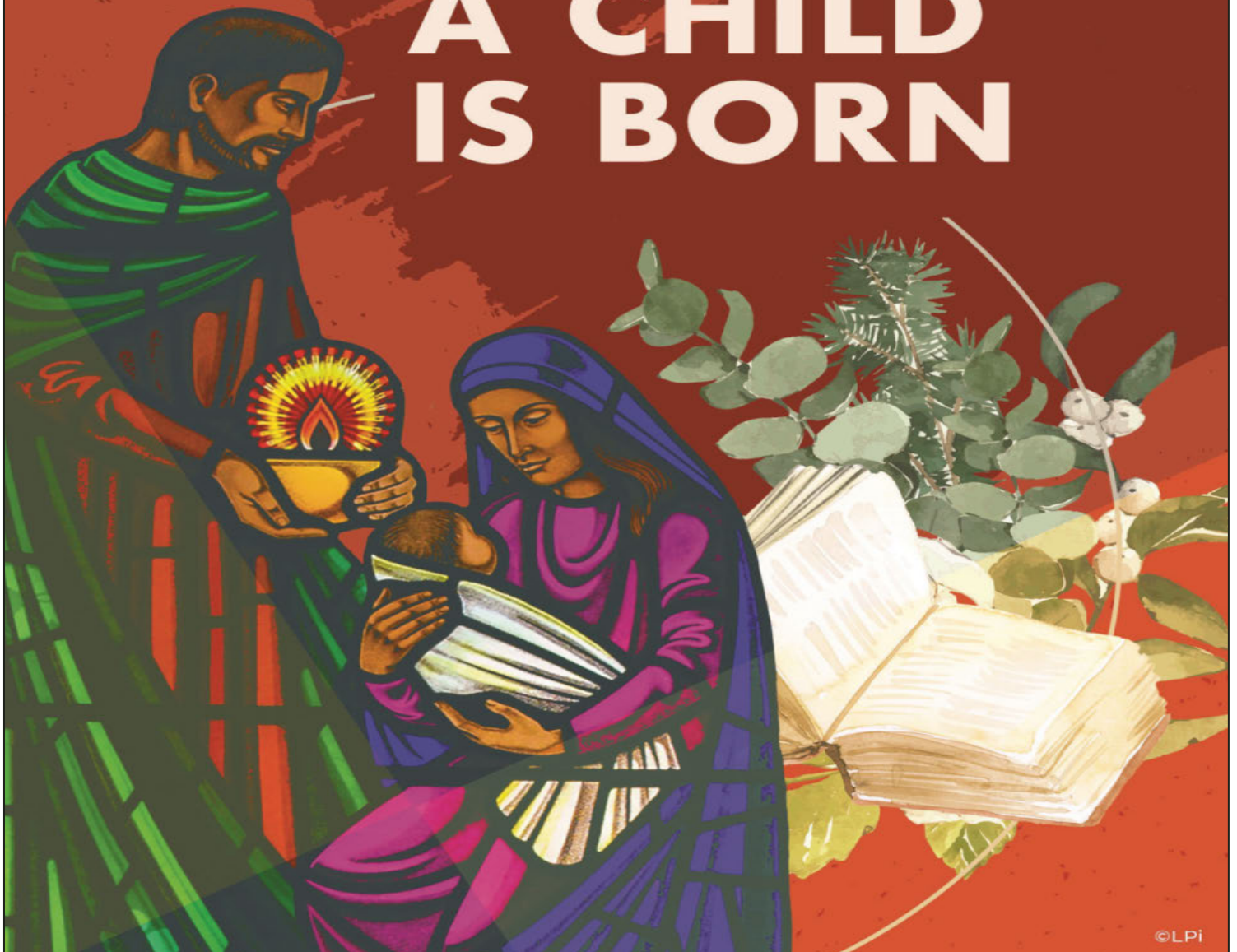

### It's About Hope

I suspect we have all been there (even a few of the youngest among us); we have a day and/or a few days where we wonder, "If it is all worth it." Whatever the "it" might be (personal, professional, relational, political, theological), we enter a dark time and that time could last a few hours or it may last a few days, weeks or months. The issues can drag us down and usually every aspect of our lives suffer to some degree. In a "worst case scenario", the effects of dark times like these can be destructive – maybe even fatal. These moments remind us of why we need Advent and even more so why we need to celebrate Christmas. Advent and Christmas speak to us of a message of hope and the necessity of hope if we are to survive at all.

The prophet Isaiah tells us "the people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing..." (Is 9:1-2) Isaiah had been chastising the people, letting them know that all that had befallen them was largely due to their own actions, but he doesn't stop there – he reminds them God's love is bigger than their human frailty and there are many reasons to have hope. That hope will carry them through the darkness they have known and they will come to know the world God intends. Paul's letter to Titus carries a similar message. The grace of God tells us to "reject godless ways and worldly desires and to live temperately, justly, and devoutly in this age as we await the blessed hope..." (Titus 2:11-12) He speaks of the hope one finds in Jesus

and in the message of Jesus. This hope will help us change the world through the grace and power of God. The Gospel of Luke, relating to us the nativity story, is a powerful message of hope to a people who have known so much "darkness." The darkness they have known was pervasive in their worlds of politics, economics, theology, and so much more. Many of the people knew nothing more than desperation and then there is this message of hope! It is a message that tells people the darkness does not win; the darkness of politics, the darkness of economics, the darkness of skewed theologies, the darkness of desperation and the darkness of relationships. In the most basic act of the birth of a child, God's hand brings us hope and reminds us we are not abandoned in our greatest moments of need.

We need this powerful message of hope because we are not that much different from those during the time of Isaiah, Titus or Luke. Our politics, economics, theology, relationships, spirituality and life circumstances can and often times does cover us with a blanket of darkness. We need, as many before us, a message of hope. We need reminding that the light of Christ, we celebrate in the Incarnation, will pierce the darkness and be a source of hope; open doors of joy and possibilities. As we trust the message and embrace the hope, we begin to usher change into our world through the power of God. No magic but faith found in the power of hope.

It is about hope! May we experience that hope as we listen carefully to the message of the sacred scriptures and celebrate this sacred time.

**We Have Openings for Children in Our 3K Program:** Holy Angels School offers a three day & five day K3 program as a pre-school opportunity. Both offer a half-day or full-day option. Requirements for children entering the three-year-old kindergarten are as follows:

- Age three (3) before September 1st
- Record of immunization
- Non-refundable first month's tuition and instructional fee
- An original birth certificate for recording information
- \$25.00 non-refundable registration fee
- Child must be toilet trained

Class size is usually limited to 16 students per session, with a classroom aide. A waiting list will be established when the class limit has been reached. The school reserves the option to increase the class size in order to accept all students on the waiting list as of August 1st. Registrations are accepted on a first-registered-first assigned basis. **RACIAL JUSTICE REFLECTIONS: WHAT DID JESUS LOOK LIKE?**

The Word of God entered history in the person of Jesus with God's message of love to all people: The Gospel. Over the centuries, the Middle East, Africa, Asia and the New World came to embrace Him as their Savior and developed a variety of traditions of worship and iconography, Jesus today is most often pictured as a white European.

Rev. John Meier says in his magisterial series of books, *A Marginal Jew*, "Were we to see Jesus today we might be shocked, given the European images we're used to. Just look at men in Galilee today to begin to understand what he might have looked like." Father James Martin SJ agrees that images of Jesus showing Him as he probably looked are needed. He also supports more inclusive images like those of John Nava, whose models for many of the saints are based on a mixture of "neighborhood people."

**EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER**

**Sunday Connection:** At Christmas we celebrate the great mystery that God became flesh and dwelt among us. We call this mystery the *Incarnation* (the word means "to take on flesh"), and it changes everything. Today's Gospel reminds us that we can also look upon the Nativity from God's perspective to better appreciate the significance of the Incarnation. The mystery we proclaim at Christmas is that God, the very God who created all things from nothing and who is light itself, took on our humanity in order to transform us. Through his birth among us, we have seen the face of God and have become nothing less than God's own children. At this awesome mystery, we adore.

Gather as a family around your Nativity set. Keep this image before you and talk about how familiar we are with this scene. Invite members of the family to recall the details of Jesus' birth that we hear in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Observe that the Gospel of John invites us to consider Jesus' birth from a different perspective. Read together today's Gospel, John 1:1-14.

John's Gospel reminds us that the image we see in our Nativity set is a most remarkable sight: God made himself at home with us by taking on flesh and becoming a human person. We call this mystery the Incarnation. What are some of the things that John's Gospel says happened for us because Jesus came to dwell among us? (Light overcame darkness; we see God's glory in Jesus; we became children of God.) Together thank God for this mystery of the Incarnation and the salvation that we received because Jesus was born among us. Sing together a Christmas hymn, such as "O Come, All Ye Faithful" or "Silent Night."
