God Bless Us All

After almost forty years of ministry, I have grown in my appreciation of the love God has for all people, no exceptions and no conditions. Every year I ask God to help me to grow in my ability to love like that. I have ministered to saints and sinners, believers and non-believers, to Catholics and non-Catholics, Jews, Muslims and those who claim to be Atheist and/or nothing at all. In each of them, over time, I have experienced the presence of God – for some it may take a little longer to get there but eventually I do get there and grow in my knowledge of the mysterious and marvelous ways of the God we believe in. As one scans over the history of our church we have not always appreciated nor believed in the universal love of God but over time we have grown closer and that is a blessing for all of us.

The belief all are called to the Kingdom of God is supported by the Feast of the Epiphany and by the sacred scriptures we hear proclaimed during this holy celebration. The prophet Isaiah tells us that people from the east and west (non-believers) shall come together “proclaiming the praises of the Lord.” (Is 60:6) Paul tells the

community of Ephesus “the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.” (Eph 3:5-6) Finally, in the gospel the magi (once again non-believers) pay homage to the child (Immanuel) while those who ought to have known better miss him completely and/or try to destroy the child. We have to ask, was it pride, arrogance, triumphalism (sense of superiority over another) that prevented folks of the time to see what was right before them. The gospel makes it clear that those kind of sins may prevent one from entering the Kingdom, membership; titles, etc. do not guarantee us anything.

As we look in the mirror, we must be willing to ask ourselves what prevents us from seeing the presence of God in all people. What steps must we take to see the hand of God in those who are not “like us” in so many ways? As we open ourselves to the universal call of God, yes even to us, God becomes so much bigger and we are more likely to respond to folks with a spirit of inclusiveness rather than exclusiveness.

I invite all to celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany with open eyes and hearts. May the experience of Immanuel bring all together and not pull us apart – no matter who we are. - Blessings, Fr. Howard

We Have Openings for Children in Our 3K Program: Holy Angels School offers a three day & five day K3 program as a pre-school opportunity. Both offer a half-day or full-day option. Requirements for children entering the three-year-old kindergarten are as follows:

- Age three (3) before September 1st
- An original birth certificate for recording information
- Record of immunization
- \$25.00 non-refundable registration fee
- Non-refundable first month's tuition and instructional fee
- Child must be toilet trained

Class size is usually limited to 16 students per session, with a classroom aide. A waiting list will be established when the class limit has been reached. The school reserves the option to increase the class size in order to accept all students on the waiting list as of August 1st. Registrations are accepted on a first-registered-first assigned basis. 

RACIAL JUSTICE REFLECTIONS: THE EPIPHANY

This weekend we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. The word "epiphany" means "manifestation." Symbolically, the three Magi, who traveled from foreign lands following the star faithfully and bringing gifts for the Christ-child, represent that Christ came for everyone. Similarly, each of us brings our own unique gifts to share in Christ's Kingdom.

As Pope Francis said in his 2018 Mass celebrating the Epiphany: *"Jesus allows Himself to be found by those who seek Him, but to find Him we need to get up and go, not sit around, but take risks, not stand still, but set out."* We must set out *"to do good without counting the cost, even when unasked, even when you gain nothing thereby, even if it is unpleasant. That is what God wants."*

In this New Year, if you are an armchair Christian, commit to get off the chair and follow the "star." Discover the light of the Lord manifested in the face of each person, building His Kingdom here on earth. Step out of your familiar routine to encounter Christ in the face of people of color. Find Christ in the face of immigrants. Be welcoming, open, and courageous. Let 2023 be the year when we reject mediocrity and expel the darkness with the light of our faith. EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Connection: The tradition of giving gifts at Christmas is thought by some to be rooted in the gift giving of the Magi. In many cultures, gifts are not exchanged at Christmas, but rather on the feast of the Epiphany. Whenever you exchange your Christmas gifts, take some time to reflect on this tradition of gift giving at Christmas. Think of the best gift you have received. What was it? What made it special? Was it the gift itself, the thought that went into it, or the person who gave it to you?

Read today's Gospel, Matthew 2:1-12. The gifts of the Magi—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—have come to be understood as symbols of Christ's royalty, divinity, and eventual suffering and death. They are special because in giving them, the Magi acknowledge who Jesus was to be: our Savior. We pray that we will acknowledge Jesus as Savior in all that we do and say. Conclude by singing together "We Three Kings."
