News and Notes



The "Love One Another Campaign" which ended last June (at least the active fund-raising part of it), is now in the phase of collecting the monies folks pledged over the next five years. The monies, in the process of being collected, will be used for three major projects that will

benefit the parish in numerous ways. You may recall the three projects are:

- 1. Upgrades to Holy Angels Cemetery which include, at least as of the writing of this article, redoing the drive, purchasing some land, landscaping, replacing buildings for cemetery equipment and building a columbaria for cremains. The intent is to make the cemetery a more beautiful and prayerful space.
- 2. Replace the roof of the church and make some upgrades to the environment around the church building and other parts of the parish campus.
- 3. The final project of the campaign is to work on the interior of the church. Creating a new sacristy space, paint, cleaning and other odds and ends yet to be decided.

As with any campaign many decisions have yet to be finalized over

the next few years, much will depend on the monies raised and the resources available.

As mentioned above the first phase addresses the needs of the cemetery. There has been a small group, from the parish, meeting for the past several months to address the issues mentioned in phase one. My intent with this article is to let you know steps are being taken and a lot of background work has been accomplished which will allow us to move forward and make our cemetery more beautiful and viable for years to come. As you can imagine, with a project this large, there are a myriad of details regarding finances, proxies, contractors, and archdiocesan regulations that need to be followed. My hope is to have some renditions available in the next few months that will give you all an idea of what we are trying to accomplish. There will also be an opportunity for folks to share their thoughts about the project.

Please stay tuned, there are a lot of exciting things in the works that will help us make the places where we pray more sacred and beautiful, places where we will continue to encounter the presence of God.

A Note About Fasting and Abstaining:

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, those 18-59 are asked to fast, meaning a person is asked to eat one full meal and two smaller meals that together do not equal one meal.
On the Fridays of Lent those 14+ are asked to abstain from eating meat.
People are excused from both if they are pregnant, nursing, have a chronic illness, are physically or mentally ill or need to take medicines that require food.
*There is a special dispensation for eating meat on Friday, March 17th but the Archbishop requests you pick a different day if you choose to eat meat on that Friday.

LESSONS FROM STATIONS OF THE CROSS: A MODEL FOR OVERCOMING RACISM

Jesus is unjustly condemned to die because he is different. The social structure does not protect him. Being made to carry a heavy cross and struck repeatedly, Jesus falls down. Pressed into service is a passer-by, Simon of Cyrene, and Jesus is no longer totally alone in carrying his cross. Later Veronica, moved by compassion, pushed forward and offered Jesus her veil to wipe his face. At the risk of drawing attention to herself, seeing his suffering she chose to get involved.

Whether by choice or by force, when a person receives help from another person their crosses become easier to bear. When we see someone unlike ourselves suffering unjustly, how do we react? The human tendency to avoid eye contact, to walk quickly away and not get involved allows the injustice to continue.

These lessons remind us that we have a choice. We can keep our distance or we can embrace and advocate for someone who has been pushed down in society. We can stay in our own lanes or we can work to open doors for them, support their dignity, and lift our society to a higher place. EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Connection: Family life teaches us many things. It is often at home that we learn practical skills such as cooking, riding a bike, and making repairs. Talk about some of the things that the members of your family have learned to do at home. We also learn about caring at home. Talk about times when you have learned a lesson about sharing, forgiving, or loving through an experience that happened at home.

Talk about how love is the most important thing a family can share with one another. Explain that it is the same in God's family. Read aloud this Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 5:38–48. Talk about how Jesus tried to teach his disciples how to love others beyond those who are closest to them. Jesus tells them to love even their enemies. As members of God's family, we are called to do the same thing. Talk about some concrete ways you can "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you"

Remind your children that Jesus does not expect us to be perfect. Jesus knows that we are human and will not always do everything correctly. Explain that what Jesus wants us to do is to love others as if they were Jesus himself. If we reach out in love to others, we are doing exactly what Jesus did. That is what perfection looks like. End this time together by praying the Act of Love.


