

The man who was born blind was thrilled with his healing experience and he rejoiced in the gift but did not know the giver. In todays gospel we are invited to focus on the spiritual aspects of sight and light and hear of a common belief of the time, whose sin caused this mans disability? This healing is

controversial to the Pharisees for a few reasons, it happened on the Sabbath and they weren't sure that this man really was born blind so they had to question his parents. As a result, the man born blind is expelled from the synagogue. When Jesus hears of this, he seeks out the man born blind and reveals to him that he is the Son of God.

In all our gospel stories during Lent God is working through Jesus to transform us bringing healing for body and spirit. Many witness his works but not all come to faith as hoped they would. The

sacraments are foundational to sustain the faithful in union with the Trinity. The sacraments can help us come to a greater understanding about who Jesus is and what it means to be his disciple.

Here at Holy Angels we have started to offer the sacrament of The Anointing of the Sick once a month after the Saturday evening mass. It is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin and ailment through the ministry of the priest. There is a spiritual healing where the sick receive the Holy Spirits gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties of their illness in Jesus name. The sick are prayed over, anointed with holy oil, united with the Lords healing presence and forgiven for prior sins. Our next celebration of the sacrament will be on Saturday March 25 after the 4pm mass.

NEWS AND NOTES

VEL PHILLIPS: A CIVIL RIGHTS ACTIVIST

In our history textbooks many of us learned about the civil rights movement mostly through a southern lens. We learn about Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King Jr, the Little Rock Nine, and the March on Washington. But Milwaukee had many of its own activists fighting for equal rights and opportunities as well, many of whom helped not only to shape the rights for those in Milwaukee, but across the nation.

Vel Phillips was a civil rights leader and a legal pioneer in Milwaukee. She was the first African American woman to attend and graduate from the University of Wisconsin's Law School, the first woman and first African American elected as a member of the Milwaukee Common Council, Wisconsin's first African American judge, and Wisconsin's first African American to win a statewide election and become Secretary of State.

Throughout her life she was an activist for civil rights. She advocated for the enforcement of Brown v. Board of Education. She fought for the right to "live where you want to live." In 1962 she introduced a bill that outlawed housing discrimination to the Common Council. Although it was defeated she did not give up, eventually securing the passage of Milwaukee's first fair housing ordinance in 1968. Her foundation continues her legacy today, supporting programs that work for justice. Share your reaction at <u>RacialJustice@hawb.org</u>.

Milwaukee is one of the most racially segregated cities in the U.S. This is not accidental, but rather the product of decades of institutional policies and practices that have denied equal housing access to people of color. Holy Angels, All Saints, and Lumen Christi invite you to learn from local experts about the history of discriminatory practices in Milwaukee and surrounding areas and discuss what we can do to make a difference. EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Connection: When infants are baptized, parents, with the help of the godparents, assume responsibility for raising the child as a follower of Jesus. The process of maturation in the faith is much like the example found in the story of the man born blind. The man is cured of his blindness, a symbol of his sin. Each time he meets someone after the healing, the man comes to a deeper awareness of who Jesus is. In a similar way, we who are baptized continue to mature in faith as our relationship with and knowledge about Jesus grows.

Invite each member of your family to draw a timeline of his or her life. On the timelines, ask family members to identify significant moments in their lives, especially their life of faith. Invite each person to reflect upon who Jesus was to him or her at each significant moment. How has each person's relationship with Jesus changed or matured? Then read together today's Gospel, John 9:1-41. Note how the relationship between Jesus and the man born blind changes and grows throughout the Gospel. Pray together that your relationship with Jesus will continue to grow and develop, becoming ever deeper. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer.
