

News and Notes



Palm Sunday, so much to write about and reflect on that it can be intimidating and overwhelming. We read from Matthew's gospel this year and it features some notable features different from the other gospels. Matthew 21: 9 states, "Hosanna to the Son of David. Blessed is the one who comes in the

name of the Lord." Matthew focuses on the Christ element where Jesus preached the kingdom of God and the early church preached Jesus as the Christ. Jesus announced the coming of the kingdom as the breaking in of the saving power of God in his own presence, words and works.

Matthew also tells us the response of the crowd to Jesus entering the city was, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in

Galilee." Calling Jesus, a prophet informed everyone that final and decisive word to Gods people. Matthew has a way of addressing Jesus as such royalty but in a very humble way. This comes from suffering, something all of us are familiar with, how the rejection of one can cause suffering for all and our own self destruction.

When we read about Jesus entry into Jerusalem the people consider him a king and five days later they want him crucified. What inconsistencies in our own faith lives need attention? Who is this man called Jesus? A man who enters a city so humbly, a man who gives his own body and blood so we may receive him in the Eucharist, a man who died on a cross so that he could defeat sin and death forever. This is Jesus!


TUESDAY OF HOLY WEEK, APRIL 4—TENEBRAE

Tenebrae is the Tuesday of Holy Week, April 4th at 7pm. During Tenebrae you will hear scripture readings following the Passion, there will

be music, and as the evening goes on the lights in the church get lower and lower until it is dark. Each year after Tenebrae, people say they loved the service and they wish more people would attend. Now is your chance. It is not specifically a Catholic service so feel free to bring your friends and family from other denominations as well!



Reconciliation after the 5:30pm Mass on Wednesday, April 5th will be the last opportunity for Reconciliation at Holy Angels before Easter.



DID YOU KNOW: The Easter Triduum begins on Holy Thursday. It comprises of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. The Mass/Service between Holy Thursday and the Easter Vigil is one long, continuous Mass. There is no closing song on Holy Thursday, no opening or closing song on Good Friday and no opening song at the Easter Vigil. If you have never experienced all three services in one Holy Week we encourage you and your family to attend this year.

HOLY THURSDAY, APRIL 6

The **Mass of the Lord's Supper** begins at 7:00pm on Holy Thursday. After Mass there will be open **Adoration** from 8pm-12am in the Prayer Room off of the Church Hall. Drop in anytime to pray. Stay for as long or as little as you would like!



GOOD FRIDAY, APRIL 7

Adoration in the Prayer Room off of the Church Hall will reopen at 7am and will stay open until about 6:45pm. Drop in anytime and stay for as long or as little as you would like. Morning Prayer begins at 8:30am in the Church. The Good Friday Service begins at 7:00pm.

HOLY SATURDAY, APRIL 8

Morning Prayer begins at 8:30am in the Church. The **Easter Vigil** begins at 8:00pm.

Easter Masses are at 8am, 9:30am and 11am



RACIAL JUSTICE REFLECTION

Earlier this Lent our 9th-10th graders prayed with the CRS-Rice Bowl Stations of the Cross, recalling Jesus' solidarity in suffering with those on the margins in our world today. As we enter this Holy Week recalling Jesus' Passion, the CRS reflections are fitting for each of us. "When the governor asks the crowd, "Which of the two do you want me to release?" They answered, "Barabbas! ... Let [Jesus] be crucified!" (Matthew 27:21-22) As we imagine this scene, perhaps we see chaos, people pushing and pulling at each other, screaming and shouting.

There is manipulation and bribery afoot; a good man has been arrested and is about to be killed as a public spectacle, and the laws of the land stand in silence. Perhaps this scene seems far removed—something we may glimpse in the news, something that happens in faraway countries under foreign governments. Perhaps, too, it is something we know well, or have witnessed in our schools or cities. We are called to live in solidarity as one family, each of us made in the image and likeness of God. We are responsible for one another, for what happens to our neighbors next door and our neighbors in Milwaukee. Though we may not have experienced such personal upheaval, we are called to empathize with those who have. So then, do we stand silent in the crowd, or do we shout? And if we shout, what do we say?" EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CORNER

Sunday Connection: Palm, or Passion Sunday begins the most sacred week of the Church year—Holy Week. During these days, we prepare ourselves for Easter by prayerful reflection upon the events of Jesus' Passion and death. Display a crucifix in a prominent place this week, as reminder of the salvation Christ won for us. The crucifix can also be the focal point for family prayer during Holy Week.

Because of the length and complexity of the Passion narrative, young children have difficulty remaining attentive when it is proclaimed in its entirety. Families can choose to read a portion of this Sunday's Gospel each day of Holy Week, providing ample opportunity for children to ask questions and respond to the events described there. In this way, the entire week can become a "way of the cross." Each day during Holy Week, the family can gather in a prayerful space with a crucifix as the focal point. The Passion as found in Matthew's Gospel might be read as follows throughout the week:

Sunday: Matthew 21:1-11 (Gospel at the Procession with Palms) Monday: Matthew 26:14-25 Tuesday: Matthew 26:26-35 Wednesday: Matthew 26:36-56 Thursday: Matthew 26:57—27:14 Friday: Matthew 27:15-54

After reading from the Gospel each night, the family might reflect on the reading together. Conclude your prayer time together by

praying the Lord's Prayer and/or singing an appropriate hymn, such as "Were You There?" or "What Wondrous Love Is This."


