THE WISDOM OF BISHOP FULTON SHEEN

We are living in perilous times when the hearts and souls of men are sorely tired. Never before has the future been so utterly unpredictable; we are not so much in a period of transition with belief in progress to push us on, rather we seem to be entering the realm of the unknown, joylessly, disillusioned, and without hope. The whole world seems to be in a state of spiritual widowhood, possessed of the hollowing devastation of one who set out on life's course joyously in intimate comradeship with another, and then is the belief of that companion forever.

A POSSIBLE NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION

The Old Testament Book of Sirach gives us a somewhat straight forward advice: "Never repeat a conversation and you will lose nothing at all. With friend or foe do not report it, and unless it would be a sin for you, do not disclose it" (Sirach 19:7-8). We know that the words of Sirach are true and that talking about other people behind their backs is not only harmful to our own spiritual life but also to the person about whom we are speaking. Nevertheless, this command is still very hard to follow. Why is it that we like to talk about other people, often negatively? Perhaps it is a way of making ourselves look better, or a way of complaining, or even a way of appearing "in the know," that is, to appear to be someone who has privileged information. We should examine our conscience before we speak about other people. As Sirach recommends, unless it would be worse to remain silent. Sirach even pokes a little fun at us for finding this task difficult: "Be brave! It will not make you burst!" (Sir 19:10). Following StPaul, let us be ashamed of gossip but not of the Gospel (2Tim. 1:8). SO.....How often do you find yourself in conversations about people who are not present?

WHEN WE VISIT THE MANGER

When we visit the manger, whether under the Christmas tree or in our heart, let the Baby Jesus shine brightly giving sinful souls a brand-new start! It's because of this tiny newborn—The Son of God divine, that salvation now can be a reality for the Lord's so full of mercy and kind! When we visit the manger beneath our glitter-filled Christmas tree, recall what all God's Son has done to set sin-captive spirits light and free. As Christmas has arrived, the excitement escalates with surprises and boxes and bows, peek in your heart for a moment and see the true reason this holiday glows! So when we visit the manger where woolly sheep Mary and Joseph abide may we pause and be thankful to God our Father for eternal life and the wee Babe snuggled inside. *Linda Q. Grazulis*
