



Do You Love Me?

If you want to make someone feel uncomfortable, simply ask them the question, "Do you love me?" If the answer is "no," the person is not likely to say so; instead they will try to frame their answer with something like, "Of course I like you; you are a nice person." But even for someone who does love us, they may be embarrassed to answer directly. Or, the question might actually offend someone who loves us, as it seems to call their love for us into question. We can only imagine how Peter felt when Jesus asked him, "Do you love me?" Not long before, Peter had denied knowing Jesus three times. His feelings of guilt must have really made him uncomfortable, when Jesus asked him three times, "Do you love me?"

Today, Jesus asks each of us the same question: "Do you love me?" How do we answer? Most of us have the impulse to answer reactively, saying, "Of course I love you, Jesus." But do we really mean it? Or are we just responding in the way we think we're supposed to? If we say we love Jesus, He might ask us a second question: "Why do you love me?" To this we might answer, "Because you are my Savior, and you laid down your life for me." That's a nice answer. But Jesus might say, "So you love me because of what I did for you. But do you love *me*?"

None of us has ever encountered Jesus in the flesh, as He was upon the earth more than two thousand years ago. We wouldn't be able to pick Him out of a crowd, for we have never seen His human face. So, now we are in the same situation as Peter: his initial response to Jesus' question was, "Of course I love you." But when Jesus asked the second time, Peter had to search a little deeper inside himself. And so do we. Do we really love Jesus? What does it mean to say we love Him? Why, and how do we love Jesus? Is our love for Jesus actually a form of self love? Do we love Jesus only because He offers us eternal life? Do we love Him in hopes of getting earthly blessings from Him? Do we love Him only out of fear of going to hell? Do we really know Jesus? How can we love Him if we don't know Him?

Peter protested three times, "I don't know the man!" Peter was lying and telling the truth at the same time. Peter really didn't know Jesus. He knew his own version of Jesus, and of what he thought Jesus was to accomplish. But when Peter's own life was on the line, he distanced himself from Jesus. Despite his fear, Peter wanted to love the Lord, and to be His friend and faithful disciple. He showed this desire by jumping into the water and swimming to shore to be with Jesus. But now he was faced with the question, "Do I really love Jesus?" Do we? Who is Jesus? He is the embodiment of God, of truth, of love, of life, of all that is good. Jesus is our higher calling to perfection as God's children. Do we love and seek all these things with all our heart?

When asked the third time, "Do you love me," Peter became frustrated. He said, "Lord, you know all things. You know that I love you." Each time Peter declared his love, Jesus responded, "Feed my sheep." It is one thing to say to Jesus, "I love you," but our love is proven true by our actions. Jesus once told His disciples, "There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends." Then, Jesus would do exactly that for us upon the cross. The first time Jesus asks us if we love Him is simply to get our attention. The second time is to cause us to ask ourselves what loving Jesus means, and if we truly do love Him. The third time is to make us realize that we cannot lie to Jesus: He know whether we love Him or not. And, if our love is genuine, it will manifest in our love for others.

Our love for Jesus is a response to His love for us. Jesus doesn't just say to us, "I love you," He showed us the depths of His love by dying on the cross. By this, we know that He loves us, and His love is perfect. But our love is in the process of becoming perfect, and requires us to answer Jesus' question again and again throughout our life. So, how do we respond to Jesus when He asks us, "Do you love me?"

Playing the 50/50 Drawing

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING: Care of Creation

As part of our Outreach Ministry team meetings we are discussing the **Principles** of **Catholic Social Teaching**, and how we are promoting those teachings here at St. Barnabas. Recently we discussed **Care for God's Creation**.

One way to take care of God's creation is through recycling. In addition to newspaper, bottles, cans and plastic recycling our world is creating a lot of E-waste. New TVs, new computers, iPads, phones on and on. These items have little if any value when they are replaced and we often do not know how to dispose of them.

DID YOU KNOW? Since January 1, 2011, Indiana state law prohibits the disposal of electronics in trash bound for the landfill!

Several options are available:

• **Perry Township Tox-Drop:** Is on the 2nd Saturday of each month. They are located at 4225 S. Shelby St. 46227. You must be a resident of Marion County. You can dispose of hazardous household waste in addition to electronics. Check their website of a list of electronics that can be recycled.

• Johnson County electronic recycling: Franklin Recycling Center, 900 Arvin Rd.

Franklin, Indiana 46131. Use the second, or "back," drive and proceed to the entrance. Drop off times/ days: Tuesday through Friday, 8:00am to 4:30pm, 2nd and 4th Saturday

• **Recycle Force:** Recycle Force gives you an opportunity to not only recycle your electronic waste but it is a business that is focused on the re-entry of returning citizens from incarceration. Recycle Force is **committed to reducing crime through employment and job training, while improving the environment through electronics recycling.** Since 2006, Recycle Force has safely recycled more than 65 million pounds of electronic waste while providing job training to thousands of returning citizens.

Recycle Force is open Monday through Friday from 8:30am – 4pm, and Saturday from 9am – 1pm. They are located at 1255 Roosevelt Avenue, Indianapolis, Indiana 46202.

Pope Francis tells us that "Everything is connected. Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined to a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society."

At St. Barnabas we offer recycling opportunities for our parishioners. In the front parking lot there are 2 bins for paper recycling. That includes; newspapers, magazines, office/school paper, sales catalogs and mail. These bins **DO NOT take phone books or cardboard**.

Also in the front parking lot is the St. Vincent de Paul clothing bin. This bin accepts SOFT goods; clothing, shoes, linens, blankets etc. **NOTHING BREAKABLE**. These items are given to the families served by SVdP or may be sold at the Mission 27 shop to support SVdP programs.

In the back lot is a recycle bin for aluminum cans. They DO NOT TAKE GLASS OR PLASTIC.

Please take advantage of these opportunities to make use of items that you no longer want or need. Pope Benedict XVI tells us *"we must recognize our grave duty to hand the earth on to future generations in such a condition that they too can worthily inhabit it and continue to cultivate it."* Recycling is just one small way to protect our earth for future generations.


