


Parish Picture Directory Update

Parousia

Is civilization as we know it about to collapse? It is impossible to have a civilization when civility itself is in decline. How can we live together in peace if we cannot respect one another? A civilization means a people living together for mutual good, with one heart and mind. Our reading from Revelation gives us a vision of the perfect civilization of the Kingdom of Heaven. It is a secure and completely peaceful place, where all live as one in the love of God. The title of today's homily is "Parousia," a Greek wording meaning, "to dwell with." In theology it refers to God's dwelling among His people. As Revelation says of this Heavenly civilization, God is in its midst, and there is no need for the sun, for God is its light.

This Kingdom of God will only be fully realized when Christ comes again. Until that day, we are called to begin building this Kingdom of God's presence from the inside out. It begins in our hearts, and manifests outwardly to the world around us. And yet, there are powerful forces working against us. Many human ideologies promise a utopia without the need for God, constructed solely by human effort. Such ideologies reject not only God, but natural law. Next to God, the second most powerful thing is nature, for God has set all things in motion according to His will. To resist nature is to resist God. But human ideologies reject such things as universal truth, beauty, and goodness, claiming all these are relevant. Such ideologies will always fall short, for they are of limited human origin. And, sadly, as they run their course they end in evil and destruction.

We are living in an age when Christians can no longer be satisfied with mediocrity in living out our faith. It is time to stand up and make a decision: are we Christians, or not? Jesus says to us this day, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words." Today, on social media, there are professional "influencers." As Christians, it is Christ who should influence our choices in life. It is not politics, or ideologies, which should shape the Church, but the faith of the Church which should shape the world, and be expressed in politics. This is our mission from Jesus Himself.

Politicians are our elected representatives, meaning, they represent us, not the other way around. As Catholics, Christ calls us to create laws which do not restrict God-given freedoms, or diminish God-given rights, but rather laws which promote and defend human life and dignity. We are called to create an economy, which has as its purpose not the pursuit of excessive wealth, but the good use of prosperity which God intends for all His beloved children. In the Bible, prosperity is viewed as a blessing from God, and also as a stewardship: with blessing comes responsibility for the weak and less fortunate.

As Christ's people, we are also called to true religion, and not to self-righteousness. There are the religiously self-righteous, who believe they are holy because they follow the rules of the Church. Like those in our first reading, they demand that others, too, become as sanctimonious as themselves if they wish to be saved. They have little mercy in their hearts. Then there are the secularly self-righteous: those who need no God, or Church, to tell them what is right. They are their own moral authority, and they cannot be taught anything because their minds are closed, as well as their hearts. Wedded to their ideologies, they will not accept higher truth.

True religion is a living relationship with the living God. Like all living things, this relationship is constantly growing, and being shaped, and it in turn is life-giving. Not arrogant, yet having assurance, such souls are led by Jesus, and He is enthroned in the midst of their hearts. They live by the words of Jesus, "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. I am going away and I will come back to you." Truly, the Kingdom of Heaven is within them, and they abide in truth and peace, as they usher in God's Kingdom (His Parousia) here in this world. May we all take some time today to reflect on these questions: "Do I know the Lord of Life? Do my children know Him? Does my life reveal Jesus to the world? Am I being shaped by my faith? Is my faith shaping the world?"



Dear CYO & CYO Camp Family Member,

Once again, we want to thank you for your kind, generous, and loyal support of CYO over the years. Periodically, we send out a message to our large list of CYO family members, especially when there is a need at CYO/Camp that needs to be shared. This is one of those times.

In large part because of where our economy is at this time, we are very much struggling with finding enough counselors for CYO Camp this summer... especially with male counselors!! Many of our college-age counselors are finding jobs that in years past might not be available during the summer. However, with many small businesses begging for help so they might keep their doors open, some who would have been counselors in the past are going in a different direction this summer. At this time we have a list of almost 200 young campers who are now on a waiting list because we do not have enough counselors to accommodate them... and the majority of these are boys because of our male counselor shortage!!

Therefore, if you know of someone (male or female) who is a recent high school graduate, or is in the 18 - 24 age range who enjoys working with kids, please share this message with them. **Please also share that this is a paid position, offering up to 9 weeks of paid employment this summer!!** Having attended camp in the past might be helpful, as they would be familiar with how impactful the camp experience continues to be for so many, however, this is not required. College students who are pursuing a degree in Education typically are a logical fit, as are anyone who has worked with children in the past. However, if you know someone who is looking for a summer job that is fun, exciting, rewarding and has the added bonus of working with kids in a fun environment, this could be that perfect opportunity to be a part of an amazing summer experience!

If you know of a young person who you think might be interested in spending the summer working with kids, please pass this info on to them. **Again, this is a paid position, offering up to 9 weeks of paid employment this summer!** If interested, they can go to the CYO Camp website at


