

PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS



Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate *Gaudete Sunday*. The Introit (Entrance Antiphon) for the Mass is: *Gaudete in Domino semper; iterum dico, gaudete. Dominus enim prope est. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near."* Advent is more than half over. Let's lighten up a little! We wear rose-colored vestments. We light the rose-colored candle on the **Advent** Wreath.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Christmas is going to look and feel very different here and everywhere this year. The Christmas Mass schedule will also be different. We are adding one more Mass for Christmas Eve. I don't think we will see the huge crowds that we normally do. But I do think we will have increased attendance.

This year Masses on Christmas Eve will be 3:00, 5:00, 7:00, 9:00, and 11:00 p.m. (No Midnight). Mass on Christmas Day will be the usual 10:00 a.m. We will need to limit attendance at each Mass; we can accommodate only about 250 safely.

We have developed a way for people to register or sign-up ahead of time for each Mass. Many parishes have been doing this all along for weekend Masses. But, to be honest, I always resisted the idea. But I surely don't want to be like the innkeeper at Bethlehem that first Christmas: telling people at the door "there is no room in the inn."

To give you an idea of what we are facing: the normal attendance for the first Mass on Christmas Eve has been about 1,200. And that's in a church with a capacity of about 800. Other Christmas Masses average between 500 and 700. We don't know what else to do but to ask people to sign-up ahead of time. First come, first served.

The way to register for a Christmas Mass is to go to the parish website: www.st-luke.org. Go to the icon about "Christmas Mass Registrations." Click on the time and day of the Mass you want to attend. Unless things have changed, the 3:00 and 5:00 p.m. Masses on Christmas Eve are already full. Follow the directions and list the names of people you want to register for that particular Mass. You will receive a

ticket you can print out.

Never did I dream we would have to go through all this—then limit Mass attendance—at Christmas or any other time. But then, we all have never lived through anything like this pandemic. Beg God for His mercy to bring it to an end. Yes, Christmas will be different than any one of us has experienced so far!

No preparation during Advent for Christmas is complete without the reception of the Sacrament of Penance. Unlike previous years, we North Deanery parishes will not bring everyone together for Advent Penance Services in one spot. Note the expanded hours for confessions beginning next Sunday, December 20. These are listed in this bulletin and on the poster in the Narthex.

Next Saturday is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The people of Mexico have a great devotion to Our Lady under this title. Our Lady appeared to a poor native man named Juan Diego, now Saint Juan Diego. His feast day was last Wednesday, December 9. (And by the way, my mother's 100th birthday. She celebrated it in heaven!)

Mary asked that a shrine church be built on the spot where she appeared. And, as part of the proof needed to convince the skeptical bishop of the place, Our Lady somehow engraved her image on Juan Diego's tilma or poncho. Experts have never been able to figure out how the beautiful image of Mary is imprinted on the material.

Recently, with the help of microscopes and other technology, scientists have discovered even more fascinating things about the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. For instance, when we look at someone or something, the image of what we are looking at can be seen on the outside of the pupil of our eyes. On the miraculous tilma, one can see in the image of Mary's eye on the cloth the actual reflection of the other people in the room that day of the miracle: Juan Diego, the bishop, his assistant. It's impossible to explain.

Mary, under the title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, is the patroness of the pro-life movement. The image of Our Lady of

Guadalupe is the only image we have of Mary with child. She is pregnant in this image. She's wearing a dark belt or sash worn by the native Aztec women of the time to indicate they are with child. We have a beautiful statue of her in the back of the Magnificat (daily Mass) chapel near the votive candle stand.

Also, yesterday, Saturday, December 12, our seventy-some second graders made their First Confession. Keep them in prayer! Pray that the pandemic will not interfere with their First Holy Communion on time after Easter. (On a side pandemic note: our preschool and kindergarten are now open full days! Thank God!)

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: Rachel (Kris Kringle) Koch and her elves for coordinating our contributions to the Catholic Charities Christmas Store. This project allows families in need with a wide array of Christmas gifts all laid out like a department store. Families are able to maintain their dignity and pick out gifts for their loved ones because of our generosity.

After Masses last weekend—standing outside to greet folks on their way out from Mass—I was so touched by the number of our parishioners bringing their gifts to be loaded on the Saint Vincent de Paul truck. It was all new and high quality merchandise. Thanks also to all of you who participated!

Ask Monsignor a Question: *Are you sad when so many people are missing from Mass? Particularly so many families you would usually see?* (Via email)

Yes, I am. I miss so many people each weekend who seem to be unable to attend Mass. But I am also able to see many of them—and their children—in our gyms each weekend. I guess, now that I think about it, that even makes me sadder.

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!

Dignity in a Time of Need – We Need Your Help

The Saint Vincent de Paul (SVdP) Client Choice Food Pantry (3001 E. 30th St.) operates in a customer-choice model like a grocery store, allowing customers, after a brief interview and consultation, to actually shop for food. In a similar manner, the SVdP Distribution Center/ Mission 27 Thrift Stores provide furniture, appliances, kitchenware, bedding, and clothing to those whom SVdP members have visited and who have a demonstrated need for assistance. This model honors and uplifts the dignity and ethnic diversity of the people SVdP serves, promoting more efficient distribution of charitable resources and minimizing waste.

During the COVID-19 epidemic, SVdP has experienced a huge increase in demand from individuals and families for both of these services. Because of this, the demand for volunteers to help SVdP meet those needs has greatly increased as well. In the past, SVdP asked St. Luke (and other parishes) to provide volunteers only on specific weekends. Because of the increased demand, SVdP is instead encouraging individuals and families to volunteer on any weekday and weekend throughout the year.






