



We began the month of November with a positive variance of \$13,000 to budget for our Sunday offerings. However, our November collections were much lower than anticipated, coming in at \$49,000 under budget. Year to date collections are \$36,000 below budget.

While our ministries lowered our expenses or kept them flat, our school enrollment "mix" was unexpected. Because we give discounts to parishioners who have multiple children in the school, the "mix" of families with single children versus multiple children is very important. So while overall enrollment (the total number of children) roughly approximates the budget, we have more families with multiple children than anticipated, lowering our overall tuition revenues.

Because of these facts, we anticipate a deficit approaching \$150,000 this fiscal year, which ends June 30. Even with the financial challenges we face, we are very fortunate. We thank you for your support and we pray that you and your families remain safe and in good health as we enter this New Year.

PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend after Christmas is the beautiful **Feast of the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph**. Use it to reflect on the gift of family in your own life. And use it to reflect on the responsibilities of family life. Much of what we do here at Saint Luke is to bring families together.

The culture today does little if anything to support family life. In fact, it seems just the opposite. I worry about parents who do not take their responsibilities toward their children seriously. When they were married and when the child was baptized they promised before God “to bring them up according to the law of Christ and His Church.”

Yet they fail to even bring them to Mass regularly. They fail to provide the best in religious education for their children. And too often they train their children in ways that prioritize other things over Christ and His Church. They can’t make it to church, but they get to the gym for sports activities without fail.

Speaking of families, studies indicate that as the Faith of the father of a family goes—so goes the Faith of the children. As I previously mentioned, the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church was celebrated on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception earlier this month. In honor of that anniversary, Pope Francis declared this liturgical year to be dedicated to Saint Joseph through his apostolic letter *Patris Corde* (“With a Father’s Heart”).

In Pope Francis’ apostolic letter, he expounds upon the qualities of Saint Joseph’s fatherhood and how his fatherhood was an icon of God, the Father’s heart for us, His children. During this Year of Saint Joseph, may our hearts be led to reflect upon the Father through Saint Joseph! Here are some quotes from the Holy Father’s proclamation of this special year:

Saint Joseph is a beloved father. Saint Joseph placed himself at the service of his vocation as husband and father. “He turned his human vocation to domestic love into a superhuman oblation of himself, his heart and all his abilities, a loved placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home.”

Saint Joseph is a tender and loving father. Through Saint Joseph’s fatherhood, Jesus saw the tender love of God. Joseph taught Him how to walk and offered Him his loving embrace when he fell. Joseph teaches us to tenderly look upon our falls and weaknesses. “The evil one makes us see and condemn our frailty, whereas the Spirit brings it to light with tender love. Tenderness is the best way to touch the frailty within us.”

Saint Joseph is an obedient father. In every message from the Father, Saint Joseph did what was asked of him. “In every situation, Joseph declared his own ‘fiat’, like those of Mary at the Annunciation and Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane.”

Friday, New Year’s Day is also the Solemnity of the Motherhood of Mary, Mother of God. That’s a strange title for some to comprehend. How can a human being be the “Mother” of the Eternal God? Well, it’s not all that complicated. Mary is the Mother of Jesus. Jesus is God. So Mary is in a true sense “the Mother of God.” The early Church had debates over this title and the Council of Ephesus settled the question in 431 A.D.

We will have a 4:00 p.m. Mass on Thursday, New Year’s Eve. The morning Mass on New Year’s Day will be at 10:00. See you there to get the year started right! (There is no morning—8:15 a.m. Mass—on Thursday—New Year’s Eve Day.)

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: Mary Ann and Dave Noble—parents and advocates for their wonderful daughter, Mollie. They were recently given an annual 2020 Award from Noble of Indiana. Noble of Indiana has been expanding opportunities and enhancing the quality of life for people with disabilities since 1953. Mary Ann, Dave, and Mollie are wonderfully, faithful parishioners here at Saint Luke. Mary Ann headed our school cafeteria for years. She and Dave and Mollie are active volunteers!

Stewardship in Action!

Ask Monsignor a Question: *What are the moral implications of the vaccine for COVID-19? Were these vaccines manufactured ethically?* (Via email)

The writer is certainly referring to the use

of aborted baby fetal tissue to produce vaccines. It’s complicated, so I’ll refer to the experts here.

The information below comes from Dr. Joseph Meaney of The National Catholic Bioethics Center (NCBC). The NCBC provides ethical advice from the teachings of the Catholic Church and the Catholic moral and intellectual tradition and not medical or legal advice.

The two mRNA vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna did not use abortion derived cell lines in the development and production of their vaccines. They did use the HEK (Human Embryonic Kidney) 293 abortion derived cell line to do confirmatory testing of the efficacy of the vaccines.

This is less unethical than actually producing the vaccines in the abortion-derived cell lines, but is still an ethical problem. The AstraZeneca/Oxford University vaccine is produced using the HEK-293 cell line. That makes it fall in the worst category of unethical vaccines.

We are going to be producing guidance on our www.ncbcenter.org website to help people form their consciences and discern what choices to make. It will require a moral discernment to decide if you can in conscience volunteer to distribute some of these ethically tainted vaccines.

If a completely ethical vaccine becomes available with no connections to abortion derived cell lines, that will be the moral choice for Catholics. If all the vaccines available are somehow ethically tainted by abortion derived cell lines, then it becomes a difficult conscientious decision for Catholics if there is a proportionate reason to use them under protest or not.

If a person does decide to use one, it is preferable to use the least unethical vaccine possible, ones that only have a confirmatory testing link to abortion derived cell lines and one has a moral obligation to protest against the lack of ethics that forces such a difficult decision in conscience.

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!

First Sunday Sharing is Next Weekend



As we all know, poverty exists throughout the year. Our own Saint Luke Christian Social Action Commission (CSAC) and our Saint Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP) work diligently to help those less fortunate than ourselves. First Sunday Sharing has been one of the primary ways in which we as parishioners have helped those in need.

Parishioners receive a CSAC-SVDP envelope in their mailings from the parish. It provides the financial support for these two ministries.

Non-perishable food and men's clothing is collected on the first weekend of each month. The food is distributed at the SVdP "Boulevard Place" Food Pantry (4202 Boulevard Place) and the clothing is given to homeless men who are served each weekend by Beggars for the Poor. The Boulevard Place Food Pantry, a St. Vincent de Paul ministry which is supported by St. Luke and four other north side parishes, provides food assistance to over 900 families in need each month.






