### Give Until It Hurts

One of the characteristics of Everyday Stewardship is to be committed — to persevere daily in a way of life acknowledging that everything belongs to God.

I know, I know. Easier said than done.

Just ask Zebedee. It's quite an image we get from the Gospel, after all. "So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him."

There was Zebedee, about his business, mending nets with his two sons, who were undoubtedly his best workers — they had to have been more dedicated than the hired men, who worked for wages rather than for family. And in an instant off they go, following this strange man.

I don't know about you, but if my kids left me on a hot summer day to finish the lawn by myself, I wouldn't be too happy.

But Zebedee must have been someone quite special. Perhaps he realized that his sons didn't belong to him — not really. They belonged to God, and from the beginning of time, it had been appointed that they would be among the first disciples of Christ. He passed, he called, they followed, and Zebedee obliged. He simply went back to mending his nets, I imagine.

Zebedee already understood what St. Teresa of Calcutta would say millennia later: "Give until it hurts."

"You're wasting my time." "I've done so much for her; she owes me this." How often do we think things, and even people and relationships, belong to us? The truth is none of them do. We must be ready, as Zebedee was, to surrender them to God when He comes walking past.

## PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

Religious Vocations are vital to the life of the Church. I always pray for more vocations, but my prayers have sure been intensified these past six months without the help of an associate pastor here. I have no idea when we will get a new associate.

I am most grateful for the generous help of Msgr. Bill Stumpf who is our vicar general and in residence at Saint Luke. The same goes for the generous assistance of Father Jude Nwaigwa from Saint Vincent Hospital and Father Jim Bonke. But these priests also have other duties and responsibilities and, in the case of Msgr. Stumpf and Father Jude, full-time jobs!

Please consider joining us at our monthly **Holy Hour of Prayer for Vocations** the fourth Tuesday of each month immediately following the 5:30 p.m. Mass. We will have one this coming Tuesday, January 26. We have Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the rosary and other short prayers for religious vocations, and a period of silence in the Presence of Our Eucharistic Lord. Some pray with us!

Speaking of devotional practices, I am offering a pious devotion known as “The Seven Sundays of Saint Joseph” beginning next weekend. This is based on what have come to be known as the Seven Joys and the Seven Sorrows of Saint Joseph.

As I’ve mentioned here before, Pope Francis declared the beginning of a **Year of Saint Joseph** last December 8. The timing was perfect, coming on the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX naming Saint Joseph as patron and protector of the Catholic Church and on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, Saint Joseph’s spouse.

At first, I planned to have this devotion “live” in church on Sunday afternoons. But the more I thought and prayed, I decided to do it virtually. This will offer the opportunity to those who are compromised by the pandemic because of health or age concerns. It will also mean that one can access the podcast of the devotion anytime that is convenient for them.

So, beginning this Friday, January 29, the Friday edition of “Monsignor’s Musings”

will be one of the Seven Sundays of Saint Joseph Devotions. This short virtual version will contain a brief sermon or reflection on Saint Joseph followed by one decade of the Chaplet (or rosary) of Saint Joseph. Listen for Friday’s “Musings!”

The Fall 2020 **United Catholic Appeal** is winding down. I would be thrilled if Saint Luke Parish could make our goal! The last report shows we are at 94% of our goal—with only 8% of our parishioners participating. Imagine what we could do if more people responded with even just a small gift!

The UCA supports works of the Church that are better done collectively. Each parish cannot have its own soup kitchen, homeless shelter, seminary, or retirement home for priests. Come on, folks, I know how generous Saint Luke parishioners are! If you have not made your gift to the **United Catholic Appeal**, please do so this week. People are in need more than ever at this time. If you lost your commitment card and envelope, there are plenty in the Narthex.

**A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to:** our parishioners who are health-care professionals—particularly at this time of the pandemic. But I’d like to tip my *biretta* to a couple of our parishioner-physicians who were recently recognized as Top Doctors by *Indianapolis Monthly Magazine*.

Both are associated with Franciscan Health: Dr. Bill Berg (Interventional Cardiology) and Dr. Christopher Pesavento (Ophthalmology). There could be more, but I am only aware of these two at this time. Thanks, doctors, for using your God-given talents and skills to keep us healthy! **Stewardship in Action!**

**Ask Monsignor a Question:** *Are you aware that most boxes of masks are labeled: “These masks offer no protection from COVID-19, any other virus, or any contaminant.” (Via email)*

Yes, I am. I think it is true. But I also take this statement to mean that the mask does not protect me from COVID-19 or other virus. It can protect others with whom I come into contact. I may have the virus but no symptoms. So I could conceivably blow virus germs around the place without knowing it. The mask is meant to protect others—not the

wearer.

I hesitated to answer this question because I am aware that there is so much controversy and divided opinions about masks and multiple other things concerning the current pandemic. COVID-19 is evil and is a great help to the Devil who constantly seeks to spread division and falsehoods.

I’m well aware that many of you may have a different response to this mask question. Lots of strong opinions are out there from Doctor Oz to the Wizard of Oz. But I have chosen to listen to much respected health authorities including some who are parishioners here.

The idea that the mask protects others from being infected makes sense to me. It is one of the main reasons why surgeons and nurses wear masks in hospital operating rooms. Facemasks have long been thought to confer protection to the patient from wound infection and contamination from the operating surgeon and other members of the surgical staff.

At the same time, like most people, I sure don’t like wearing a mask. I’m tired of forgetting to put it on—or even take it off! Recently I was on an airplane. At the airport, we all wore masks and were required to social distance six-feet apart when in any line. We all wore masks on the flights. But the person next to me wasn’t even six-inches away, let alone six-feet! So, yes, much of this is confusing.

When this pandemic settles down, I am thinking about sponsoring a special event. Draft-card burning was a symbol of protest performed by thousands of young men in the United States and Australia in the 1960s and early 1970s. The first draft-card burners were American men taking part in the opposition to United States involvement in the Vietnam War.

So, I’m hoping everyone will join me in a Mask-Burning Ceremony at a later date. But likely not anytime real soon!

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!


