

Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



Our archdiocese will take up the collection for the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa, March 20-21. While the collection for Catholic Relief Services supports humanitarian and development assistance, the Solidarity Fund focuses on the urgent pastoral needs of the African Church. For example, in the country of Eritrea, in the Horn of Africa, government-imposed restrictions on travel prevent Eritreans under the age of 50 from traveling abroad. These restrictions impact access to training that priest and seminarians need to effectively administer their parishes.

Through a grant from the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa, the Eparchy of Keren in northern Eritrea organized workshops to train younger, recently ordained priests in pastoral planning and leadership skills that they can apply in their parish communities. Your participation in the collection makes possible practical efforts like this for the expanding Catholic community.

Grant applications by bishops' conferences in Africa to the fund are accepted for these pastoral areas:

- Pastoral and catechetical programs
- Seminarian training
- Continuing education of clergy
- Communications/mass media
- Catholic education/schools

The Church in Africa needs your help to ensure that all the faithful have access to resources to help them grow in the faith. Your generosity strengthens the Church to evangelize, teach and minister in the model of Jesus, "reconciling all things to himself" (Col 1:20). PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is **Laetare Sunday**. *Laetare* is Latin for "Rejoice." It is the first word of the Entrance Antiphon this weekend based on the words of the Prophet Isaiah. The priest wears a rose-colored vestment rather than purple. We rejoice because Lent is now more than half over; Easter is drawing near. We are allowed to have a few flowers around the altar.

Now that we enter the all-important second half of Lent, it's time to redouble our efforts at the three legs on which Lent stands: almsgiving, penance, and prayer. Opportunities for additional prayer are listed here in the bulletin each week. Weekday Mass is always at the top of the list.

No Lenten preparation for Easter is complete without receiving the Sacrament of Penance. Our confession times are also listed in the bulletin. Because of the pandemic, there will be no North Deanery-wide Penance Service this Lent.

One avenue for almsgiving is always the second collection each weekend in Lent. This weekend our second collection is for Catholic Relief Services. It's sort of a "Catholic Red Cross" for persons in dire need outside the U.S. I know that as always you will be generous.

Don't forget our annual "40 Cans for Lent" sponsored by our Knights of Columbus. Bring your non-perishable food items for the food pantry and place them in the corridor next to the parish office. Of course, the needs are much greater this year than ever thanks to this pandemic.

In terms of penance, I listed the minimums last week in my bulletin letter: the days of abstinence and fast as requested by the Church. I also wonder if the penance we are doing as a result of the COVID-19 Pandemic might just be enough in addition to those!

These are not voluntary penances; they are being placed upon us. It's a pain to have to wear masks, practice social distancing, forgo family or special gatherings, and so forth. But perhaps the greater penance will be to endure them without complaining. It does little good anyway. In addition, the current political and cultural climate is another real penance.

I think all of us are getting tired of the so-called "politically correct" rhetoric nonsense floating around these days. Of course, prejudice and racism are wrong and downright sinful. Yet now we find ourselves in an atmosphere where so many people are determined to be offended. All this does is further divide people.

Equally as tiring is the selective application of ways to supposedly address prejudice. And, of course, this also includes the way most media report it.

For example, the men's basketball coach at Jesuit Creighton University, Greg McDermott was suspended last weekend for saying this to his team: "Guys we got to stick together. We need both feet in. I need everybody to stay on the plantation. I can't have anybody leave the plantation." Well, okay. He apologized for his allegedly poor choice of words. By the way, even without McDermott, they beat Butler by twenty points. I went to Butler, so I'm not thrilled about this part.

Indiana Representative John Jacob, a Republican, was elected last November. Yet on his Facebook page he had posted statements saying that the Islamic Faith cannot coexist in the U.S. That Muslims are traitors who should be deported. And that the Catholic Church is a cult and of Satan, its parishioners should repent and leave the Church, and that the pope is an anti-Christ.

Before and after he was elected, Jacob did not apologize. But he did say that his posts had a fuller context. I'm not real sure what context would make them acceptable. But he was not suspended from anything. And he was elected. What a world!

This **Friday, March 19**, is the Feast of the Great Saint Joseph. Many folks will make a special consecration to Saint Joseph on this day following the procedure outlined by Father Donald Calloway, M.C., in his book by the same name.

We will also be able to do this on the other Feast of Saint Joseph (the Worker) on May 1. I'll write more about this next week. Preparation for that day will begin on Tuesday of Holy Week, March 30. If you are interested, try to obtain a copy of Father Calloway's book at the Celtic

Cross at 86th and Ditch or online.

Recall that this is the **Year of Saint Joseph** as proclaimed by Pope Francis. It began on December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, and will conclude on December 8, 2021. Good Saint Joseph is the Protector of the Universal Church just as he was the guardian and protector of the Holy Family of Nazareth.

By the way, we are dispensed from the law of abstinence on March 19. We can eat meat next Friday! It's a long standing tradition in the Church that we cannot do penance and celebrate rejoicing at the same time.

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: Saint Luke Catholic School graduate Jake Mitchell ('16). Jake was one of two Indiana champion swimmers who helped Michigan overtake Indiana for the team title in Men's Big Ten Swimming last Saturday night.

Jake is also a former altar server here. All through his high school career and now into his college career at Michigan he is using his God-given talents. And, by the way, he's a good kid. **Stewardship in Action!**

Ask Monsignor a Question: *What is the structure going up adjacent to the West side of the bell tower?* (Via email)

It is a much needed addition to the sacristy. I really suspect that our sacristy—where we prepare for Mass—is one of the smallest in the archdiocese. We are expanding thanks to our recent Providence 2021 Capital Campaign.

This addition will be called the **Vestry**. We will store the liturgical vestments for the priests there and it will be a place where we can vest for Mass and pull our thoughts together without being so crowded. I should mention that the entire project is being funded by a single gift to our recent capital campaign. **Stewardship in Action!** For us, it's a dream come true!

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!

However, there is a risk that the boxes would sit outside the pantry if no one happens to be there at delivery time. The best times for deliveries when someone is always around: Tuesday mornings, all day Wednesdays, Thursday afternoons, Friday mornings and Saturday mornings.

If you send food directly to Boulevard Place, please mark that it is from a St. Luke donor — that will help us determine if we meet our goal of 10,000 pounds.

Awake, O Sleeper!


