PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the **Solemnity** (Major Feast) of the **Ascension**. For many people this is confusing. We were always used to “Ascension Thursday,” precisely 40-days after Easter Sunday, as a holyday of obligation. In some countries, including our own, most bishops have decided that for various reasons the celebration of the **Ascension** will be on the seventh Sunday of Easter.

There are several reasons. One is the critical shortage of priests in some areas. Another is that whether we like it or not, many Catholics either could not or did not make it to Mass on **Ascension Thursday**. Recall that holydays of obligation vary from country to country. This has always been the case.

No one has moved “**Ascension Thursday**” to a Sunday. One cannot move a Thursday to a Sunday, not even a bishop or a pope! It’s kind of like when a person’s silver or golden wedding anniversary falls on a Thursday. They would probably have the celebration on a weekend so that more people could come to celebrate with them. But it does not change the fact that their anniversary is actually on a Thursday. The same is true for Ascension Thursday.

Someone quipped that the bishops changed the celebration from a Thursday to a Sunday because—on the airlines—it is cheaper if you stay over on a Saturday night. No, I don’t think that is it! This can be a bit confusing. After His resurrection from the dead, after a sacred period of time, Jesus rose beyond the sight of his apostles and ascended to the right hand of the Father in heaven (c.f. Luke 24: 50-53). That’s the point.

Next Sunday is **Pentecost Sunday**, May 23. It’s fifty days after Easter and the official end of the Easter Season and sort of the Birthday of the Church. On that day the frightened apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit. Tongues of fire appeared above their heads as a sign of the Holy Spirit’s presence. No longer afraid, they said “What the heck,” and hit the streets running to tell the good news of Jesus Christ. If you think about it, wear red to church next weekend, May 22-23. We will celebrate Pentecost!

Next comes the **Solemnity of the Most Blessed Trinity** on Sunday, May 30. The following Sunday will be our celebration of the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord, *Corpus Christi*** in Latin.

Corpus Christi is another Solemnity where the celebration is transferred to the following weekend for basically the same reasons I listed above. Traditionally it is the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. Recall that Our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper which was on a Thursday evening. Although it has never been a holyday of obligation in this country.

However, this year we are going to celebrate it at Saint Luke on the traditional day, Thursday, June 3, as well as the following weekend. We will have our customary **Corpus Christi** Procession at the end of the 5:30 p.m. Mass. Weather permitting, this will be outdoors and make brief stops at three altars placed around our parish campus.

This year we are partnering with an organization called Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ) for Unity and Peace. Recall that the Church has always taught that we are the Body of Christ. To find out more about this group, check their website: www.corpuschristiforunityandpeace.org.

On Monday after Pentecost, May 24, we will celebrate the new Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church. Pope Francis only instituted this day in honor of Our Lady in 2018 so this will be only the third year the Church has celebrated it. Mary is the Mother of Our Lord and He gave her to us as our mother through Saint John the Apostle as He was dying on the cross. “Mary, Mother of the Church” is sort of a new title given to us in the document on the nature of the Church from the Second Vatican Council.

Our 8th graders will lead us in our annual May Crowning this Wednesday, May 19, at 10:00 a.m. We will livestream this on our website so everyone can help us honor Our Lady. Remember that during the month of May we pray the rosary every evening at the outdoor Shrine of Our Lady near the preschool and playground. We begin after 5:30 p.m. Mass—about 6:10 p.m.

Monday, May 31, will be the final Marian Feast Day of the month: the Feast of the Visitation. It is also Memorial Day. It sort of fits: We honor those generous men and women who gave their lives in service to our country on Memorial Day. And we recall Mary who offered generous service to her cousin, Saint Elizabeth.

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: Saint Luke parishioners who generously give their time and talent to serve on the Bishop Brute College Seminary Advisory Board. They are Tom Hirschauer and Kevin O’Brien (vice-president).

Bishop Brute Seminary is vitally important to developing seminarians to serve in this archdiocese and other places as priests. Tom and Kevin are just two more examples of active parishioners who go above and beyond our parish boundaries to serve the Church and our local community. **Stewardship in Action!**

Well, they are not really “new offices.” The renovation and construction for the school offices has begun. So, for now until the end of the school year, we found it necessary to temporarily relocate our school offices: the receptionist, administrative assistants, assistant principal, and principal. A couple of these now occupy this space until the end of the summer.

While I’m at it: When we posted the architect’s renderings of the new space as a result of our **Providence 2021** Building Campaign one of them featured the new school entrance and lobby. Some people mistakenly thought it was the narthex. No. The narthex will remain basically the same. This rendering is the new school entrance and lobby now being constructed on the East side of the building.

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!
