

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

In most years, our Archdiocese eagerly anticipates the ordination of new priests in the late spring. This year, for the second consecutive year, we have no priestly ordinations scheduled in our Archdiocese. Next spring, we do expect to ordain two new priests, and future ordination classes look strong. While we miss the joy of priestly ordinations this year, we look forward with hope to the future and support those who are actively discerning a priestly vocation.

The weekend of May 29 and 30, we will have our annual collection in support of our seminarians currently studying for future ministry in the Church. This collection helps cover the expenses involved in the education and formation of our future priests. At this point in time, we are blessed with 21 men studying for the priesthood: ten at Bishop Simon Brute College Seminary and eleven at Saint Meinrad School of Theology. We hope to add 8 to 10 men to this number for next year. The average cost per student for educational expenses is \$40,000 per year. The United Catholic Appeal and proceeds from endowments also support formation for our seminarians, but those funds do not fulfill the entire need. All donations to this special annual collection will go directly toward the payment of these expenses.

In the name of all who minister in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis, I ask you to be generous in supporting the educational needs of our future priests. Most important, I encourage you to pray for priests and seminarians and for a generous increase in vocations to priesthood and consecrated life. Thank you for your support.

PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the official conclusion of the Easter Season. Fifty days following Our Lord's Resurrection is **Pentecost Sunday**. It's 50 days after Easter and the official end of the Easter Season. On that day the frightened apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit. The wind shook the building. Tongues of fire appeared above their heads as a sign of the Holy Spirit's presence.

In a sense, fear has become the order of the day in our world this past year. We have the fear of contracting or spreading COVID-19. We have fear of the violence that has plagued our cities and the world—especially now in Israel and Palestine.

Our culture has taught us to fear telling the Truth or fear in expressing our true opinions. Given all that's happening around us, we live in fear of just what might be next! That's where we find Our Lord's disciples this weekend—in fear—hiding out in the upper room for fear of what's next.

Yet, we take consolation in Our Lord's words, "*Peace be with you.*" In the Gospel for Monday of this past week Our Lord said to his disciples: "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." (John 16:33)

The thing that got Jesus in trouble was basically that He was unafraid to proclaim the Truth. The same goes for us. Want to make somebody angry? Tell them the Truth! And "the world" pulled out all the stops. They did to Our Lord the worst they could do—kill Him—death!

But their worst backfired on them. He sure did conquer the world! He conquered sin and death. He rose triumphant from the dead. Then he ascended to the right hand of God the Father. And ten days later He sent the Holy Spirit to His apostles. The Church was born. And there has been no stopping it ever since.

Yes, the pandemic has played havoc with our lives. Yes, the world is a mess. But Christ has conquered the world. Be not afraid! Christ brings us a peace the world cannot give. Let this Pentecost be a renewal of our Faith, strength, and love of

the Holy Spirit among us.

And talk about renewal and reinvigorating our community and Faith lives! The **Reignite** event on May 13 was **fantastic!** We had a huge (but safe) crowd, excellent weather, delicious food and drink and a great inspirational message from our speakers. Archbishop Thompson joined us. I can think of nothing I've enjoyed more since being here at Saint Luke.

I cannot thank the organizers enough: Bob Roberts and Teresa Schutzman. Oh, they would be the first to tell you that it was many hands working together. And that is true. But it takes inspiration and leadership to pull it off. I think Teresa came up the idea, got Bob on board, and it took off! **Stewardship in Action!**

This weekend is also special for me. Saturday, May 22, was the 39th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood! Next year with be my 40th! What wonderful memories I have of that day: May 22, 1982. Ordination in the morning at the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul downtown. Later that evening my First Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving at my beloved Holy Name of Jesus Parish in Beech Grove.

I was surrounded by my parents, family, and friends. It was a whirlwind of a day, but one I shall never forget. The day I offered my First Mass was also **Corpus Christi**, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. How appropriate for a priest's First Mass!

Corpus Christi is traditionally the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. Recall that Our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper which was on a Thursday evening. Although it has never been a holyday of obligation in this country. And in recent years, like Ascension Thursday, the observance has been transferred to the following weekend.

However, this year we are going to celebrate it here on the traditional day, Thursday, June 3, as well as the following weekend. We will have our customary **Corpus Christi** Procession at the end of the Thursday 5:30 p.m. Mass. Weather permitting, this will be outdoors and make stops at three altars placed around our campus.

Tomorrow (Monday, May 24) we will celebrate the new Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church, at both Masses. Remember that during the month of May we pray the rosary every evening at the outdoor Shrine of Our Lady near the preschool and playground. We begin after 5:30 p.m. Mass—about 6:10 p.m.

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: Saint Luke's own Second Lieutenant Benjamin James Snyder! Ben graduates from the United States Military Academy at West Point this weekend—on May 22—my ordination anniversary!

Like his parents, parishioners Jim and Mary Ann Snyder, we are so proud of Ben. So is his sister, Lizzie. Ben served in the Army of the Lord as a faithful altar server here through high school. Now he proudly serves our country in the U.S. Army. Pray for him and all of his fellow West Point graduates this weekend. **Stewardship in Action!**

Ask Monsignor a Question: *What happened at Saint Luke last Friday afternoon? Why the fire trucks? (Via email)*

When the tent was put up for the *Reignite* event on Thursday, May 13, the stakes for the tent poles punctured the gas line in a couple spots. When the stakes were removed on Friday afternoon, the holes opened, and gas escaped. None of the gas leaked inside the building.

As a precaution we evacuated the school. Thank heavens it was a sunny warm day. All 600 or so from school and preschool hung out on the South lawn along 75th Street. They were calm and well-behaved. I guess monthly fire drills pay off.

The gas company took care of things immediately. We called the fire department just to be sure everything was safe. The "all-clear" was sounded in less than an hour and everything turned out okay. But it was an exciting Friday afternoon to be sure!

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!



Sunday Offerings in April rebounded and exceeded our budget by \$19,000. This positive performance helped lower our annual collection budget deficit to \$65,000. Because of this and another \$20,000 of savings in our operations budget, we now project an overall deficit of \$140,000 for this fiscal year, which ends June 30.

We all know that sort of queasy feeling we get in the pit of our stomachs when it becomes clear what we're supposed to do, in any situation. It's that feeling of: Oh, no. Not me. Not now. I can't.


We've all got our list of reasons why not, don't we? We do it for everything, from big life problems to small everyday choices. I'm not going to invite my neighbor to church because I don't want to come across as pushy. I'm not going to make amends with my cousin because she'll just walk all over me again. I'm not going to say a Rosary tonight because I'm tired and it'll just stress me out.

However, even if we all put our lists of "reasons why we can't" together, I don't think any of us have reasons quite as valid as the apostles. Their job was to convert the nations — and here they are, a bunch of fishermen who haven't been out of Judea, who speak only their own languages. Were they supposed to preach the Gospel via a particularly compelling game of charades?
