## Providence 2021 Building Project Update



### Steel on the East, Insulation to the South

On Thursday, May 20, we had three cranes on site helping set the steel which will form the ceiling for the lower level of the East Side Addition, as well as the base for the first floor. It was exciting seeing that level of activity on our construction site!

A few days earlier, we began insulating the walls and ceiling of our new vestry (left). During the pandemic, supply chains are making it difficult to procure products in a timely fashion. That was the case with insulation for the vestry. The contractor had to select an alternate product to accomplish the same purpose.

Unfortunately, the alternate insulation had a pungent odor when installed, even with our attempts to provide additional ventilation. It was just the insulation ... thanks to everyone who was flexible enough to deal with this unforeseen outcome!

At the preschool, framing and walls have been installed for the facility expansion. And inside the school, the administration area has been completely demo-ed and work begins on the new office layout.



- **June 16** For Greater Glory is a true story about the Cristero War in Mexico at the beginning of the 20th Century. A retired military man leads the resistance in this historical account of faithfulness to the point of surrendering one's life for the freedom to worship God.
- **June 23** Paul, Apostle of Christ is an inspiring account about St. Paul, St. Luke and the early Christians in Nero's Rome in 64 A.D. Despite the military strength of pagan Rome, the movie illustrates how authentic faith can effectively challenge any secular empire that opposes Christ.
- **June 30** Fatima is the 2020 movie about the multiple visitations of Our Lady of the Rosary to three young Portuguese children in 1917. ## PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

**Praise the Holy Trinity—Undivided Unity—Holy God, Mighty God, God Immortal be adored!** Those are the words to the refrain of a familiar hymn. The official Easter Season of 50 days concluded with the **Solemnity of Pentecost** last Sunday. After **Pentecost** there are two very meaningful Feasts of Our Lord that follow. Today is one, the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity**: three Persons yet only one God.

Next weekend we will observe the Solemnity of the **Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**. Its popular name is the **Feast of Corpus Christi** (Latin for “the Body of Christ.”) It’s our firm belief that Christ is truly present—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist at Mass and in the reserved Blessed Sacrament in the Perpetual Adoration Chapel or in the tabernacle.

The “old” or traditional date for *Corpus Christi* is the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. Recall that Our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday at the Last Supper. This year that day is this Thursday, June 3. For a couple reasons, we will have our special observance that day.

It’s a tradition to have an outdoor procession with the Blessed Sacrament. We will have a short procession immediately following the 5:30 p.m. Mass Thursday. I hope you will attend. We carry the Blessed Sacrament in Solemn Procession stopping at an outdoor altar (weather permitting) to manifest to everyone our belief in Christ’s Real Presence.

**Corpus Christi** is also the day on which we plan to resume Perpetual Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our Adoration Chapel. It’s been closed—or at least very limited—since March 17, 2020 because of the pandemic.

Next weekend, Msgr. Stumpf will preach on our belief in the Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament and about Adoration. We will solicit new “adorers” to commit to one hour per week so that every hour—day and night—seven days a week is covered.

Married couples often come together. Parents love the peaceful quiet! Get a front spot at car pool then come to the chapel.

“Night owls” or people who get off work at odd times cover middle of the night and early mornings.

**Happy Memorial Day Weekend!** In Indianapolis, it’s always overshadowed a bit because of the Indianapolis 500 Mile Race, the greatest spectacle in racing. I’m glad the race is running on time with in-person fans this year—albeit a limited crowd because of the pandemic precautions.

We old timers also call Monday **Decoration Day**. Originally, **Memorial Day** was the patriotic day in our country to honor Americans who gave their lives for their cause in the Civil War. Over time, it has expanded to honor all those Americans who died in the various wars. On **Memorial Day** or **Decoration Day**, people place flowers on the graves of military personnel. Many organizations take part in military parades and special programs.

In any case, as Catholics the natural thing and the best thing that we do on **Decoration Day** is to pray for the deceased military personnel who have served our country. Try to attend Mass on Monday, **Memorial Day**. There will be one Mass here in church at 10:00 a.m. (Note that this is a new Mass time for civil holidays.)

The original owners of the Speedway were the Hulman-George Family. Because they were Catholic, the Catholic Archbishop of Indianapolis generally gives the invocation just before the start of the 500 Mile Race. I’m delighted that this tradition will continue this year under the new ownership of the track by Roger Penske.

End of school activities will occupy much of next week. We will have the Graduation Mass for our 8th graders at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 1. We will have a final all-school Mass on Friday, June 4, at 11:30 a.m. This will be the first “all-school” Mass of the year.

We can safely accommodate the school children at Mass on Friday because our graduated 8th graders will not be with us. I am also going to ask others who come to Mass to take one of the seats we will provide in the Narthex. I realize this is an inconvenience, but I think it is worth it for the sake of getting our school community together for Mass safely to end the academic year.

So, on Tuesday at 5:30 p.m. and Friday at 11:30 a.m. Mass will be longer and more crowded than usual. Please be aware of these one-time only changes. Thanks in advance for your understanding.

**SMRE** (Sunday Morning Religious Education) has also concluded for this academic year as well. Thanks to all of our faithful catechists. We also need some additional K-8 catechists for next year. For details, contact our Director of Religious Education, Sister Diane, at dcarollo@stluke.org.

And, yes, I want to give our school credit as well. I think we are the best partner parents can have! **Stewardship in Action!**

## CHRISTIAN SOCIAL ACTION

### First Sunday Sharing is Next Weekend

As we all know, poverty exists throughout the year. Our own Saint Luke Christian Social Action Commission (CSAC) and our Saint Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP) work diligently to help those less fortunate than ourselves. First Sunday Sharing has been one of the primary ways in which we as parishioners have helped those in need.

Parishioners receive a CSAC-SVDP envelope in their mailings from the parish. It provides the financial support for these two ministries.

Non-perishable food and men's clothing is collected on the first weekend of each month. The food is distributed at the SVdP "Boulevard Place" Food Pantry (4202 Boulevard Place) and the clothing is given to homeless men who are served each weekend by Beggars for the Poor. The Boulevard Place Food Pantry, a St. Vincent de Paul ministry which is supported by St. Luke and four other north side parishes, provides food assistance to over 900 families in need each month.

Next weekend, June 5/6, is our monthly First Sunday Sharing collection. Thank you for your generous support!
