The Steward's Work Is Never Done

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.

But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.

As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?

PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

As you read this, I'm on vacation with Msgr. Stumpf in Maine! Pray for us and know that I am praying for you each day.

By now, I hope you have all met our new resident priest. He is Father George Joseph Nangachiveettil. ("Father George" will do!) He is originally from the State of Kerala in India. His last full-time assignment was pastor at Saint Thomas the Apostle Parish in Fortville. He is officially retired, but he is very active. We look forward to his presence and his help here at Saint Luke. Welcome, Father George!

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: Saint Luke Catholic School graduate Jake Mitchell! He is off to Tokyo later this week to participate in swimming competition at the 2021 Olympics!

I've mentioned here before his accomplishments as a swimmer in high school and now going into his sophomore year at Michigan. I promised Jake we would pray for his safety and success as he heads to Tokyo. He's a great kid and served as a great altar server. **Stewardship in Action!**

Ask Monsignor a Question: *We are new to the parish. What is the prayer we say after the daily Masses while standing in front of the Blessed Mother statue? Why do we do it? Oh, we like it but just are not familiar with it. Can you fill us in?* (Via email)

Through the week, after the 11:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Masses we pray the Prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel. I think the prayer you are asking about is *The Angelus*.

This prayer is designed to commemorate the mystery of the Incarnation and pay homage to Mary's role in salvation history. Around the world, three times every day, the faithful stop whatever they are doing and with the words "*The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary*" begin this simple yet beautiful prayer.

A review of Church history shows that this devotion did not appear suddenly, but developed over several centuries. Most Church historians agree that the *Angelus* can be traced back to 11th-century Italy, where monks said three Hail Mary's during night prayers, at the last

bell of the day.

Over time, pastors encouraged Catholics to end each day in a similar fashion by saying three Hail Mary's. In the villages, as in the monasteries, a bell was rung at the close of the day reminding the laity of this special prayer time. The practice spread quickly.

Toward the end of the 11th century, the Normans invaded and occupied England. In order to ensure control of the populace, the Normans rang a curfew bell at the end of each day reminding the locals to extinguish all fires, get off the streets, and retire to their homes. (And not even because of COVID!)

While certainly not intended to encourage prayer, this bell became associated nevertheless with evening prayer time, which included saying the Hail Mary. Once the curfew requirement ended, a bell continued to be rung at the close of each day.

Meanwhile, around 1318 in Italy, Catholics began saying the Hail Mary upon rising in the morning. Likely this habit again came from the monks, who included the Hail Mary in the prayers they said before their workday began. The morning devotion spread. In England in 1399 Archbishop Thomas Arundel ordered church bells be rung at sunrise throughout the country.

In 1456, Pope Calixtus III directed the ringing of church bells every day at noon and that Catholics pray three Hail Mary's. The pope solicited the faithful to use the noonday prayers to pray for peace in the face of the 15th-century invasion of Europe by the Turks.

1481, Pope Sixtus IV was petitioned by Queen Elizabeth of England to grant indulgences for those who said at least one Hail Mary at 6:00 a.m., noon and 6:00 p.m. There is evidence that a bell was rung at those times.

The 11:30 a.m. Mass ends about noon; the 5:30 p.m. Mass ends about 6:00 p.m. That's why we ring the *Angelus* bell at those times. And it's why we don't ring it after the 8:15 a.m. Mass. But in deference to our sleeping neighbors we do ring it at 8:00 a.m. each day rather than 6:00 a.m.!

By the end of the 16th century, the *Angelus* had become the prayer that we know today: three Hail Mary's, with short verses in between, ending with a prayer. This devotion reminds us of the Angel Gabriel's annunciation to Mary, Mary's fiat, the Incarnation and Our Lord's passion and resurrection. It is repeated as an invitation, calling us to prayer and meditation.

It is said that over the centuries workers in the fields halted their labors and prayed when they heard the *Angelus* bell. This practice is depicted by Jean-François Millet's famous 1857 painting that shows two workers in a potato field stopping to say the *Angelus*. A few years ago someone gave me a lovely copy of this painting. It's hanging in the corridor along the school cafeteria.

Like a heavenly messenger, the *Angelus* calls us to interrupt our daily routines and turn to thoughts of God, of the Blessed Mother, and of eternity. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI taught that, "*The Angel's proclamation was addressed to her; she accepted it, and when she responded from the depths of her heart ... at that moment the eternal Word began to exist as a human being in time. From generation to generation the wonder evoked by this ineffable mystery never ceases.*"

And on top of probably more than you wanted to know: a significant part of this traditional devotion is not only the ringing of a bell to announce the time of prayer but the manner in which the bell is rung. The ringing consists of three strokes of the bell, each followed by a pause, and then nine strokes. Old monastic records, going back to the fifteenth century, show that the bell-ringer was directed, 'to toll the Hail Mary-bell nine strokes at three times.

But I also want to tell you how and why we started this tradition at Saint Luke. But I'm out of space. Next week!

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!
