



## A Letter from Msgr. Schaedel

### PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Letter from Msgr. Schaedel for bulletin of September 5, 2021

Dear Parishioners.

This weekend is **Labor Day** Weekend. **Labor Day** has been celebrated on the first Monday in September in the United States since the 1880s. The form that the observance and celebration of Labor Day should take were outlined in the first proposal of the holiday — a street parade to exhibit to the public "the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations" of the community.

As I have mentioned before, I think it is an excellent idea to attend Mass on civil holidays. Most of our civil holidays celebrate something good about our country and the blessings of God upon the United States.

On **Monday September 6, Labor Day**, we thank God for the gift of labor, the ability to work and contribute to the welfare of the human family, and the ability to honor God by our labor. Per our usual civil holiday schedule, we will have one Mass at 10:00 a.m. No evening Mass or confessions on Labor Day.

There are so many people who cannot work for one reason or another. They would give almost anything to be busy, to be employed, or to feel needed by others. Most of them may be in bad health. Others just happen to be in the wrong place at the wrong time. Let's thank God for the gift of being able to work and to be busy!

Remember to pray for the unemployed. This is the Year of Saint Joseph. Ask Saint Joseph to pray with us and for us. He is the patron of workers. Here is a **Prayer for the Unemployed.** 

Dear Saint Joseph, you were once faced with the responsibility of providing the necessities of life for Jesus and Mary. Look down with fatherly compassion upon me in my present inability to support my family and myself. Please help me to find gainful employment very soon, so that this heavy burden of concern will be lifted from my heart and that I am soon able to provide for those whom God has entrusted to my care. Help us to guard against bitterness and discouragement, so that we may emerge from this trial spiritually enriched and with even greater blessings from God. Amen.

I think it's sort of interesting that we've

been asking one another for the past couple weeks or so, "How was your summer?" Summer is not over! Labor Day Weekend is always the sort of unofficial ending of summer. Technically, it does not end until September 21.

We've been saying "How was your summer?" because in our minds once school begins, summer is over. Of course, with this idiotic movement to start school earlier and earlier each year, summer "ends" all too soon. I've written much on this topic before, so you know my thoughts as an educator about the length of the school year and when it should begin or end. Enough said; that's my opinion.

Speaking of my sometimes not so humble opinion, let me share some thoughts about the terms so common these days: "You are not listening." "You need to listen to me." "All we want is to be heard." The local papers each day relate incidents at meetings, mainly School Board Meetings, where people are shouting over one another so they can be heard.

I taught school or was a school principal for twenty-two years. In addition, I've dealt with young people for decades. For the most part, when they accuse us of "not listening" the *translation* is "You won't do what I want." And they want what they want regardless of what others might want or what is perhaps best.

Persons in leadership positions need to listen. Everyone has the right to be heard. But the tough part for leaders is to make decisions based not only what they have "heard," but also based on what a leader is convinced is the correct decision to make. And any leader must realize that not everyone will be happy with every decision. Jesus Christ could not make everybody happy; no leader today even stands a chance!

Next Saturday is September 11, the 20th anniversary of the horrible attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City on our country. Our weekend Masses will include special prayers for our country and for the victims of these terrorist attacks.

Remember twenty years ago? I sure do, it was the day my dad was buried. But on that day people predicted that our whole country would forever fall to our knees in prayer asking God for mercy. Churches would be full. Unity would rise. Didn't happen. Keep this in mind as we prepare for next weekend's civil and spiritual observances of "9-11."

Keep in prayer as well the people of Afghanistan as U.S. participation in a 20-year war there has come to an awkward end. As I mentioned in my homily last Sunday, Afghanistan has never in its history had a unified government. Pray for peace there and throughout the world.

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: the organizers of last week's "Back to School Bingo Bash." As I looked down from the stage making opening remarks and my prayer, I could not help but think of what wonderfully generous and hard-working parents we have. They give so much of their time and talent to make Saint Luke Catholic School a wonderful place for their own children and so many others.

I specifically want to thank Jenn Rotz and Courtnay Henthorn. They would be the first to say that they had plenty of help. And they did. But they led the charge to earn money for the 8th grade class trip to Washington, D.C., and other graduation activities. They organized it so that those who assisted them were able to assist so well! **Stewardship in Action!**


