If Heaven were like Harvard

There's no getting around it: life on earth can seem easier if you're rich. Most of the bodily and material needs a person could have are fulfilled if you've got a little bit of money behind you. So why doesn't this same theory apply to entering the kingdom of Heaven? Why isn't Heaven like an Ivy League school, where a connection and a hasty tuition check might open a lot of doors?

When you think about it, the virtues required to enter Heaven — things like charity and justice and courage — should be even closer within the grasp of those who never had to worry about where their food is coming from. In theory, your capacity for good works should only increase with the resources at your disposal.

The same is true for stewardship potential. Let's say I've got a lot of talent. Maybe I've got a lot of free time. On paper, it should be easier for me to give freely of these gifts, because I have the luxury that eluded the widow and her two coins: I can see my ample gift being put into action, when so many can only offer what they have and remind themselves that God sees it and appreciates it.

But here we get into the mess of humanity: if we have a lot of something, it means we have a lot of something we could use any way we want. And then we hear the whisper of the serpent: *Think of what this (money, time, talent) could do for you.*

May we pray for God to give us the heart of the widow, no matter our resources.

PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend we welcomed Carmelite Father Charles Rajan. He is a missionary priest who made an appeal for our support of the missions the Carmelite Friars have in India. He forgot to mention that he is a classmate of our Father Jegan Peter, who was our associate pastor several years ago.

Father Peter is now pastor at Saint Vincent de Paul Parish in Bedford and Saint Mary Parish in Mitchell, Indiana. What a small world! Father Charles was a delight to have around the rectory. Although they are from different states in India, he and Father George had lots to talk about!

I hope you have noticed the stone now along the wall of the new Vestry just West of the bell tower. By this time next week, we expect the interior of this new space will be complete, and we can move in. The Vestry is the specific area where the priest's vestments are stored and the room where he prepares for Mass. With this separate area, perhaps our preparation for Mass can be as prayerful as it is supposed to be. Right now, in our very small sacristy, it's like getting ready in the middle of Grand Central Station.

We all realize that the progress on our **Providence 2021** is much slower than we had hoped. But let's face it: Given the pandemic and all that goes with it, we are building at the *worst* possible time. For starters, obtaining the necessary permits were delayed because the city permitting offices were closed for a period of time because of COVID.

Then toss in the slowness of the supply chain for materials and somewhat of a shortage of workers. No wonder we are delayed. Now it looks as if we will not be finished with this phase of our Providence 2021 until sometime well after Christmas.

Yes, I'm disappointed as well, but that's the way it is. And playing the "Blame Game" is a waste of time and energy.

Perhaps a good example of this might be the beautiful stone exterior on the outside of the Vestry. This stone was carefully matched—as much as possible—with the existing stone on our church. We can't just go out to Lowe's and buy materials and put them up!

The matching process took time. And the ordering and delivery process even takes more time.

The same thing is true of the brick and stone on the preschool. That was carefully matched and chosen. Of course, the preschool was our top priority since we had 30 families on a waiting list to get in. And we still have some on a waiting list. It's finished—it's great—and hopefully, someday, we can have an Open House for everyone to see it all.

People have suggested that all these delays will mean skyrocketing expenses the longer it goes on. Not so. We have a Guaranteed Maximum Price as part of the contract. I can tell you right now what it will cost regardless if it takes another nine weeks or another nine months. The GMP is the responsibility of the contractors, not the parish.

The other thing just could be a sort of silver lining to the delays. Keep in mind that there is a third party in all this, not just Saint Luke Parish and Stenz Construction. We belong to the Archdiocese of Indianapolis, and every major project and expense is permitted and monitored by the archdiocese. They have dozens of building projects going on now. And the archdiocese has done hundreds in the past.

The staff at the archdiocese (architects and attorneys) knows how it goes.

Well, one thing is that for a parish or any archdiocesan institution to undertake a major project, the funding must be in place.

Specifically, this means that before we can break ground, we need 50% of the funding in cash and the other 50% in pledges. As we move along, to pay construction prices, the parish can borrow money from the Archdiocesan Deposit and Loan Fund at reasonable interest.

Of course, that's what we planned on doing and budgeted accordingly. Well, now that the construction is slow, this means that our payments for the construction have slowed. In the meantime, folks are doing pretty well in keeping up with their pledges. Cash is building. We probably won't need to borrow (at reasonable interest) nearly as much as we had thought we would.

Keep in mind that once this major phase of the **Providence 2021** Project is complete, we have two smaller phases to go: The covering over the Westside main entrance to the Narthex, which will be "Spencer Circle." Then the picnic-like pavilion near the preschool was named to honor our first volunteer athletic director and coach, Jack Woodside.

As my dear old Irish mother used to say, "If you are going to do something, do it **right!**" And we are.

We will be happy in the end!
Patience is a virtue!

A tip of my Biretta (hat) to: Saint Luke parishioner Andrew Morris! Andrew was recently named the Chair of the Goodwill Foundation Board of Directors. He previously served as vice-chair. I think everyone knows the good work that Goodwill does in our community.

Andrew is just one more parishioner who not only actively serves the Catholic community but our civic and business community as well. He is also a member of our RCIA team here in the parish.

Ask Monsignor a Question: *I liked your letter a couple of weeks ago about the necessity of attending Mass every Sunday.*

Why don't you preach on it as well? (Via in-person after a Mass)

Well, because as they say, I'd be "preaching to the choir." People who don't attend Mass would not be here to hear it!

I suggest that **you** all put the word out to family, friends, and neighbors who don't attend Mass regularly. Gently prod them to come, not just because they "have to," but because **you** get something from it and would like for them to do the same. When part of our community is not here, we are missing something for sure.

Of one thing, I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!
