

PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Feast of Saint Luke! His actual feast day is tomorrow, **Monday, October 18**. But we always have what is called the “external solemnity” of Saint Luke on the weekend closest to his actual feast day.

Luke, the writer of the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has been identified with Saint Paul’s “Luke, the beloved physician” mentioned in Colossians 4:14. We know few other facts about Luke’s life from Scripture or early Church historians. Last year a new movie came out called “Paul, the Apostle.” You can get it on YouTube and other outlets. I found it to be more about Saint Luke than even Saint Paul. It’s worth watching.

It is believed that Luke was born a Greek and a Gentile. Luke’s Gospel shows special sensitivity to evangelizing Gentiles. It is only in his Gospel that we hear the parable of the **Good Samaritan** that we hear Jesus praising the faith of some Gentiles such as the widow of Zarephath and Naaman the Syrian, and that we hear the story of the one grateful leper who is a Samaritan.

According to the early Church historian, Eusebius Luke was born at Antioch in Syria. Eusebius, Saint Jerome, Saint Irenaeus, and Caius, a second-century writer, all refer to Luke as a physician. In our day, it would be easy to assume that someone who was a doctor was rich, but scholars have argued that Luke might have been born a slave. It was not uncommon for families to educate slaves in medicine so that they would have a resident family physician.

We go to The Acts of the Apostles to follow the trail of Luke’s Christian ministry. We know nothing about his conversion. Luke first joined Paul’s company at Troas at about the year 51 and accompanied him into Macedonia. Luke is the loyal comrade who stays with Paul when he is imprisoned in Rome about the year 61. After everyone else deserts Paul in his final imprisonment and sufferings, Luke remains with Paul to the end.

Luke’s unique perspective on Jesus can be seen in the six miracles and eighteen parables not found in the other Gospels. Luke’s Gospel of the poor and social justice. He is the one who tells the story of Lazarus and the Rich Man

who ignored him. **Luke** is the one who uses “Blessed are the poor” instead of “Blessed are the poor in spirit” in the beatitudes.

Luke has a special connection with the women in Jesus’ life, especially Mary. Only in Luke’s Gospel, we hear the story of the Annunciation, Mary’s visit to Elizabeth, including the Magnificat, the Presentation, and the story of Jesus’ disappearance in Jerusalem. It is Luke that we have to thank for the Scriptural parts of the Hail Mary: “Hail Mary full of grace” spoken at the Annunciation and “Blessed are you and blessed is the fruit of your womb Jesus” spoken by her cousin Elizabeth.

Forgiveness and God’s mercy to sinners is also of first importance to Luke. Only in Luke do we hear the story of the Prodigal Son welcomed back by the overjoyed father. Only in Luke do we hear the story of the forgiven woman disrupting the feast by washing Jesus’ feet with her tears. Throughout Luke’s Gospel, Jesus takes the side of the sinner who wants to return to God’s mercy.

Reading Luke’s Gospel gives a good idea of his character as one who loved the poor, who wanted the door to God’s Kingdom opened to all, who respected women, and who saw hope in God’s mercy for everyone. The reports of Luke’s life after Paul’s death are conflicting. Some early writers claim he was martyred; others say he lived a long life. He is often shown with an ox or a calf because these are the symbols of sacrifice—the sacrifice Jesus made for the entire world.

Luke is the patron of physicians and surgeons. We are blessed to have him as the patron of our parish! This weekend we kick off our annual Stewardship Campaign. You will all receive a letter from me about this important topic.

As always, our theme reminds us that we are only **temporary** stewards of all God has given us. If we imitate Saint Luke, our patron, we will be generous stewards of all God gives us! Saint Luke, pray for us.

A tip of my Biretta (hat) to: Saint Luke Girl Scout Catherine “Cat” Williams. As part of her scout project, Cat renovated and renewed the “Marge Henkel Youth Ministry Garden” on the Illinois Street side of our campus. It’s beautiful! We formally dedicated it last month.

Any group can schedule the use of this lovely restored space through the parish office.

Thanks, Cat! Stewardship in Action!

Ask Monsignor a Question: *I also appreciated your bulletin letter comments a few weeks ago about the necessity of attending Mass every Sunday. Do you really know who comes to Mass and who does not? (Via in-person after a Mass)*

Obviously, I have no way of knowing for sure who goes to Mass every weekend. Some may go to Mass at other parishes. But I do know who **hardly ever** comes to Mass on the weekend at Saint Luke. But the real issue is that God knows; that’s what counts. Mass attendance is an issue of **fidelity** to Christ and to His Church.

What really saddens me are instances like lately when some of the boys wanted to be trained as new altar servers. However, they **will not** be able to serve since their parents will not bring them to Mass on the weekend. Can these be the same parents who promised: “to bring them up in the practice of the Faith” when these boys were baptized?

Still, others think it is okay to get to Mass “most of the time.” That’s supposed to be acceptable. Well, go home and tell your spouse that you are faithful to them “most of the time.”

I think that will go over about as well with them as it’s going to go over on Judgment Day at the Throne of Almighty God.

Of one thing, I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!

Stewardship Campaign 2021

This stewardship season, St. Luke is again asking parishioners to prayerfully consider how you contribute to our parish with your time and talent. Our parish of nearly 2000 families is blessed with over 60 active ministries that serve our parish and the Indianapolis area community.

Each parish household will receive a **Stewardship Intention Card** in the mail. This card offers a way to indicate your new or ongoing financial support of the parish. Part of the intention card is dedicated to the ministries at St. Luke. Please look for it if you choose to use this option for ministry sign up.

The ministries listed below are ones that currently active during these times of social distancing and Covid-19. Some ministries have sacramental requirements for participation. If you are interested in a ministry that is not listed, or if you have any questions, please contact Ashley Dirks, ext 244 or adirks@stluke.org, for more information.

Safe and Sacred is now Safe Parish

On July 1, 2021 Safe and Sacred became Safe Parish, the child protection program for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. Volunteers and staff who have never completed Safe and Sacred need to now complete Safe Parish. You do not need to register with Safe Parish until your Safe and Sacred expires (it lasts between 3-5 years). *All employees and all volunteers who minister to or work with children must complete the training and background check BEFORE starting any position.*

Purpose of New Program

The Archdiocese of Indianapolis has chosen the "Safe Parish" program for several reasons. It provides easier access to child protection training for clergy, employees, and volunteers. It allows us to broaden the focus of the training to increase awareness of all forms of child abuse. Safe and Sacred includes an assessment that must be taken and passed to ensure that training content is learned and can be applied. We believe these are important new features for this program.



Procedural Requirements

- Go to www.archindysafeparish.org
- Current users sign in with your username & password. New Users select registration button.
- Select the City and then St Luke from the drop down menu. If you volunteer with more than one parish, select "add multiple locations" and next.
- You will be asked to fill in your information and then create an username and password to get onto the site. Please remember both!

Volunteer Opportunities

Eucharistic Minister - Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) distribute the Precious Body and Blood of Christ at Mass. Ministers must be trained and meet sacramental requirements. EMHCs are commissioned for 3-year terms with the pastor's and Archbishop's approval.

Lector - Lectors' responsibilities are to present readings at Masses on Sundays, feast days and holidays. Certain sacramental requirements apply.

Ministers Of Hospitality - The role of the usher/greeter is one of offering a friendly, welcoming presence to those coming to worship, of providing leadership during emergencies, and performing such tasks as taking up the collection, presenting the gifts, assisting parishioners during Communion, disseminating the church bulletin and participating in cleaning the church after completion of the Mass.

Music Ministry - Provides Music for all church liturgies. Groups include Children's, Contemporary Ensemble, and Adult Choirs; St. Cecelia Funeral Choir; Cantors; Musicians/Instrumentalists and Handbells.

Sacristans - Sacristans undertake the overall preparation of liturgical celebrations, including Holy Days. The sacristan places the Lectionary on the Ambo and petitions; lays out what is needed for the celebration, such as cruets, chalices, ciboria, linens; makes sure there is enough host and wine for the Mass. The sacristan, in harmony with the pastor, also makes sure that the vestments, church furnishings, liturgical vessels and decorative objects are kept in good condition. Training is provided.

a) Cleaning - Cleaning the church regularly, most especially in preparation for special liturgies and celebrations.

b) Linen Care - This ministry takes care of the washing and folding of the purificators, towels and other liturgical linens used during all Masses.

Altar Servers - The primary role is to assist the priest in the celebration of Mass through specific actions and active participation in the liturgy. Servers carry the cross, processional candle(s), the incense and censer; hold the book for the priest celebrant; present the bread, wine and water during the preparation of the gifts; and assist the priest celebrant and deacon as necessary. Requirements - Must have received confession and First Communion, and be in the 5th grade or older. Training provided.

Stewardship Commission Committee - The Stewardship Commission is responsible for recommending policy and developing goals for the overall parish Stewardship program. The Commission has been given the responsibility of recommending and coordinating the solicitation calendar for the parish, including fund-raising.

Youth Ministry, Adult Volunteers - The Youth Ministry program offers opportunities for parishioner students in grades 7-12 to deepen their relationship w/Christ and His Church, and exploring ways to live out His mission in their own lives. This group of adult volunteers serve in a variety of capacities including an advisory board and core volunteers for Jr High, High School, and College activities.

Volunteer Opportunities (cont'd)

Pro Life Committee - The St. Luke Pro-Life Committee believes and promotes the Church's constant teaching that all human life is a precious gift from God. We offer educational, pastoral care and advocacy programs that promote the value and dignity of every human life from conception until natural death.

St Vincent DePaul - The Saint Vincent de Paul Society provides aid to the poor and needy. Volunteers make home visits in the St. Luke and St. Rita parish areas. They may also answer the help and donation pickup phone lines, and assist clients at the distribution center (furniture, appliances, clothing) and food pantry. Meetings are the second and fourth Sundays at 10:45 AM. Beggars for the Poor is a "special work" of SVdP and provides food, clothing and personal care items to the homeless.

Martha Ministries - This ministry of lay persons, devoted to serve anyone that has lost a loved one, sets up guidelines for serving the bereaved and implements programs of support especially beyond the funeral. This ministry works cooperatively with the Good Samaritan Ministry in upholding families during this time of need.

Faith Formation (Children, Adult) - The primary objective of the Faith Formation and Catechesis Commission is to promote the New Evangelization, which invites and encourages men, women and children to develop a renewed, first time encounter, or deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. The desire that Christ's love set the earth ablaze is the ultimate goal of all ministries that evangelize, catechize and conduct ongoing faith formation.

Preschool Volunteer - St Luke Catholic Preschool seeks volunteers with gentle, fun-loving personalities, the ability to fulfill everyday responsibilities, and works well collaborating with colleagues. Join the fun!

Participation Opportunities

Perpetual Adoration - St. Luke Catholic Church's Perpetual Adoration Chapel is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. We welcome anyone who wishes to spend time in prayer, reflection, and meditation to join us in this beautiful practice. Adorers are scheduled to perpetually adore in one hour increments. Visitors are also welcome at any time. Scheduled adorers are asked to find a substitute if they cannot fulfill their commitment at any time.

MAMAS - A community of mothers of all ages aspiring to grow in their practice of the Catholic faith and lead their families to Jesus Christ through Mary.

Young Adults Group - Young adults, ages 18-35, meet once a month for an evening of fellowship, prayer, reflection and service with a mission to bring young adults together and to aid them in their journey with Jesus Christ, His Holy Catholic Church and their call to holiness.

Participation Opportunities (cont'd)

Youth Ministry - The Youth Ministry program offers opportunities for parishioner students in grades 7-12 to deepen their relationship with Christ and His Church, and exploring ways to live out His mission in their own lives.

Knights of Columbus - Knights are Catholic men, 18 years of age and older, who are committed to making their community a better place while supporting their Church. Being a Knight is more than camaraderie; it is being involved with your community; it is supporting your local Catholic Church, while enhancing your own faith; it is about protecting and enhancing your family life.

Prayer Chain - Parish members who pray for those in need of prayer as requested. Prayers may be offered as intentions in daily prayer, intentions in daily or weekly Mass, when praying the Rosary, in visiting the Adoration Chapel, in the offering of extra works of mercy, or any prayerful activity that individual members of the group desire. We ask that the prayer request is kept in prayers for one week.

Mens Retired Group - Originating from a Disciples in Mission group, this ministry of retirement-aged men meet monthly for a social gathering with a spiritual bend including speakers from the archdiocese with information on a variety of topics.

Glymmers - Senior members of our parish gather on a regular basis for Mass, faith-sharing, and lunch. Meets monthly on the first Friday for Mass in the chapel followed by a luncheon in the Father Courtney Reception Room.

Small Group Opportunities

That Man is You - That Man is You! is an interactive, multimedia program focused upon the development of authentic male leadership. Over the course of three years, it successively considers men in their relationship to God, to their spouse and to their children. Program content harmonizes current social and medical science with the teachings of the Church and the wisdom of the saints to develop the vision of man fully alive.

St Luke Men's Morning Retreat (SLAMMERS) - This group of men gather weekly on Thursday mornings, 6:30-7:30 AM, to share devotional reading, reflection, fellowship, fun and prayer.

Sisters of Strength (SOS) - Ladies of all ages, are invited to join Diane Schafer every Monday at 6:30pm in the Fr. Courtney Parlor to prepare for the coming Mass by studying the scriptures. 

Can you spend one hour with Christ?




