

Christian Social Action

As we all know, poverty exists throughout the year. Our own Saint Luke Christian Social Action Commission (CSAC) and our Saint Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP) work diligently to help those less fortunate than ourselves. First Sunday Sharing has been one of the primary ways in which we as parishioners have helped those in need.

Parishioners receive a CSAC-SVDP envelope in their mailings from the parish. It provides the financial support for these two ministries.

Non-perishable food and men's clothing is collected on the first weekend of each month. The food is distributed at the SVdP "Boulevard Place" Food Pantry (4202 Boulevard Place) and the clothing is given to homeless men who are served each weekend by Beggars for the Poor. The Boulevard Place Food Pantry, a St. Vincent de Paul ministry which is supported by St. Luke and four other north side parishes, provides food assistance to over 900 families in need each month.





PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

Well, "Happy Halloween!" Don't forget that this tradition of children dressing up in costumes and hiking around asking for treats began as a religious observance.

Children dressed up as one of the saints and went from door to door "trick or treating." It was known as "All Hallows Eve." (All holy-evening before the holy day) We would have no Halloween were it not for All Saints Day!

Tomorrow, **Monday**, November 1, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. The Church honors All the Saints—anyone who is in heaven. Some of them have been canonized; most of them have not. Think of all the wonderful people we have known who are now with God in His eternal kingdom! It is impossible to name them all. So, November 1 is "their day."

We will have our annual Kindergarten Saints Monday morning at 8:15 a.m. School Mass. Our kindergarten pupils dress up like one of the saints and process into Mass.

It's great. We will have two other holy day Masses tomorrow, Monday, at 11:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.

This year we have a special display of relics of the saints near the baptismal font. They are a gift to Saint Luke from the estate of the late Joanne Dillon Sullivan.

The Church venerates relics because these may bring a person to imitate the virtues of the saint. Most of us have items that belong to our deceased relatives or close friends to remind us of them and their influence on our lives.

Inside the ambry, where the holy oils are kept near the baptistry, there are two special relics of Pope Saint Pius X. One is the white skull cap he wore while he served as the Supreme Pontiff. They were a gift to our parish from dear Joanne McClane. Her funeral was last Friday. May she Rest in Peace. I suspect she has met her favorite saint, Pius X, by now!

Relics are commonly divided into three classes:

First-class relics are part of the actual body of the saint. **Second-class** relics are bits of the clothing or other articles used by the saint in life. **Third-class**

relics are objects that have been touched to the body or the tomb of the saint. We all belong to the same Faith Community. That's what we mean by the Communion of Saints! Ask for their prayers.

The next day, **Tuesday**, November 2, is the Feast of All Souls. We pray for our beloved faithful departed. We will have three Masses this day as well: 8:15 a.m., 11:30 a.m., and at the 5:30 p.m. Mass on November 2, we will pray in particular for all those from Saint Luke Parish who have died in the past year. We've sent special invitations to their families. Each family will be given a memorial candle to help them remember to pray for their loved ones.

As is our custom, we have our All Souls Envelopes to record the names of our beloved departed. The basket for the envelopes and names is in the back of the Church near the statue of Saint Paul. We will place these names on the altar during November, the month of the Holy Souls.

An offering is not essential; we mainly want to collect names.

Praying for those who have died is something uniquely Catholic. What follows is a good explanation of our belief along this line. In the interest of full disclosure, I "stole" it from Msgr. Stumpf and his bulletin over at Saint Matthew. It's well written. No doubt he learned all this from me during his six years living at Saint Luke Rectory. But then again, he likely came up with it on his own. Here goes:

November 2 is the Feast of All Souls, the day in which the Church remembers and prays for those who have died. Some may wonder why the Church encourages us to pray for the dead. As Catholics, we believe there is a heaven, and there is a hell.

Heaven is our goal. It is where we want to spend eternity because we will be with God. However, few of us will probably die in a perfect state, ready to be with God.

The Church, cognizant of this fact, has the beautiful belief in purgatory. Purgatory is not a place but rather a state of purification to be ready for heaven. The Church has taught that we can assist those in this state of purgation by our prayers.

Throughout history, Catholics have

prayed for the dead. This practice originated in the very early Church. Saint Monica, the mother of Saint Augustine, told her son, "One thing only I ask you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be." In addition, the Church teaches that praying for the dead is one of the corporal works of mercy.

The greatest prayer we can offer is the Mass, and thus Catholics traditionally have Masses said for the deceased. However, Masses can also be offered for the living or for special intentions, such as an anniversary, a birthday, or a specific need. If you would like to have a Mass said for a deceased loved one or for a special intention, just contact the parish office.

This **Thursday**, November 4, we have an Open House here at Saint Luke Catholic School. I remain convinced that the greatest gift any Catholic parent can give their children is a Catholic School Education.

We will have tours on Thursday after both Masses (8:15 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.). Why not attend Mass then tour our school? Each session begins with a reception and some Q and A. Without hesitation, I urge you send your children to Saint Luke Catholic School. Saint Luke Catholic School is A-rated by the Indiana Department of Education. 


