

PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

As we move into the second week of **Advent**, we celebrate the beautiful feast of Mary, **The Immaculate Conception**, on *Tuesday*. This *holy day* is *always a holy day of obligation* in our country since the U.S. claims Our Lady under this title, “Immaculate Conception,” as our patroness. That’s why we have the huge Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in our nation’s capitol.

We will have four (4) Masses to satisfy our obligation to attend Mass on this holy day of obligation: The Vigil Mass on Tuesday, December 7, at 5:30 p.m.; then on Tuesday at 8:15 a.m., 11:30 a.m., and 5:30 p.m. Keep in mind that the school children attend 8:15 a.m. Mass on Tuesday. It will be full.

Keep in mind that the Feast of the Immaculate Conception is about the conception and birth of **Mary**, the mother of Jesus, in the womb of her mother, Saint Anne. From the very moment of her conception, Mary was free from Original Sin. She remained sinless throughout her life.

Also, on December 8, we conclude the **Year of Saint Joseph**. Pope Francis proclaimed this year-long devotion to Saint Joseph at this time last year. I have been preparing for my own **Consecration to Saint Joseph** according to the method outlined in the book by the same name written by Father Donald Calloway, MIC.

Obviously, Saint Joseph is my patron saint, so I’ve always had a special devotion to him. I was born on the Feast of Saint Gregory, so my mother and grandmother wanted to name me “Gregory.” Dad, Joseph, Sr., stepped in and said, “We will name him Joseph.” Now, I like Saint Gregory; but I’m grateful dad did this.

Even with my special fondness for Saint Joseph, I’ve learned much more just by reading Father Calloway’s book. I recommend it to you. This special Year of Saint Joseph was meant to draw us to a deeper devotion to this great saint. But it’s only the beginning; our devotion cannot begin then end here. It must be ongoing.

As you know, for the Year of Saint Joseph, I moved his statue up in front into the sanctuary on the ambo side. People like it there, and so do I. Joe is here to

stay. Let’s keep up our appreciation of this man, especially as we contemplate his role in the Christmas story in the weeks to come. I hope that all men of this parish will learn more about him and follow his lead.

Saint Nicholas Day is tomorrow, Monday, the 6th. I know our school children will be celebrating some Saint Nicholas traditions.

I hope families (the “domestic Church”) will do the same. Even in the seminary, we grown men put our shoes out in the hallway the night before to have them filled with treats by “Saint Nicholas”—one of the Benedictine monks. Teach your children well!

Last week’s bulletin included our annual **Advent** Insert. There are some extras available in the Narthex. It is a listing of spiritual helps for each of us to properly observe the Season of **Advent**. The Advent insert lists our confession times here at Saint Luke with some expanded confession times the last week of Advent. We will also highlight Advent activities in the regular Sunday Steward (this bulletin).

We light our **Advent** Wreath at the beginning of each Mass during this holy season.

Families of second graders who will make First Holy Communion in the Spring have been invited to take turns lighting the successive candles on the Advent Wreath.

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: Parishioner Stephanie Engelman! She was featured in an article in our archdiocesan newspaper, *The Criterion*, last month. It was an article during October, the Month of the Holy Rosary, about the rosary as a “powerful prayer.” The article was subtitled, “Rosary Makers and an Author Share Their Love of the Rosary.” Stephanie is the author.

Her book, written now six years ago, is *A Single Bead*. Today it remains among the top ten books for its category on Amazon. In her own words, Stephanie says that her hope is after reading *A Single Bead*, “people will learn and understand the prayer, or begin to see that.” She said she hopes, “That young people will pray the rosary, and they will begin to experience the power of the rosary in their own life.”

In the meantime, Stephanie finds time to be a good wife and mother, an active parishioner at Saint Luke, and one of

the coordinators for our Parish Perpetual Adoration Chapel. Thank you, Stephanie! If you have not read her book, I recommend it. *Stewardship in Action!*

Ask Monsignor a Question: *What did the U.S. Bishops document on the Eucharist say about giving Holy Communion to so-called “Catholic” public figures who directly oppose Church teaching receiving Holy Communion?* (Via email)

I’ll probably write more about this later. In the meantime, look it up on the Internet and check it out for yourself. The title is: “The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church.” Each line or section is numbered. The part you are asking about comes in sections 45 and 46. But I recommend reading the entire document.

I was caught by Section 3: “The pandemic forced us to stay physically distant from one another and, for a time, to view the celebration of Mass on television or computer screen.

Although many of the faithful appear to have had their Faith and their desire for the Eucharist strengthened by such a long separation, we worry that others, having lived without Mass for so long, may have become discouraged or accustomed to life without the Eucharist.”

That is my worry also. I’m discouraged that too many people—who faithfully and regularly were at Mass prior to the pandemic—do not come to Mass anymore. What happened? Did they now decide they can get along without the Eucharist?

The bishops quote the words of Our Lord from John 6: “Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you.” The Lord accompanies us in many ways, but none as profound as when we encounter Him in the Eucharist.

Of one thing, I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!

GOSPEL MEDITATION

St. Ambrose shares some wisdom on our need to prepare the way and open the door for Christ. "You see that when the Word of God knocks hardest on your door, it is when his hair is wet with the dew of the night. In fact, he chooses to visit those who are in tribulation and trial, lest one of them be overwhelmed by distress. So, his head is covered with dew, with drops, when his body is laboring hard. It is important to keep watch so that when the Bridegroom comes, he is not shut out. If you are asleep and your heart is not keeping watch, he will go away without knocking; but if your heart is alert for his coming, he knocks and asks for the door to be opened to him." When life gets overwhelming and difficult and we find ourselves feeling a bit downhearted and miserable, these words can bring great comfort.

We sometimes choose to remain stuck in our uncomfortable darkness and being stuck becomes our norm. In this time of self-focus our hearts are closed to the graces and life God desires to give us. Wrapped in the robe of mourning and misery, we fail to see the mercy, justice, and love the Bridegroom wants to bring. If we take seriously the need to prepare the way for Christ and open our hearts in preparation for his visit, we can hear God's gentle voice calling us deep within. It beckons us to seek out its source and discover the inner calm and peace that can prevail over the darkness of despair. Sometimes our darkness is so dark that it may seem unsurmountable. Trusting in the spiritual friends who journey with us, and God's promise may bring a glimmer of light even when it is most difficult to keep our hearts' doors open. Sometimes, the only light in the darkness is found in trusting the faith of others both past and present.

We have to trust that God has already begun the accomplishment of good work in us and that humanity is on an incredible journey to something wonderful and awesome. God is not done. When we open the doors of our hearts, straighten the paths of our lives, and prepare the way, Jesus can come with God's simple gifts of peace, grace, and joy. Life throws a great deal at us. It is easy to get tired and confused. We have to train our hearts to keep watch, discern what is of value, and forge ahead. Not allowing ourselves to become so weighed down by things and brought out of focus is a tremendous goal to achieve this Advent season. God is knocking. Answer the door. You will see and understand life in ways you never thought possible before.

The annual collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious was first launched in 1988 by the Catholic bishops of the United States.
