Dear Parishioners,

Our new 2022 calendars are here! Naturally, the delay is because of COVID and related issues. Again, we thank our generous sponsors for this calendar: The O'Brien Automotive Family and Leppert Mortuaries.

Speaking of **Stewardship**: Have you completed and sent in your Commitment Card for the **United Catholic Appeal**? I received a report this week on our parish participation. We are at 93% of our goal. The worst statistic is that this is from only 128 of about 2,000 parish households.

The **United Catholic Appeal** is our way to support a number of things like Catholic Charities, which include food and clothing for those in need, emergency shelters, and counseling. Let's face it: There is not a great need for these services in Meridian Hills, Williams Creek, and Carmel. But that does not excuse Saint Luke from doing our part to support those in need.

Please complete it and drop it at the parish office or in the collection basket. We are so blessed in this parish. God expects us to share our gifts. Please do! **Stewardship in Action!**

I cannot and probably should not comment here on every person whose Funeral Mass I celebrate at Saint Luke. It would be impossible to list all of the names and qualities of so many people of Faith that pass from this life onto the next while parishioners at Saint Luke.

I have to make an exception this week. Last week we buried two of the most remarkable Catholic women I have had the pleasure to know, here or anywhere else.

Both of them were long-time faithful members of our parish. We are who we are today in some ways because of these two wonderful ladies.

On January 11, we buried Mary McNulty Young.

She was a charter member of Saint

Luke Parish. She raised her family directly across the street from the entrance to our school. Her children attended school here. Mary was at Mass just about every day—seven days a week.

I met Mary Young long before I came here just over ten years ago. She sang at my parents' wedding on Valentine's Day in 1942. Both she and I were baptized at the former Assumption Parish on the West Side or in "W-I," as we used to call it. (Assumption now houses the Saint Athanasius Byzantine Catholic Church.) Both Mary and I went to college at Marian. She was a few years ahead of me!

In addition to raising a large family with her husband, Howard, Mary somehow found time to engage in leadership and fundraising activities for a number of churches, schools, civic and charitable organizations. The list in her obituary was remarkable. She was so involved in Saint Luke Parish as well as her *alma mater*, Marian University.

At a time when women were not so prominent in the law profession, Mary Young earned a law degree and was a successful lawyer for years. Yet her most important accomplishments were being a faithful Catholic, wife, and mother.

We shall miss her!

We buried Jeanne Atkins on January 14. Talk about a faithful Catholic! Jeanne was Catholic to the core! I would say that when I think of people of unshakable Faith, Jeanne would be at the top of the list. She and her husband, Tom, also raised a good-sized family. Her greatest accomplishment and pride was also to be wife and mother.

Jeanne, too was active in so many charitable activities. The list is long, but chief among them was Saint Luke Parish and the Little Sisters of the Poor. Jeanne was a leader in a number of organizations and very involved in the work of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. That's where I first met her.

Plus, Jeanne was a shrewd and talented businesswoman. Did you ever hear of Atkins Cheesecakes? Or better yet, did you ever eat an Atkins Cheesecake? The recipe, the business model, and the success of this enterprise were all Jeanne Atkins. She was another woman ahead of her time in leadership and entrepreneurship for sure! We will miss her at Saint Luke! I could go on and on about all the wonderful souls we commend to God from Saint Luke. God has blessed us and continues to bless us with so many committed, wonderful women and men of Faith.



A Letter from Archbishop Thompson

Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Soon our Archdiocese of Indianapolis will take up the annual Collection for the Church in Latin America. The national collection supports many pastoral projects that benefit the faithful in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Among these many projects is Brazil's Associacao do Sementes do Verbo (Seeds of the Word Community), a young and growing congregation with a unique vision of forming missionary communities of disciples in all states of life - consecrated men and women, clergy, lay missionaries, and married couples and families, all living together in community. Founded in 2004, Sementes do Verbo has 20 communities throughout Brazil, as well as in Portugal, Belgium, Canada, Comoros, and Mozambique. A central aspect of the group's spirituality is a nine-month formation period called a "sabbatical year," during which participants live in a mission house with the community and study Scripture; take courses in the theology of the body and human sexuality, with an emphasis on prevention of abuse; and participate in spiritual exercises and parish mission weeks.

Supported by a grant from the Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America, 100 participants from 25 dioceses in 11 Brazillian states had the opportunity to become formed as more effective missionary disciples in 2021. When you support the Collection for the Church in Latin America, your material gift makes it possible for disciples to use their gifts and abilities as evangelizers, regardless of their states in life or economic background.

Our archdiocese will take up this collection **on the weekend of January 22-23, 2022.** Please be generous toward this collection. Take this opportunity to share your faith with our sisters and brothers in Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support truly makes a difference. Thank you and God bless you.
