A Letter from Msgr. Schaedel

PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners,

We are *Off to the Races!* That is the theme of our annual *Trivia Night* here at Saint Luke. Mark your calendars for Friday night, February 4. I think Trivia Night is one of the most fun things we do here at Saint Luke. Once again, we plan to have it "in person" this year. Details on how to RSVP are in today's bulletin.

I was listening to a program on Catholic Radio that talked about COVID-19 Fatigue among people today. That is the understatement of the year! We are all sick and tired (no pun intended) of it and all that goes with it. I suspect that among those most frustrated are parents of school children here and elsewhere.

Adding to my frustration is the seeming opinion of lots of people that we at Saint Luke are just free to do whatever we want. It isn't that way. We are "at the mercy" of the Marion County Health Department and other authorities, including the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. While I appreciate the fact that some people think that either the school administration or me as "all-powerful," we are not.

In fact, just this week, I learned of another school here in the city that chose to ignore some guidelines from the County Health Department. One of their school parents reported the violations, and now this particular school is in danger of having to shut down in-person learning for a period of time. I hope that by the time you read this, that has been avoided. But as a pastor, I am not willing to put Saint Luke Catholic School or Church in such a position. And I know full well I will continue to get beat up for it.

Our Saint Luke Catholic Preschool Director, Mrs. Laurie Breen, has announced her retirement at the end of this school year. One of the smartest things I ever did was six years ago when I asked Laurie to open our new preschool.

Laurie took off running and got our preschool off the ground in short order. Each year it has improved and expanded. Last summer, we completed a physical expansion of the building—and we still have an extensive waiting list for admission. That speaks volumes!

As of this semester, Mrs. Breen has been involved in early childhood and elementary school education for 39 years—the majority of those years here at Saint Luke and Saint Joan of Arc. Now it's time for her to be able to spend more time with her own children and precious grandchildren.

We will have a suitable "going away" reception for Laurie later this Spring. Of course, she is not really "going away." She and her husband, Joe, are active members of Saint Luke Parish. Her legacy will live on for decades to come. I could not be more grateful for this pioneer who started—from basically nothing—our wonderful Saint Luke Catholic Preschool.

Pray for our 8th graders who had their Confirmation Retreat this weekend in preparation for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this coming August. Come, Holy Spirit!

I want to remind everyone about our need for *Stewardship*: Everyone should have received a <u>Parish Commitment Card</u> last October and turned it into the parish office by now. Only those families who have a Stewardship Card on file are eligible to receive the parishioner rate for school tuition.

Whatever one lists on the card for financial giving is not a hard and fast commitment. Circumstances can change—one way or the other. But it does help us plan. The other sections of the card help us get people involved in various ministries around the parish.

Parish giving through automatic-direct-withdrawal each week or month is a great blessing to keep us going consistently. Please consider it. Your gift consistently and automatically comes to Saint Luke Parish whether or not you are able to be physically present for Mass. Details are on our parish website: www.stluke.org. Click on the "Give to Saint Luke" tab to find out more.

Have you completed and sent in your Commitment Card for the **United Catholic Appeal?** We are at 93% of our goal. Come on; we can make it!
The sad statistic is that this is from only 128 of about 2,000 parish households.

The **United Catholic Appeal** is our way to support a number of things like Catholic Charities, which includes food and clothing for those in need, emergency shelters, and counseling.

Let's face it: There is not a great need for these services in Meridian Hills, Williams Creek, and Carmel. But that

does not excuse Saint Luke from doing

our part to support those in need.

You should have received a brochure and a pledge card in the mail last November. If not, there are extras in the "Look Nook" outside the parish office. Please complete it and drop it at the parish office or in the collection basket. We are so blessed. God expects us to share our gifts. Please do! **Stewardship in Action!**


