## A Letter from Msgr. Schaedel

### PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners.

Thanks so much to you all who remembered me in such a kind way on my birthday last weekend! I appreciate it so much! I spent the day with my parish family at the First Communion Retreat in the morning and for confessions and Mass in the afternoon.

The evening was spent with my sister, Jan, and her family. We had a great time. And I so much love <u>both</u> of my families—birth family and parish family!

The situation in Ukraine continues. Pray for peace and healing for the people of Ukraine. And, as Our Lady asked us at Fatima, pray for the conversion of Communist Russia. Thanks also for your generosity in our collections for the people of the Ukraine on Ash Wednesday and at the prayer service last week.

Lent is well underway and into our third Sunday. This week we have a great feast we can celebrate amid our Lenten observances: the Solemnity of the Annunciation on Friday, March 25. Since it is a solemnity, we should be dispensed from the Friday abstinence (no meat) that day.

The school kids will really be celebrating; it's the first day of their Spring Break.

The Annunciation is the Feast that we commemorate each time we pray "The Angelus." That is the prayer on the top of the back cover of the Pew Missal. It begins, "The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary." We remember the Archangel Gabriel appeared to young Mary and invited her to cooperate in God's Plan for the birth of Our Savior. Thank heavens she freely said, "Yes!"

Traditionally, people can recite this prayer three times a day: at 6:00 p.m., at noon, and at 6:00 p.m.

This is why church bells ring in a special way at those times. Out of mercy for our neighbors, we ring the early one at 8:00 a.m. and not 6:00 a.m. here.

Throughout the week, the 11:30 a.m. Masses end about noon. The 5:30 p.m. Masses end about 6:00 p.m. And so, we pray "The Angelus" at those times immediately after Mass while we stand before the statue of the Blessed Mother.

It's interesting how we started this practice. Early on in my time here, a man approached me after the 5:30 p.m.

Mass. He noted that it was about 6:00 p.m. and suggested that we pray "The Angelus" at that time. I thanked him; told him I would think about it. Well, I did. And that's how we started this practice, thanks to him!

The fascinating thing to me is that I had never seen this guy before.

And I have never seen him again.

The only time he spoke to me was on that occasion, probably over ten years ago now. I've often wondered if he was actually Saint Joseph, suggesting this to honor his bride and Our Lady. Who knows! Stranger things have happened.

Things attendance-wise are ever so slowly getting better. Weekend Mass attendance has been creeping up, but we are still not back to where we should be. I would, however, say that things are pretty good in terms of daily Mass attendance during Lent. Last Friday evening, we had almost 200 people for 5:30 p.m. Mass. Many of them stayed for the Way of the Cross.

We were able to reopen our Perpetual Adoration Chapel last August. We still have some slots that we need to fill. Please consider taking an hour on a regular basis. If you cannot make it, someone will sub for you. Some of the open hours are at rather "regular times," not just in the middle of the night.

We have additional Masses and devotions during Lent. These were listed in the Lenten insert and each week in this bulletin. We will have Mass twice every weekday as usual. The best Lenten practice is to attend an extra Mass or two on weekdays. The Mass is the perfect prayer!

Unless you are sinless, no Lenten program is complete without the **Sacrament of Penance. Confessions** are heard seven days a week at Saint Luke.

Check this bulletin or the website for the schedule.

Almsgiving is giving to the poor or to charity. We have some second collections each weekend for this during Lent. This weekend, we have a chance to support the work of a fairly new ministry, Vagabond Missions. Physical poverty in the inner city leads to spiritual poverty. Vagabond brings the Good News of Jesus Christ to neighborhoods and kids who are unchurched. Lives are being changed as many adults invest their

time in teens' lives.

They currently have six missions in four cities.

And Vagabond Missions is gearing up to open a mission here in Indianapolis. I know you will be generous in all of our second collections.

Next weekend we will take up the second collection for Catholic Relief Services. I know they are spending much time, energy, and money to assist the victims of the war in Ukraine.

On **Wednesday, March 23**, we continue our popular **Soup Suppers** after the evening Mass. We have our popular <u>adult</u> education series for Lent: **Soup and Spirituality**. The evening begins with the 5:30 p.m. Mass, then down to the parish hall for a simple soup supper and speaker. We have this week as our speaker our own Quanah Jeffries. His topic is "The Theology and Practice of Obedience in the Life of the Laity."

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: our own Sister Diane Carollo, SGL. As you know she is our parish Director of Religious Education and a member of the Servants of the Gospel of Life. Friday, the Feast of the Annunciation, Sister will observe the 40th anniversary of her profession of the religious vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience.

Congratulations, Sister Diane! Thanks for your witness and faithful service here at Saint Luke! **Stewardship in Action!**


