

A Letter from Msgr. Schaedel PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS____

Dear Parishioners,

Alleluia! He is risen! And, in a sense, so has His Church!

I was touched by the comparatively large crowds at all the Triduum Services: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday Night, and of course, Easter Sunday morning.

Our wonderful parish began to come back to life again in the warmth and Sonshine of the Risen Lord! Looking over some statistics: attendance this past Easter weekend was about 82% of what it was pre-pandemic—in 2019. Last year, in 2021, attendance was about 56% of our attendance in 2019."

Our combined weekend Mass attendance for the past several weeks has hovered around 1,200. Not back where it should be, but it seems as if we are on our way. In fact, I would guess that attendance at 9:30 Mass on Easter Sunday morning was the largest I have seen in this church—even Christmas Eve—since I came to Saint Luke ten years ago.

I get the distinct feeling that people are "hungering" to get back to Mass and to the sacraments. This is confirmed by the record number of confessions we heard during Lent. *Alleluia!*

The highlight of the whole weekend was the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday Night. It was receiving a record 20 people into the fullness of the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil through the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. With thanks to Sister Diane and the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) and RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children) teams, I congratulate and welcome all of them. **Welcome to the Family!**

Today, Sunday, April 24, is "Divine Mercy Sunday." Our observance of **Divine Mercy** will be at 3:00 p.m. Confessions begin at 2:00 p.m. Recall that Jesus died on the cross at mid-afternoon, 3:00 p.m. The Divine Mercy Service is not a Mass. It consists of Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the "Divine Mercy Chaplet," short prayers using a regular rosary, a brief sermon, and a procession with the Blessed Sacrament. It is <u>not</u> a Mass.

By the way, to gain the plenary indulgence associated with Divine Mercy Sunday, one needs to go to confession within twenty (20) days of the day itself—not necessarily on Divine Mercy Sunday.

This devotion was inspired by a Polish nun, Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska. She died in 1938. During her lifetime, Sister Faustina reported visions of our Lord, including one that inspired the painting of the now familiar image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy—"Jesus, I trust in You." It hangs above the exit near the choir area in church.

After her death, her spiritual diaries were found. She had written much about The Divine Mercy Devotion. As she had predicted, the message and the devotion fell upon hard times with Church authorities. Promotion of the message was once prohibited.

This was partly because when her religious Sisters began to transcribe her spiritual diary, they introduced many inaccuracies by adding to, leaving out, or "correcting" what she wrote. It was all done in "good faith" and translating the diary into other languages further complicated things.

When he was Cardinal-Archbishop of Cracow, Pope Saint John Paul II came to the rescue. He asked one of his top theologians to make a thorough study of Sister Faustina's writings. As a result, the road was opened to promote the Divine Mercy Devotion.

In 2000 Saint John Paul II formally canonized Sister Faustina as a saint of the Catholic Church. At the same time, the Holy Father proclaimed **Divine Mercy Sunday** as a feast for the universal Church on the Sunday following Easter Sunday.

Next Saturday, April 30, our second-graders will make their First Holy Communion at two different Masses. They are so excited for this day. What a great day this always is! Keep them and their families in your prayers.

A Tip of My *Biretta* (Hat) to: Sue Broderick who was recently honored by the Archdiocese of Indianapolis with a "Catechesis for Discipleship Award." This annual honor is given to one catechist from each of our 126 parishes. The person being honored is a catechist "who excels at teaching the Faith and witnessing to the life-changing power of a disciple-relationship with Jesus, loved in full communion with His Body, the holy, Catholic Church." Sue certainly fills the bill! Before coming to Saint Luke, Sue was a catechist in Virginia and also worked to organize and award religious awards for Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts in Virginia.

Sue has served on several committees here for the past several years. She has taught RCIC (the Rite of Christian Education for Children) for the past twelve years working with children ages 8-16. She has brought over 50 children to the fullness of Faith in this time. Wow!

Sue has been married 50 years. She has two children, four grandchildren, and one great-grandchild. In her own words: "I have enjoyed interacting with the children and their parents over the years and my hope is that I have excited and instilled enough of the Catholic Faith in the children that they will continue their Faith and pass it on to the friends, family, and future generations."

I suspect you have done that, Sue, and more! Thanks so much for your faithful service here at Saint Luke. You deserve this award! **Stewardship in Action!**

Ask Monsignor a Question: While visiting my parents last week, my mother talked about the "Easter Duty." What is that? (Via email)

The so-called Easter Duty is one of the Church's precepts for everyone who has already received First Communion. It is basically the obligation to receive Holy Communion at least once during the Easter Season.

For this purpose, the Church broadens the scope of "Easter Season" to be anytime between Ash Wednesday and Pentecost. So, for this year that means between March 2 and June 5. That should be easy to do!

At the same time, this also has some implications about going to confession at least once a year. If a person is in a state of serious sin, they may not receive Holy Communion until they have gone to sacramental confession. So, it could mean that one also needs to receive the Sacrament of Penance during this elongated "Easter Season.

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!
