# A Letter from Msgr. Schaedel

# PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners.

"Tis the month of Our Mother, the blessed and beautiful days when our lips and our spirits are flowing with love and with praise!" Those are the words of an old traditional Marian hymn we sang when I was in Catholic grade school "back in the day."

My favorite Marian hymn, is On This Day, O Beautiful Mother. My dear Irish mother used to sing it around the house, especially when she was ironing. And my third favorite is Our Lady of Providence. Educated by the Sisters of Providence in high school, we knew this one as well.

May is a wonderful month. We will celebrate Mother's Day next Sunday. Our SMRE students will have a brief crowning of the statue of Our Blessed Mother as we begin the 9:30 a.m. Mass.

We also honor Mary, our Blessed Mother, in various ways during the entire month of May. Friday, May 13, is the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima and Our Lady of the Eucharist. Our Saint Luke Catholic School 8th graders will have our traditional May Crowning on Friday, May 20 at 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, May 31, which is also Graduation Day for our 8th graders this year, is the Feast of the Visitation.

Speaking of Our Lady, I hope all of our parish ladies are able to make our annual Mary's Way Dinner and presentation this coming Thursday, May 5. This year we are teaming up with "Moms in the Middle" for a great program celebrating motherhood and the gift of life.

Our speaker this year is the award-winning actress, Joelle Maryn. She will speak about her upcoming role where she plays Our Blessed Mother. I'm about the only guy who gets to attend and I'm looking forward to it! As I mentioned last week at the Masses, during the Easter Season the Church encourages us to pray The Apostles Creed as our Profession of Faith. We usually pray the Nicene Creed which came out of the Council of Nicea centuries ago to correct some incorrect notions that had risen.

The reason for using the Apostles

Creed during the Easter Season is that it more closely aligns with the wording of the baptismal promises which are a focus at Easter. In fact, it's basically the baptismal promises put into the form of a paragraph. Plus, it's a nice change for the season.

I love May; I love Spring! Easter joy! First Communions, graduations, weddings, and all the celebrations that go with them. And I'm sure students everywhere look forward to summer vacation which is just around the corner.

I suspect this will be a memorable May for me. As you know, I will celebrate my 40th anniversary of priestly ordination on Sunday, May 22. The Mass begins at 3:30 p.m. followed by some festivities. My sister, Jan, is the chair of the committee and keeps me in "the dark" as much as possible. I hope you will join me on this wonderful day to thank God for my vocation and for all of you I am privileged to serve. I guess if I want to "get out of the dark," I can look at our parish website. I think details are there.

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: The cast and crew of the recent musical, OKLAHOMA, at Bishop Chatard High School, especially our own students from Saint Luke: Sara Borland, Destiny Brown, Julia Horlander, Ella Moore, Agnes Moriarty, Andrew Moriarty, Noeily Ramos, and Phil Tuohy!

This musical was great. I've been to lots of high school musicals over the years and I've seen none any finer than OKLAHOMA at Bishop Chatard! The talent, dedication, and hard work of these teenagers and their teachers is extraordinary.

The director and choreographer, Holly Stults, wrote something interesting in the program. She mentioned that this Rodgers and Hammerstein musical from 1943 was basically unknown to the young people. And, of course, they would not be familiar with the 1953 film either. (But I am! And I love it.) At first, they sort of wondered what in the world they were getting into! Frankly, they were not excited. But they sure "grew into it."

Holly mentions how this musical contains the common elements that make us all human: fear, guilt, jealousy, excitement, darkness, and love. Under the surface of the storyline is a constant struggle to be seen, heard, and

accepted. And, yes, there is a dark side to the storyline as well.

I lament that current plays and films seem unable to portray these same themes without vulgarity and crude language and scenes. Basically, the writers and producers seem not to be creative or talented enough. They stoop low to appeal to our lowest nature to shock people.

I was at Saturday night's performance. At first, there was a technical problem: no sound. But the director came out and said the show would go on! There was a time when we had no sophisticated sound systems for plays or musicals anywhere. We relied on the talent of the actors to project their voices and make their lines heard. Bravo!

But about 15 minutes into the show the microphones suddenly began to work and all ended well. But this episode reminded me of the days when we did not depend on sophisticated electronics and so forth for music or acting. We relied on talent, creativity, and human talents—not artificially produced sounds and sights.

O, well, I've digressed too much. But I think you get my point. The bottom line is that the recent musical, OKLAHOMA, at Bishop Chatard was outstanding and reminded me of many things. I feel certain our other high schools have such wonderful programs as well. I wish I could get to all of them. But I did make this one! Bravo!
