

A Letter from Msgr. Schaedel PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS_____

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Mother's Day! We will offer a special blessing for all mothers present at Masses this weekend. What a wonderfully dignified vocation it is to be a mother! God bless all of you!

We also honor Mary, our Mother, during this month of May. Our preschool children had their May Crowning last Tuesday. Our SMRE students will have a brief crowning of the statue of Our Blessed Mother as we begin the 9:30 a.m. Mass this weekend. Saint Luke Catholic School 8th graders will have our traditional May Crowning on Friday, May 20 at 10:00 a.m.

Gentlemen, your turn is coming up for your big event. The ladies had "Mary's Way" this past week joining with "Moms in the Middle. It was a great inspirational and enjoyable evening. The ladies let me come!

Saint Joseph MVP's Dinner is Wednesday evening, May 18. MVP's is an acronym for "Men Valuing Service and Prayer." It's generally around the Feast of Saint Joseph. That's March 19 which almost always is during Lent. Given all that goes on around here during Lent, we've moved it closer to the Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker, May 1.

Yet, for various reasons, including the availability of a great speaker, we move the date around a bit. That's why this year it is actually 17 days after the Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker. Our speaker is Chris Ballard, general manager for the *Indianapolis Colts*.

Chris is a solid Catholic and a good speaker. Given the changes in the Colts lineup, including the new quarterback, I'm sure Mr. Ballard will have lots to talk about and we will have many questions to ask. But the core of his presentation will feature how his Faith plays a part in his role at work.

During the Easter Season the Church's encourages us to pray The Apostles Creed as our Profession of Faith. We usually pray the Nicene Creed which came out of the Council of Nicea centuries ago to correct some incorrect notions that had risen.

The reason for using the Apostles' Creed during the Easter Season is that it more closely aligns with the wording of the baptismal promises which are a focus at Easter. In fact, it's basically the baptismal promises put into the form of a paragraph. Plus, it's a nice change for the season.

Our construction project on the East side of the building is on schedule for completion next month. This past week the School Commission took a short tour of the new space. It is exciting!

Personnel Announcements: As you know, our parish manager, Patrick Jendraszak, retired last December 31. He is staying on part-time to help us complete the current phase of the construction. And, it takes three people to replace him!

Frank Loughery is now serving as Parish Manger with a focus on the business or financial aspects of the job. Mark Paras will come on board next month as Director of Facilities. Jay Snyder will continue as Athletic Director and Assistant Director of Facilities. Communications Director, Brenden Kudla, has expanded his role to include IT (computers and information technology).

A Search Committee is currently interviewing applicants to become the next Director of Saint Luke Catholic Preschool. Laurie Breen is retiring at the end of the school year. We will never replace her! She started the whole thing!

As you know, I will celebrate my 40th anniversary of priestly ordination on Sunday, May 22. The Mass begins at 3:30 p.m. followed by some festivities. <u>I hope you will join</u> me on this wonderful day. It's not about me. It is about thanking God for our Catholic Faith, the Catholic priesthood, and yes, my vocation and for all of you I am privileged to serve. Ask Monsignor a Question: What do you mean by "active parishioner?" Our family is moving from out-of-State soon. We are anxious to be part of the Saint Luke Church and School. Looking at the parish and school web sites they mention "active parishioner status." How does Saint Luke define this? (Via email)

Well, basically three things:

First, recall that the minimum to be a Catholic in good standing is attendance at Mass Sundays and Holy days of Obligation. So, <u>regular</u> attendance at Mass at Saint Luke is first and most important. For various reasons, people occasionally attend Mass at another parish because of travel, Mass times, or they just don't like me. Yet one should attend Mass at one's parish more often than not. I've been at Saint Luke for just over ten years. If I've never seen you before in my life, chances are you don't qualify as a Saint Luke parishioner.

Second, one should have a parish registration form and a Stewardship Intention Card on file in the parish office. The registration form is just the standard name, birth date, family, and address sort of thing. We need to know who and where you are. The Stewardship Intention Card asks how you intend to participate in parish life. It helps us plan. But it also helps you to know what's out there in terms of ways you can be involved. It's not a pledge card. If you cannot follow through, we won't send Guido and Rocco to your door. But it's a reminder to be good Stewards of all God's gifts. No one is exempt from that.

Third is some indication of participation in parish life, especially joining the parish community at Mass. It also shows that you take seriously the privilege to be Good Stewards. This varies. Some people have more money than they have time to volunteer—and vice versa. But there should be evidence that you are not in residence at one of the local cemeteries.

I hope this is helpful to you. If you have any questions or concerns, never hesitate to contact me. I hope you learn to love Saint Luke Parish as much as I do!

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!
