

A Letter from Msgr. Schaedel PROVIDENCE NEVER FAILS

Dear Parishioners.

Forty years ago today, May 22! I was ordained a Catholic Priest by Archbishop Edward T. O'Meara at the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul downtown.

I treasure a collage of pictures from that day that hangs on the wall in my office. There I am, accompanied by my dear parents, ready to head down the aisle to receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

There is a picture of my ordination classmates and me lying flat, facedown, on the floor during the chanting of the Litany of the Saints. It symbolizes our unworthiness.

There are pictures of my First Holy Mass that same evening at my beloved home parish, Holy Name of Jesus in Beech Grove. Now retired Father James Wilmoth gave the homily. He was a major influence in my decision to go to the seminary. I love the picture of me giving my first priestly blessing at Mass to my parents.

One of my favorite theologians and authors is a French Dominican priest named Lacordaire. Here is what he once wrote:

To live in the midst of the world, without wishing its pleasures; To be a member of each family, yet belonging to none; To share all suffering; to penetrate all secrets; To heal all wounds; to go from men to God and offer Him their prayers; To return from God to men to bring pardon and hope; To have a heart of fire for Charity, and a heart of bronze for Chastity; To teach and to pardon, console and bless always. My God, what a life; and it is yours, O priest of Jesus Christ.

Father Jim Bonke is preaching at my 40th Anniversary Mass this afternoon. A couple weeks ago, Father Bonke was here and preached on Good Shepherd Sunday. It was also Vocation Sunday. Naturally, he included what he called a "recruitment pitch" in his homily. The shortage of priests (and religious) is serious. We need more priests.

But I want to encourage young men to consider it because of the immense joy and satisfaction which can be yours. I want you to have the chance to do the things I have done, go to places I have been, enter into people's lives in a meaningful way as we priests do.

I've been trying to think of a parallel example of what I mean. It's sort of

like a doctor vigorously encouraging young men to consider a career in medicine. It's not because we need more health care professionals; we have plenty. Applications to medical schools abound. No, it's because of the intense joy and satisfaction one can receive as a physician. And it's true as a "physician of souls."

A Tip of My Biretta (Hat) to: Mrs. Laurie Breen! Laurie is the pioneer who opened our (at the time) new Saint Luke Catholic Preschool six years ago. What a success! But Laurie will retire at the end of this school year. Breen's have always been active parishioners and I suspect Laurie will remain involved in parish life.

I want to honor Laurie and our preschool on Sunday, June 5. After the 11:30 a.m. Mass we will have a formal blessing and dedication of the new addition to the preschool. It will also be a chance for everyone to tour the entire facility. It is wonderful! We doubled the size and we still have a waiting list! That says it all when I think of Laurie Breen and her staff!

At the same time, everyone is invited to wish Laurie well in retirement, and thank her for her wonderful commitment to Catholic School education over the years and for our Saint Luke Catholic Preschool!

Stewardship in Action!

Ask Monsignor a Question: Congratulations on your 40 years of priesthood? What has been your favorite assignment in these 40 years? (Via email)

Well, I would have to say it is my <u>current</u> assignment: Pastor of Saint Luke Parish! And I'm not trying to be facetious!

I can truthfully say that my <u>favorite</u> assignment has always been my <u>current</u> assignment. I have <u>never</u> asked to be transferred. Over the years, I have always been content and happy in my <u>current</u> assignment.

I would have been content to remain at Saint Gabriel, Connersville. But then I was assigned to be an associate pastor at Saint Michael and a (religion and algebra) teacher at Cardinal Ritter High School.

I was very happy later as an associate pastor at Saint Monica Parish. I then became the assistant principal at Cardinal Ritter. Then it was on to Saint Malachy Brownsburg as an assistant while remaining at the high school.

I then became the President of

Cardinal Ritter High School. I continued to love parish ministry as well. I never even thought about asking for something different.

I was shocked (but probably not as shocked as others) when Archbishop Daniel Buechlein appointed me first the Vocation Director and then the Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia (Chief Operating Office of the Archdiocese) in 1994. It was pure administration, but I remained in those roles for 17 years. I loved living at the cathedral rectory with several other priests.

I became pastor of Holy Rosary Parish in 1998 where I served the beloved Italians as well as many Catholics who love the Traditional Latin Mass. Because most of my time was spent at the Chancery Office, I remained in residence at the cathedral.

In January 2011 Archbishop Buechlein was preparing to retire. He had suffered a couple strokes. Bishop Christopher Coyne from Boston was appointed our auxiliary bishop and he became the Vicar General. I went to Rome on sabbatical. And, boy, I could have stayed there! I must admit I tried a couple tricks to get to do just that, but they did not work.

In April, 2011, I got a call in Rome telling me I would become pastor here at Saint Luke that July. I came home. And here I am; I've been here ever since and am perfectly satisfied to remain here.

My favorite assignment has always been the one I was in at the time. This is proved by the fact that I never even thought about asking for a transfer somewhere else!

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!
