


LAETARE SUNDAY



The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday, from the first words of the Introit at Mass, "Laetare Jerusalem" ("Rejoice, O Jerusalem").

Like Gaudete Sunday midway through Advent, Laetare reminds us of the event we look forward to at the end of the penitential season and the joy in anticipation of the Resurrection. The vestments for this day will be rose, as they are on Gaudete Sunday in Advent.

MESSAGE FROM FR. DENNIS/OTHER

A word from Fr. Dennis

Friends

Peace be with you.

What were you doing a year ago? I was visiting a friend in Ames learning what "Covid-19" was and wondering if we were going to have to shut down for a few days. I anticipated closing for a week or two while we sanitized things and clarified what symptoms would mean a person couldn't come to Mass. Little did I know that we were looking at over three months of being closed with me looking at cameras for private Masses hoping people were watching. I said to Denise right before we closed that I wasn't sure how we'd pay the bills if we closed down for a month or two. I feared people would just gradually forget us and that personal priorities would take precedence over the church. But we made it. We tightened our belts and asked for help, which you all provided so graciously. A year later, I've had to rely so much on the graciousness of God and God's people that I think I've found an unexpected grace to the pandemic. I feel like I have a renewed sense of God's will in my life. God got me through this last year and He will get us through if we just trust Him and His people.

In the past few weeks, we've seen more and more people coming to Mass and what I hope is the return to being able to gather as the full body of Christ, the Church. This is both a hope and a challenge as we are still being asked to maintain many of the pandemic protocols like social distancing. On this past Monday, I was sitting outdoors looking at the cemetery in Springbrook reading a book and it occurred to me that this may be a solution to what we could do in anticipation of a large crowd at Easter. If our churches don't allow for social distancing, we may try to take advantage of outdoor spaces that do. The downside to this is that it requires good weather (which we can't control) and more set up (which we can control but it sort of seems silly when you have a perfectly good church next door) to have church outdoors. We could mark off one area for those who don't want to wear masks and another for those who do and keep the two groups apart for their safety and peace-of-mind. In the next month, I'll work with parish leadership to see if this could be a viable alternative when we have too many people at church. If you have suggestions as to how we can make it work, I'm all ears. If you don't think it can work, pray that we don't need to.

The book I was reading on Monday was called *Amoris Laetitia* (pronounced "Ay-more-is Lay-teets-ee-ay"), which is the Latin title for what is called either On Love in the Family or The Joy of Love in English. It is a papal document issued after a series of meetings of bishops in 2014 and 2015 to get people to think about how we might effectively evangelize families in our present time and world situation. This particular document was released in March of 2016 and has stirred up some controversy because of some statements it makes about people in same-sex relationships. Given what Pope Francis recently said about same-sex couples deserving to have certain legal

protections, it has caused some to be concerned that the church is going to be performing same-sex marriages. However, having read as far as I have, let me just say that is not the intent of this document. It is trying to get the church to think about how we are going to evangelize people as relationships become more and more secular in nature. Pope Francis took great pains to repeat that there are certain teachings about marriage needing to be open to human life involving a man and a woman that will not change. The point of this document really isn't to put forth doctrinal teachings inasmuch as to get us to think, as Archbishop Jackels likes to say, "Outside the box but inside the circle", if the box is the way we always do things and the circle is the larger practices that we don't do but are within our Catholic tradition. Occasionally, I hear people wonder why Pope Francis is saying what he is but, in reality, all we have to do is look to see what the United States is pushing as the norm and ask ourselves what effect that will have on evangelization. We can't just fold our arms and watch as so many young people live lives without any referent to the Church or Christ. I'll continue to ponder what Pope Francis has written and asking for your help to know how we can reach out effectively and faithfully.

WORSHIP AID FOR MASS

Fourth Sunday of Lent March 14, 2021- Worship Aid for Mass

Opening Hymn

Confiteor: I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, (*Striking breast*) through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Opening Prayer: O God, who through your Word reconcile the human race to yourself in a wonderful way, grant, we pray, that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Reading 1: 2 Chronicles 35:14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem.

Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost Sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled."

In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

Reading 2: Ephesians 2:4-10

Brothers and sisters: God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ — by grace you have been saved —, raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one may boast. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

Alleluia

Gospel: John 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

Homily

Profession of Faith: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was

incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.


