

# MESSAGE FROM FR. DENNIS/OTHER

## A word from Fr. Dennis

Friends

Peace be with you.

Last week, I had a question and answer document about the Bellevue Community Cupboard project that Pastor Shannon is spearheading at First Presbyterian Church in Bellevue. I'd like to finish the document this week. You may remember that the goal was to remove the stigma that can be associated with those who are food insecure. One of the easy ways that Pastor Shannon and her committee have done this is by calling it the Bellevue Community Cupboard Project instead of using more conventional terminology like soup kitchen or food bank or food pantry. It's being run out of the basement of First Presbyterian Church in Bellevue but they've just brought over the name of the ministry they were already doing in the community cupboards throughout town.

Q: What kind of donations are needed?

A: Part of our goal is to supply people with really high quality, healthy food options, as well as food that can be easily prepared. When people are in need of food, cheap food is always available, but nutritious options can be hard to afford. So we would love it if you would donate high quality food options and always food that has not expired, not the food that you don't like and are just trying to get out of your own cupboard! Most likely, if you don't like it, many others don't like it and it will end up in the garbage.

Q: How can I volunteer?

A: We will need volunteers to come one hour before the doors open each Tuesday and Saturday to start packaging food. We will need volunteers to help distribute the food. We need people to help shop, and to help restock the food. We need volunteers to help rotate the food on the shelves to prevent the food from expiring, or to dispose of food that has expired. We will need people to help spread the word, to greet and to welcome customers, and to help keep the space tidy and well organized. We will have a volunteer sign up sheet posted on the white board across from the office beginning next week. The committee is still learning how the "flow" of distribution etc. will go, so we want to be able to be well organized before we get too many volunteers at one time! If you grow a garden this summer, you can also volunteer to package any of your produce and donate it weekly!

Q: Who can access the Community Cupboard?

A: Anyone! You can! We will be sending home what you need, whether it's food for one meal, or up to a week's worth of food!

Q: What will happen to the little cupboards around town?

A: The one that has been in front of our church on Market Street will be relocated. We are not sure where yet. All three will continue to be stocked with non-perishable snack items, drinks, and basic hygiene needs. These products will be purchased locally, not from St. Stephen's Food Bank. We will let you know where the new location will be by the end of the month. We are so very grateful for the volunteers who have been filling them the last several

months. If you are interested in helping to fill them, this is another way you can volunteer!

Q: How will you handle distribution until we are clear of the COVID-19 virus?

A: We will meet customers outside and ask them how many people are in their household, if they need food for a day or two, or for a whole week, and if they have any special food requests. Then someone inside will put together a package for them and we will bring it out.

Q: Do people need to qualify to access the food/resources?

A: No. The only information we will ask is how many people are in the household and the zip code that they live in. We will give people the option to give more information if they want to receive any news or updates. People can come as often as they need, but we will limit the amount of food to one week's worth.

### Pastoral Council/Marquette School Board Elections

In the third weekend of May, we will be holding our first parish elections since 2019. We didn't hold them last year because of the Covid-19 shut down and we asked members to extend their term by one year as a result. It is now time for us to get some new members for our pastoral council and school board and give some of the old members a break. But, before we recruit new members, it's important for people know what the position entails. If, after reading the below descriptions, you are interested in either position, please call or email Fr. Dennis and let him know so he can put your name on the ballot.

The Pastoral Council provides advice to the pastor in the areas of evangelization, worship, word, community, service, stewardship, and leadership. It is meant to help the pastor provide an overall vision of what the pastoral life of the parish should look like and then help the pastor carry out that vision. It is an advisory board, not a governing body, to the pastor who is responsible for the day-to-day governance of the parishes. Nonetheless, the pastor listens to their advice and sees them as a barometer for the larger parish membership. Members should be willing to work with the pastor and other members of the council to selflessly build up their community.

Marquette School Board is made up of members of the four parishes that support the school to help the pastor and the administration provide, implement, and disseminate a vision for a quality Catholic education for Marquette Catholic School System. They come to monthly meetings with the hopes and dreams the members of their parish have for a quality Catholic education, collaborate with the school leadership and other members of the board to form a vision, help the leadership team to implement that vision, and share that vision with the members of their parish community. They also help to answer any questions people have regarding activities happening at the school and provide advice and counsel if called upon by the pastor or administration. There are some limitations on who can be on the school board so it's important to talk personally to Fr. Dennis if you are interested.

Members on all other parish boards and committees are either volunteer or appointed. If you are interested in them, please contact the chair or leader of the group and ask to be a part.
