MESSAGE FROM DEACON LORAS/OTHER

A word from Fr. Dennis

Friends

Peace be with you.

First a message from Archbishop Jackels...

"Archbishop's message: In our fight against the COVID, we're close to victory. But some people think it'll be a hard sell to get those who still aren't vaccinated to join in the fight. So, if you aren't vaccinated against the COVID, and if you're 16 years old and up, and if you don't have a medical reason that prevents you...

Please get vaccinated at your earliest convenience, regardless of which vaccine is being offered.

The Catholic Church is in favor of vaccination in general, out of devotion to the common good of public health, and as a way to practice love of neighbor. It is also in favor, or at least not opposed to getting the COVID vaccines, asserting in the strongest terms that getting them is no way a moral problem. In fact, the Pope (and the archbishop) has received the COVID vaccine, and encourages people, if the vaccine is offered, get it, no questions asked. Vaccination is the best way to stop the spread of coronavirus. So, unless we want to practice distancing and mask-wearing until Jesus comes again, get vaccinated."

Now back to Fr. Dennis...

The good news is that we're getting indications that pastors are going to get more discretion to decide which mitigation measures we feel are appropriate for our particular situation. The bad news is that it won't happen until early June. However, that's not all that bad considering it gives us some time to plan out how we are going to do things. Last March, we basically were forced to abruptly shut everything down and wait until we got the all clear from civic and church officials to restart. In May 2020, pastors and pastoral councils met and devised plans to open up in stages. Since then, we have taken our time opening things back up to make sure people feel safe and we don't contribute to an uptick of the virus in our local community that would force officials to take more serious steps to prevent overwhelming our healthcare system.

However, it's time for us to decide, for instance, if we want to remove social distancing measures. Personally, I am in favor of this because vaccinations are readily available and our county wide infection rate is in the single digits. This coupled with the most recent CDC guidance saying that social distancing of three feet is just as effective as six feet makes me feel like separating people by a pew is no longer necessary. Nonetheless, I understand that some of you may have a great deal of anxiety at the thought of not having an empty pew in front and behind you. I'm encouraging local leaders to have a section for those people in this situation to help ease them into life without the separating pew. So, I'd like to keep some pews in each parish separated this way throughout the month of June for people who are still too nervous to have someone sit behind or in front of them but the majority of pews would be open for seating. I actually think this may help with social distancing because, rather than having a static place where people can't sit, people can get creative in

their spacing and stay three feet away from people not in their household.

Other things we need to consider is mask wearing, encouraging congregational singing, putting the song books back out, putting the holy water fonts back out, starting to distribute from the cup again, and other things that changed since covid started. We don't have to do this all at once. We can take our time to allow people to feel comfortable and safe gradually. I know some of you don't need the gradual return but others do and I think we can reasonably accommodate them.

To end with a bit of humor, one of the priests at Priest's Council suggested that he'll know when the pandemic is over when people start asking for longer homilies. The Archbishop responded that, if that's the case, the pandemic may never end. Thankfully, that's not his or my metric!

Special 9-day Prayer Time from the Ascension to Pentecost

On April 4 we celebrated Easter. The author of the Book of Acts tells us that during the 40 days after His resurrection Jesus appeared to the apostles and spoke about the kingdom of God, and then **ascended** to His Father in heaven. Traditionally we celebrated the Feast of the Ascension on a Thursday (May 13 this year), but more recently bishops have been allowed to transfer the celebration to the following Sunday, which is what occurs in many dioceses, including ours. As Our Lord took leave of His disciples that day He told them to remain in Jerusalem to await the Holy Spirit who would come down upon them, and they would become His witnesses "*in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.*" The apostles, Mary the mother of Jesus, and other followers gathered together in the Upper Room and **devoted themselves to prayer** for **9 days** as they awaited the Holy Spirit. On the 10th day the promised Holy Spirit descended upon them, a feast day we call **Pentecost** – May 23 this year. Many celebrate it as the birthday of the Church.

This year let us imitate those early followers of Jesus by taking extra time each day between May 13-23 to pray, especially for: 1.) the Holy Spirit's help to strengthen and guide our parish faith communities to be welcoming and excited to share God's love, mercy and forgiveness with others; 2.) all affected by Covid-19, their families, all involved in caring for them, and a cure for this disease; 3.) our own special intentions.
