THE BAPTISM OF INFANTS

Born with a fallen human nature and tainted by original sin, children also have need of the new birth in Baptism to be freed from the power of darkness and brought into the realm of the freedom of the children of God, to which all men are called.⁵⁰ The sheer gratuitousness of the grace of salvation is particularly manifest in infant Baptism. The Church and the parents would deny a child the priceless grace of becoming a child of God were they not to confer Baptism shortly after birth.⁵¹

This excerpt from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) reminds us of the importance of baptizing our children as soon as possible after birth. The Catholic Church merely continues the tradition established by the first Christians, who heeded the words of Christ: “Let the children come to Me, and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God” (Luke 18:16).

Since the New Testament era, the Catholic Church has always taught that baptism is a sacrament which accomplishes several things, the first of which is the remission of sin, both original sin and actual sin - only original sin in the case of infants and young children, since they are incapable of actual sin; and both original and actual sin in the case of older persons.

However, I have run into situations where parents, who were born and raised Catholic, refuse to baptize their children as infants because “they do not want to force the faith on them.... They should make their own choice.”

This goes against the teaching of the Church since New Testament times. Jesus said, “Let the children come to Me, and do not hinder them; for to such [referring to the infants and children who had been brought to Him by their mothers] belongs the kingdom of heaven” (Matt. 19:14). He didn’t say the children should be allowed to make the decision to approach Him on their own, not their parents.

Parents have an obligation to raise their child in the faith. This tradition goes back to the Jewish tradition of circumcision. Paul notes that baptism has replaced circumcision (Col. 2:11–12). In that passage, he refers to baptism as “the circumcision of Christ” and “the circumcision made without hands”. Of course, usually only infants were circumcised under the Old Law; circumcision of adults was rare, since there were few converts to Judaism. If Paul meant to exclude infants, he would not have chosen circumcision as a parallel for baptism.

A child was not given the choice to be circumcised. Rather, circumcision, which was done when the boy was 8 days old, was an incorporation into the Jewish community of faith.

This comparison between who could receive baptism and circumcision is an appropriate one. In the Old Testament, if a man wanted to become a Jew, he had to believe in the God of Israel and be circumcised. In the New Testament, if one wants to become a Christian, one must believe in God and Jesus and be baptized. In the Old Testament, those born into Jewish households could be circumcised in anticipation of the Jewish faith in which they would be raised. Thus, in the New Testament, those born in Christian households can be baptized in anticipation of the Christian faith in which they will be raised. The pattern is the same.

The present Catholic attitude accords perfectly with early Christian practices. Origen, for instance, wrote in the third century that “according to the usage of the Church, baptism is given even to infants” (Homilies on Leviticus, 8:3:11 [A.D. 244]). The Council of Carthage, in 253, condemned the opinion that baptism should be withheld from infants until the eighth day after birth. Later, Augustine taught, “The custom of Mother Church in baptizing infants is certainly not to be scorned . . . nor is it to be believed that its tradition is anything except apostolic” (Literal Interpretation of Genesis 10:23:39 [A.D. 408]).

The historic Christian Church has always held that Christ’s law applies to infants as well as adults, for Jesus said that no one can enter heaven unless he has been born again of water and the Holy Spirit (John 3:5).

May God continue to pour out His blessings on you and your families.


