

Gospel Meditation A Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What makes us feel secure? Many people look to tangible forms of security that will safeguard their livelihood and prepare for their future. We tend to associate security with things: the accumulation of goods and possessions, retirement funds, savings accounts, and substantial incomes. While acquiring these promises a life with less anxiety and worry, we actually find ourselves more preoccupied and consumed with their growth and preservation. We worry more! We can easily become quasi-hoarders, consumed with obtaining more tangible crutches. Our minds and hearts are always restless, and we never seem to be at peace.

Why do we so easily give our self-worth, value, and sense of security over to things? God certainly does not deny us the pursuit of a productive and enjoyable life but where do we draw the line? A sense of well-being and happiness can easily get deferred to sometime "in the future" while we continue to wrestle with the toils of today. There is no guarantee that there will be an earthly tomorrow and all of the frenzy we bring to securing our state in life will be for naught. When we are called from this world, will we even know where to begin to look for the tranquility and repose our souls so desperately need?

We cannot be hoarders, pursuers of vanity, or greedy. They just don't work as they are too dependent on things that can fall apart. Rather than always feeling the need for more, we need to learn how to be grateful for what we have. By learning to look inward we can learn how to live lives of faithful service to others. "Happiness can only be achieved by looking inward and learning to enjoy whatever life has, and this requires transforming greed into gratitude." (St John Chrysostom)

We all need to be good stewards of what has been entrusted to our care. Grateful hearts recognize the true source of what we have and realize that our true treasure lies not in what matters to us but to God.

August Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary


The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart. Since the 16th century

Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

This devotion has received new emphasis in this century from the visions given to Lucy Dos Santos, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, in Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the visions Our Lady asked for the practice of the Five First Saturdays to help make amends for the offenses committed against her heart by the blasphemies and ingratitude of men. The practice parallels the devotion of the Nine First Fridays in honor of the Sacred Heart.

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and

compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website. 
US Bishops' Action Alert: Tell Senators to say "No" to codifying Same-Sex "Marriage"

In response to the life-saving overturning of Roe v. Wade, Congress instead of stepping up to assist women and children in need, is moving furiously to lock in other anti-family priorities.

The "Respect for Marriage Act", for example, would prevent states from restoring the authentic understanding of marriage between man and woman, if given the opportunity by the Supreme Court.

As Pope Francis has said, children have a right to a mother and a father, and we must never stop advocating for marriage, in which children do best. It is critical to protect freedom for people like small business wedding vendors and faith-based foster care agencies who serve their communities.

Helping Hands Update



During the past several months, we have been asked if *Helping Hands* still provides support to Jamaica. It is with a heavy heart that we say no. We no longer take volunteers to Jamaica to do humanitarian service nor do we send containers.

There are several reasons:

We no longer have a supportive infrastructure in the Diocese of Mandeville, where we provided all of our support. At one time, there were 27 Missionary Priests (mostly from Africa) in the Diocese of Mandeville. Helping Hands had a great supportive relationship with them. Now there are three priests left! So no support for Helping Hands in terms of transportation, identifying needy families, etc.

As you may recall, Bishop Boyle first invited Helping Hands to the Diocese of Mandeville in Central Jamaica. He provided amazing support as he recruited priests from Africa. Bishop Boyle retired and since then there have been three different Bishops – none of them supported Helping Hands nor the Missionary Priests. Hence, no more supportive infrastructure.

Food for the Poor, who sent over 200 containers for Helping Hands to the Caribbean (most to Jamaica), no longer sends containers of donated items. Recent changes in Executive Management at FFP resulted in a change of strategy regarding how they support Third World Countries throughout the Caribbean.

The combination of all of the above resulted in Helping Hands finally admitting that it is no longer possible to provide the type of support which we did for over 24 years.

We keep in touch with several Jamaican families and priests who have been a part of Helping Hands. If the situation changes whereby Helping Hands can once again be effective in Jamaica, we will resume our activities there. We do continue to support Sr. Helen and the Aids program with annual financial support.

Helping Hands is most grateful for all the support that each of you have given to the people of South-Central Jamaica!

Please keep our friends in Jamaica as well as *Helping Hands* in your prayers!






