Gospel Meditation A Deeper Understanding of Scripture

People who are concerned with their own advancement and agenda have little room for anyone else. With an almost addictive pursuit of esteem and acknowledgment from others, they become little more than entitled embodiments of the vice of pride. Public humiliation or embarrassment can hit them hard. While avoiding humiliation and embarrassment may be advantageous to obtaining worldly success, they are much less desirable motivations for entering the Kingdom of God. Avoiding embarrassment is a self-serving motivation. Pride and all of its manifestations have no place on God's agenda, neither do worldly success and fulfillment. In fact, we have been clearly told that if we love our lives, we will lose them. Therefore, if you really want to find your true station in life, learn to give yourself away.

While this may sound foolish to secular ears, it actually makes perfect sense. God, who is love, makes each of us in His image. Love, and therefore God, is in our DNA. That being the case, love is never love if it is kept to oneself or hoarded. Love needs to be shared and given away. Therefore, it is the only proper motivation for entering the Kingdom of God. The door to happiness is only opened when we realize that all we are and all we have is due only to God's grace. Without God we are nothing.

Love is the remedy for pride and protects us from ourselves. God asks us to be humble. Only when we are free from the traps of pride and arrogance can we begin to follow the path to true humility. Only one who is humble can rightly love and be of service to God. "God makes use only of the humble as His instruments (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)." The humble one does not need others to give them worth and value. Their self-esteem comes from the much more secure foundation of God. Only those who are entirely free can give themselves freely to others. Love must always be our motivation for doing all things. Be content that God has invited you to the banquet of life. Concern yourself with accepting the invitation, and don't worry about where you will sit. ©LPi

August - The Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary



The Private Heavenly Apparitions of Sister Lucia of Fatima: 1925-1952

The Spreading of the Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

On December 10, 1925, Sister Lucia was then a postulant of the Dorothean Convent in Pontevedra, the Most Holy Virgin appeared to her, and by Her side, elevated on a luminous cloud, was the Child Jesus. The Most Holy Virgin rested her hand on her shoulder, and as she did so, she showed her a Heart encircled by thorns, which she was holding in her other hand. At the same time, the Child Jesus said:

"Have compassion on the Heart of your Most Holy Mother, covered with thorns, with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment, and there is no one to make an act of Reparation to remove them."

Immediately the Most Blessed Virgin added:

"Look my daughter, at my heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce me at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console me and announce in my name that I promise to assist at the moment of death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me."

Why this Heavenly desire to ask for the communion of reparation of the first five Saturdays of the month? Our Lord told Sister Lucia on May 29, 1930, when she was in Tuy:

"The reason for the five Saturdays of the month is simple, it is because there are five types of offenses and blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1. Blasphemies against her Immaculate Conception;
- 2. Blasphemies against her Perpetual Virginity;
- 3. Blasphemies against her Divine Maternity, in refusing at the same time to recognize her as the Mother of men;
- 4. Blasphemies of those who publicly seek to sow in the hearts of children indifference or scorn, or even hatred of this Immaculate Mother; the offenses of those who outrage her directly in her holy images."

Apparitions of Our Lord

Several times, Our Lord returned to express to Sister Lucia His ardent desire of establishing in the world the devotion of reparation to the Immaculate Heart of His most Blessed Mother. He did so in March 1939, in Tuy:

"Ask that the devotion of the first Saturdays of the month in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary be recommended. The time is near when the rigor of My justice will punish the crime of many nations."

Similarly, in May 1943, also in Tuy:

"I desire most ardently the propagation of the cult of the devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, because the love of this Heart attracts souls to Me; it is the center from which the rays of My light and My love go through all the earth, and the unquenchable fountain from which the living water of My mercy flows into the earth."

Sister Lucia was so attached to this Devotion, that fulfilling the mission given to her by Our Lord, she did not cease to recommend it repeatedly by letter to her correspondents. For example:

"My mother, I would like also for you to give me the consolation of adopting a devotion I know is so pleasing to God and which our dear Heavenly Mother has requested. As soon as I became aware of it, I wanted to adopt it and see the whole world practice it... It consists only in doing what is written on that little image...The fifteen minutes [of meditation], is what can, it seems to me, give you difficulty; but it is quite easy. Who after all cannot contemplate the mysteries of the Rosary...Who cannot spend fifteen minutes in these holy thoughts, near the most tender of mothers?"

The "Good News"

Every person has the right to hear the basic proclamation of the "Good News" about their being loved and saved by God. "The subject of proclamation is Christ who was crucified, died and is risen: through Him is accomplished our full and authentic liberation from evil, sin and death; through Him God bestows "new life" that is divine and eternal [God gives us the gift of Himself, His life of grace within us, who is the Person of the Holy Spirit, who lives His life in us.] This is the 'Good News' which changes man and his history, and which all peoples have a right to hear." (Mission of the Redeemer, Pope Saint John Paul II, n. 44)

The basic proclamation needs to be presented over and over again, always providing the foundation for all faith formation.

Sample proclamation of the "Good News":

- · God knows and loves you. He desires that you enter into a deeper friendship with Him.
- Jesus gave His life to save you and now He walks by your side to free you, strengthen and guide you.
- Would you like to respond to this invitation of deeper friendship with Jesus?

Every person needs to know this Good News. A small amount can be added to the Initial Proclamation, depending on the person's level of faith and their situation in life. Note: The "Good News" is also referred to as the Initial Proclamation (known as the kerygma), and the Gospel Message.

FRANCISCAN AT HOME

Franciscan at Home online learning provides a helpful workshop entitled "The Kerygma: Key Online learning at your convenience Doctrines" which is available in the First Proclamation and Evangelization Track.

Subscription is free for the Diocese of La Crosse through a generous donor. A workshop is 6-10 minute videos followed by application questions.
