

The final three weeks of our adult Lenten program, *Pursuit of Purpose*, are now complete. Thank you to all who joined in the sessions. We had 42 adults attending, each on the day of the week that worked best for them. Here are a few thoughts from these sessions if you were unable to join us.

Week 4 – The only solution for sin is the forgiveness of God. Do you have roosters hidden in your woodpile??? Ask someone who has attended about this. "God loves us as we are, but He loves us too much to leave us this way." Bless me, Father, for I have sinned....."

**Week 5** – As food is for the body, prayer is for the soul. Are we victims of Spiritual Starvation? Prayer is NOT about accomplishing a project, but encountering a person. Spending time with Jesus doesn't change Him, it changes us. The same God who looked for Adam and Eve asking "Where are you?", looks for us as well. Where are you???

**Week 6** – The Mass is our greatest treasure, but many have struggled with it. The problem does not come from the Mass itself; rather, it comes from our understanding and approach to it. Feel the physical presence of Jesus as you walk into the church. He waits for you. God's blessings. Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! 
