The True Essence of Love

The theme for this month's "Reaching You" newsletter is "love." This is a "no brainer." With Valentine's Day tucked in the middle of the month it was only natural to see "love" as the month's theme. But what is "love?" We sure use the word in a variety of ways to express a variety of thoughts and feelings. We proclaim to our spouse, "I love you!" and in the next breath proclaim that we love pizza. We love our children and we love our pets. We love our favorite sports team and our favorite actor. We love summer evenings on the porch and winter nights in front of the fire. We love a lot for people, a lot of activities and a lot of things. Of course, we love the Lord.

Jesus often identified "love" as a verb. For Jesus, love was something we do. It is seen as a lifestyle. Jesus said, "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). Jesus went even farther when He instructed us to love our enemies (Matthew 5:44). "Love" is what we do. Jesus demonstrated that by coming into our world and into our flesh to live on our behalf, to die on our cross and to rise from the grave to promise eternal life in heaven to all who believe in Him. Jesus is true love.

Jesus showed us that loving isn't always simple or easy, but it is necessary if we want to fulfill our purpose on earth. Love is simply using our gifts and abilities in service to others. This happens in the home when we, as husbands and wives, parents and children, care for one another. This happens in the work place as we give an honest day's labor for a day's fair wage. But love is also exercised when we serve others outside our home, our workplace or our classroom. Love is displayed when we serve meals at the rescue mission. Love is given when we shovel the elderly neighbor's walks. Love is shown when we visit a shut-in or send a card to one who is ill. Love is apparent in a simple word of welcome by a greeter in the back of church or a teacher in our KidMin program.

Real love is displayed in outward service. As your pastor I encourage you to find a way to use your talents to serve others and experience the joy of real love.

Mission of the Month: Lutheran Hour Ministries

"Bringing Christ to the Nations – and the Nations to the Church"

On October 2, 1930, the first broadcast of The Lutheran Hour radio program was aired with Dr. Walter A. Maier as speaker. You can still hear the Lutheran Hour broadcast every Sunday morning by tuning in to radio 620 WTMJ at 6:30 a.m. The present voice of Lutheran Hour broadcasts is Rev. Dr. Michael Zeigler. Since those early days, the Lutheran Hour has increased its scope of ministry to include television broadcasts, Men's Network Ministry, and Mission U evangelism training seminars, among others. Weekly, Lutheran Hour Ministries reaches more than one hundred fifty million people through their broadcasts and programming efforts. They maintain more than thirty-four ministry locations that reach out to the unchurched in Jesus' name in more than fifty countries on six continents! During National Lutheran Schools week this past January, First Immanuel School took a virtual mission trip to learn of the work LHM is accomplishing in the country of Zambia on the African continent. LHM even decorates a float for the annual Rose Parade in Pasadena, California!

The Lutheran Hour also posts podcasts, offers a mobile phone app, and has a presence on so-

cial media sites. Go to <u>www.lhm.org</u> to find out more about the many ways the Lutheran Hour is reaching out into the world in the name of Jesus.



By following this verse we will develop the whole child – academically, artistically, physically, socially and spiritually - by providing a Christ centered, quality education for the children of the First Immanuel congregation and the surrounding communities."



Life's Plans and the Stephen Ministry

We all make plans for our life. We set a goal for ourselves, such as going to college, choosing a particular career position, or at what age we wish to retire, and we construct a plan to get us from where we are today to that goal. We may be working on one plan or multiple plans at any one point in our life. We know what we would like our future to look like, where we would like to spend it, and with whom we wish to spend it with. We make plans.

But being imperfect people living in an imperfect world, our plans do not always go as we would like. We can and will have setbacks. Some of the setbacks will be small such as your boss reprimanding you, losing some of your retirement money in the stock market, or not getting into your first college choice. When these setbacks occur, we may have to alter our plans somewhat and identify new options to try and paths to take. With small setbacks, we are able to adjust and proceed on.

We can also experience large setbacks in our life plans such as losing a job, getting divorced, or receiving a negative health report. These types of setbacks can cause us to go through a time of crisis. The effects of the crisis on our lives can cause us to have a lowered self-concept, increased disorganized thinking and ineffectual behavior, a preoccupation with self, irritability, a shake-up in our values and beliefs, and a reexamination of our relationship with God. During this time, we may not be able to cope with our negative experiences properly, trapping us in a negative cycle causing more damage to ourselves. After the crisis occurs, we are at a decision point. We can try to go it alone, avoiding the problem, and trying inadequate solutions that have not worked in the past. The other option is to try turning to others for assistance, acknowledging the problem, and discovering new ways of living and thinking. One path leads to greater brokenness, the other to greater wholeness.

When you are ready to ask for assistance in a setback, a Stephen Minister is available to be with you on the road to recovery. Stephen Minister is a congregational layperson that has been through more than 50 hours of specialized training to provide one-to-one Christian care to hurting people both inside and outside the congregation. Stephen Ministers care for people with a wide range of ministry needs – grief, divorce, unemployment, hospitalization, loneliness, a spiritual crisis, financial stress, terminal illness, and countless other difficulties. Stephen Ministers are trained Christian caregivers. Their role is to listen and care – not to console. A Stephen Minister will meet with you on a weekly basis. They are there for you to help you work through all of the issues of the setback for as long as you need them.

In Pursuit of the Greatest Gift – What the Love Chapter Reveals About Godly Living!

Love, the Greatest Gift of all, is based on Paul's letter to the Corinthians (1 Corinthians 13). Pastor Strubhar's book is all about that love, not just love as we humans think about it, but rather AGAPE love, the greatest virtue of all because God is its source. It is also the greatest because Christ laid down his life for our sins and it is central to Christ's teachings. And it is the basis of our discipleship. Love should be our primary pursuit—love of God and love of each other. This love is expressed through our faith with the Holy Spirit pouring agape love into our lives so we can live love every day.

Agape love covers all relationships in our life; to God and to others. It includes self-sacrifice, self-giving, and is other-centered with nothing expected in return. Without this key ingredient in our life, we can't show our spiritual gifts to others and we can't make the Word of God come to life for them. Without it we lack humility, graciousness, kindness, and are short-sighted. But with agape love, we have the ability to see God's point of view, show generosity to one another, and accomplish all that He wants us to. We can give messages of love, joy, and hope to others, giving of our time and resources just as God does in our lives.

Agape love is action, motion. In Paul's words it is patient, kind, doesn't envy or boast, display arrogance or rudeness, fails to insist on its own way, and is not irritable or resentful. This means always looking for the best in others, displaying kindness, consistency, selflessness, and forgiveness. In other words, others in our life are more important than we are, just as Christ lived his life. For us, we need to think and act like Christians with God's Word and truth permeating all we do. And we need to praise God for His grace and forgiveness.


Agape love has "heart", rejoicing with truth, exuding courage and relentlessness. It doesn't involve evil, senseless acts of violence, and participation in the ugliness around us. With it we celebrate what is good, remembering heaven is our final

and true home. This Christ-like love covers and protects, giving us the strength to reach out to others. God has a purpose for us and in all things. Christ-like love allows both blessings and burdens. To understand these things, we need God's Word and our prayers, giving us strength and endurance.

God's agape love gives us hope and a promise for our future as well as bringing us joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, and faith. His love will outlast everything in this world and has staying power for all time. Faith, hope, and love are forever. We need to pursue them all during our life. And we need to remember AGAPE love is the greatest of all, being central to Christ's teaching while he was on earth with his Father as its source. Our primary goal on earth is to love God and each other. Our life here should be "othercentered" at all times. This is true agape love!

In Pursuit of the Greatest Gift is a 118-page book containing Biblical quotations with their explanations. It contains a Note from Strubhar, an Introduction and Conclusion as well as Notes explaining resources used, information about the author, and an explanation about "Sermon To Book" for other pastors. It is a motivating text and easy to read. A helpful suggestion would be to first read 1 Corinthian 13 because it is the total basis for the book.

At the end of each chapter is a set of questions based on information provided as well as space for an answer. Following this is an application-action step with writing space. Both are designed to get readers reflecting on Christ-like love and applying it on a daily basis. The book is designed for Godly living every day of our lives.

Gary Chapman's research suggests that we have 5 love languages. While we all appreciate one love language, usually one stands out above all the other! What is your love language?


Gary Chapman's 5 Love Languages**

To All Caregivers—From My Heart to Yours

But Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." Matthew 19:26

As we look at love in service to others this month, I cannot think of a better example of that than those who are actively engaged in caring for loved ones. I am focusing especially on the long-haul caregivers who work to improve the lives of parents, family members, or friends who are aging or facing debilitating illness or other challenges. Each one of you is a hero.

All caregiving roles—whether daily hands-on care or supportive roles—challenge me mentally and physically and emotionally and spiritually and leave me weary.

- At times I have felt like a sandwich, pressed together between two generations.
- Other times I have felt totally isolated; my life was so filled with the endless tasks and demands of caring for someone else <u>all the time</u> that I had little or no contact with others.
- Most often I feel like taffy—pulled apart, stretched, and yanked around. I am tugged at by all the parts of
 my life, by the demands of caregiving, my family, my ministries, my need to take care of myself, and my
 desire to serve my Lord.
- No matter how hard I try, I can never do any of my roles and vocations completely or as well as I want to. I want my loved ones to have the best of me, but my efforts feel so limited and imperfect. I feel guilty about my limitations.

All of these responses are natural and appropriate. As a caregiver for various family members and friends over more than 30 years, I have experienced all of them.

I hope you already know this fact: *It is impossible to survive as an effective caregiver without the strength, grace, and mercy of God. You must walk with God!* Faith grows—deepened and strengthened by the Holy Spirit—through each of these seasons of caregiving. And be comforted that you truly are not alone. God is walking with you even on those days when you don't see or feel his presence, or even know for what to pray.

The Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good for those who are called according to his purpose. Romans 8:26-28

Be assured that all caregivers struggle to be enough, to be sufficient to the demands. Give your guilt to God.

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. Romans 8:1

Suggestions (prayerfully offered):

- Actively seek to create a support system. If you don't know where to start, I would recommend contacting Pastor Reichmann to request a Stephen Minister who can listen and support you.
- If someone offers help or encouragement, get creative and figure out how they can help. Accept help!
- Join a Reach Group Bible study. If it's hard to get out of the house, invite them to meet in your home. (It's okay. They won't expect a clean house.) And your loved one can benefit from God's Word and fellowship.
- Join a Zoom Bible class. You can do that while you are still caring for your loved one.
- Engage in God's Word in new ways.

May God's peace be with you. To Him be the glory!

Valentine's Day: what a great celebration- love in the air, candy hearts, sweet notes, cute stuffed animals. At least that's what the cards suggest. More often than not, February highlights our loneliness, not our loveliness. The days are still dark, the nights are still cold, and our calendar is still much more empty than we hope- or filled with things we dread rather than desire.

Are you lonely? You can be lonely, whether or not you have people in your life. So the question becomes, why are we lonely? A major part of loneliness is feeling unknown, unimportant, insignificant, not valuable. We are lonely because we don't have life-giving relationships. We are lonely because we lack relational responsibility and importance. We are lonely because no one is really there for us- and we aren't really there for anyone else.

First, just be honest with yourself. Say it with me: "I'm lonely." There is freedom even in speaking it out loud. And that is because there is Someone listening, who hears even in your confession your great need. Your honest confession is an invitation to the God who "will never leave you or forsake you." God hears you. God is ever present with you.

As with Hagar in the wilderness, ready to give up because she has been kicked out of her home and abandoned, hiding her son because she doesn't want to see him die, weeping and crying, God draws near. "What troubles you?" he asks. "Fear not, for God has heard," God reassures her (Genesis 21:12-21). And God reassures us. God is with us, no matter what. God hears our heartache. God is present in our loneliness.

We are lovely to God, even when we are lonely. We have a community- a Trinity of love- ever present with us. And, oftentimes, we do have people around us, too. We just undervalue or under-appreciate or neglect those people and relationships that are there. Or we are too afraid to find new, life-giving relationships.

If you're struggling with loneliness, find someone this month, and ask them these questions:

How are you, really?

What is bringing you joy these days?

Do you believe you are meeting God's call for you right now? How so?

What's going well for you? What are you struggling with?

How can I be there for you?
