

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

I notice that at Catholic funerals a white sheet is placed over the casket. Sometimes the family places the sheet and, sometimes, the Funeral Director does this. What's the meaning?

The white cloth that you refer to is called the 'pall'. The word 'pall' comes from the Latin word 'pallium' which means 'cloak'. Like many of the traditions in our Church, the pall's original purpose or meaning changed with time. In the Middle Ages, wealthy people would be brought to church in elaborate caskets, sometimes even adorned with precious jewels. Poor people were brought to church in a hastily assembled box made from scrap lumber. Palls were placed over the casket at the beginning of Mass as a sign of the equality of all Christians before God, rich or poor. The palls eventually became more and more elaborate ensuring that the poor person, rich in Christ, was afforded the same dignity of the wealthy person.

As times changed, the pall was given a new spiritual meaning. That meaning is made clear in the prayer that is said as the pall is placed over the casket at the beginning of the Funeral Mass. "On the day of baptism, our brother/sister, put on Christ. On the day of Christ's coming may he/she be clothed in glory." The pall is now a reminder of the white garment that we wore on the day of our baptism. We are called to bring that garment unstained into everlasting life.



The Russian invasion of Ukraine has captured our hearts and attention as we receive daily reports of the suffering of innocent civilians. 
