Happy Sunday and Happy Lent! Let's reflect this weekend on the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

- 1. The prophecy of Simeon. When Jesus was presented in the temple Simeon had told Mary that her heart would be pierced with a sword. The Blessed Mother watched her Son be crucified.
- 2. The Flight into Egypt. Saint Joseph was the protector of Mary and the child Jesus. May we be protectors for those under our care. Let's pray for refugees and all displace people.
- 3. The loss of the child Jesus in the Temple. The young Jesus grew in age and in wisdom as he became obedient to his parents. May we be obedient to God and those who love us and watch over us.
- 4. Mary meeting Jesus carrying his cross. The Blessed Mother was stricken with grief as her only begotten Son was spat upon and blood was covering his body. Let's pray for parents who watch their children suffer.
- 5. The Crucifixion. Mary's heart was pierced with a sword as her Son died on the altar of the cross. Let's pray for parents who have lost a child through death.
- 6. Mary receiving the Body of Jesus from the Cross. The pieta statue says it all. A mother holds the lifeless body of her Son. Let's pray for all who lose their life through violence and war.
- 7. The Body of Jesus being placed in the tomb. Let's pray for all people who have buried a loved one that they may find comfort in their belief in the resurrection.

When I came into the Church some years ago, I was confirmed at the Easter Vigil by the pastor of my parish. My nephew is being confirmed this year, and he is going to the cathedral to be confirmed by the bishop. He told me that only a bishop can confirm someone in the faith. Was my confirmation valid?

Rest assured that you were validly confirmed! Your nephew is correct in that the bishop is the ordinary minister of the Sacrament of Confirmation. But on certain occasions the bishop can, and does, delegate priests to confirm candidates for confirmation. This is especially true at the Easter Vigil when the Church ordinarily receives new adult members into the Church. Bishops, who can only be in one place at a time, delegate pastors to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on that occasion. Pastors look forward to the Easter Vigil each year for many reasons, and this is one of those reasons!




