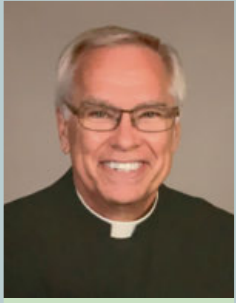

A Change in Mass Schedule

Tuesday, April 12, Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 am rather than 5:30 pm. This will allow Monsignor Tony and Fr. Todd to participate in the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral and a dinner that will follow that evening. This is one of the rare times during the year in which all of the priests of the Archdiocese are able to be together for prayer and fellowship. The Chrism Mass is at 2:00 pm and a reception that will follow are open to all parishioners.



Dear friends,

With the celebration of Palm Sunday, we enter the holiest week of our Church Year. During this week, we will commemorate in very special liturgies the great events of our salvation. The liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday's Easter Vigil are once in a year celebrations. These are liturgies that deserve our presence and our participation.

We will remember Jesus' gift of the Eucharist and the institution of the priesthood at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. At this liturgy the feet of twelve parishioners will be washed as a reminder of Jesus' example of servant leadership. We invite the children who will be celebrating their First Holy Communion this year to bring flowers to the altar at the very beginning of Mass. Following the Mass on Holy Thursday, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place until midnight.

Good Friday is the one day of the year in which Mass is not celebrated anywhere in the world. On this day in which we remember Jesus' sacrifice on the cross that is commemorated and made present in every Mass, the Church gathers her children for the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion. We will hear the Gospel account of Jesus' suffering and death. We will solemnly venerate the cross, and a Communion Service will take place using hosts that were consecrated at the Mass on Holy Thursday.

Holy Saturday is a quiet day of reflection. As the sun sets, we will gather for the great Easter Vigil, the Mother of all Vigils. This liturgy that begins with the blessing of the fire and the new Paschal Candle, will include the reception of the men and women of the RCIA into full communion in the Church through the celebration of the Easter Sacraments. It culminates with the first Mass of Easter Sunday and once again the 'alleluias' will resound around the world as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead. This week is so important that it should be a week unlike any other. Our parish church should be filled for all of the liturgies of Holy Week. In this week in which we remember the price at which our salvation was won for us, Psalm 116 asks the question, "How can I repay the Lord for his goodness to me? May our participation in the liturgies of Holy Week be one of the ways in which we recognize and thank God for his never-ending goodness. I especially encourage families with children to participate in the Holy Week liturgies. The sights and sounds of these special days will impact our children in ways that are important for their spiritual development. Jesus once told us, "Let the children come to me." We extend a special invitation to the children of the parish to be a part of Holy Week.

Finally, I would like to invite parishioners of Christ the King who are able to participate in the Chrism Mass which will take place at the Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul on Tuesday, April 12, at 2:00 p.m. This is a Mass celebrated by the Archbishop and all of the priests of the Archdiocese at which the priests renew their promise of service to the Church, and the Holy Oils used in the sacraments are blessed and distributed to the parishes. All are welcome!

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Why do some churches cover the statues with purple cloths during Holy Week?

Before the Second Vatican Council, the custom of covering statues and crucifixes in churches with purple cloths during Passiontide was common. Passiontide is the name given to the last two weeks of Lent, beginning on the Fifth Sunday of Lent and continuing through the celebration of the liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday. The covering of the statues and crucifixes was a stark reminder to people of the solemnity of the days leading up to and including Holy Week. The custom began in Germany in the 9th century and, by the time of the Middle Ages, statues and crucifixes were covered all through Lent. In the 17th century, the practice became limited to Passiontide. Today, the practice is allowed, but not required.

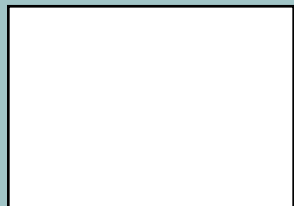

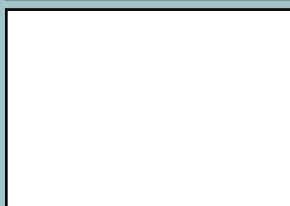

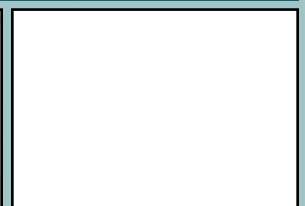
