

Dear friends,

Last Sunday we gathered in good number and with great joy to celebrate Easter. Easter, like Christmas, is such an important feast that it has an entire season of celebration. For the next seven weeks we will 'take in' the incredible news of Easter. The tomb is empty! He is risen! The Easter Season will culminate in the great Feast of Pentecost on June 5.

Today, the Second Sunday of Easter, is Divine Mercy Sunday. This feast was instituted as a universal feast of the Church by Pope Saint John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Saint Faustina Kowalska in the year 2000.

Saint Faustina was a Polish nun who lived from 1905-1938. She had a series of visions in which Jesus spoke of God's great mercy and his desire to save sinners. She was given a vision of an image of Jesus with two rays of light extending from his heart. Below the image were the words, "Jesus, I trust in you." Saint Faustina was called to be an Apostle of Mercy and to make God's mercy and the image of Jesus that she had seen known to the world. Jesus promised Saint Faustina that those who venerate that image, with trust in God's mercy, would not perish.

Devotions associated with Divine Mercy have become widespread throughout the world and include a novena, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and the designation of 3:00 p.m. each day as the hour of mercy in which the faithful are to pray for those near death. Each deanery has parishes that will conduct Divine Mercy Devotions this Sunday. In the North Deanery our neighboring parish of Saint Luke will host Divine Mercy Devotions from 3:00 pm – 4:00 pm, and Saint Simon will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet from 2:15 pm – 3:15 pm All are welcome!

Copies of the Divine Mercy picture and a brief explanation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy Chaplet are available in the main vestibule this weekend.

Please keep in prayer our high school youth who will be confirmed by Archbishop Thompson at the Cathedral Saints Peter and Paul this Wednesday evening, April 27. They are a gift to the Church and to our parish.

How is the date for Easter established? Christmas is always celebrated on December 25. I never know when Easter will fall. Wouldn't it be easier to celebrate it on the same date every year?

Yes, it would be easier to celebrate Easter at a fixed time each year, but Easter is a 'moveable' feast. It falls each year somewhere between March 22 and April 25. The Church celebrates Easter at the time the Jewish community celebrates Passover. Christians see Easter as the new Passover in which we are liberated from sin and death through Jesus' paschal sacrifice on the cross. We, follow, therefore the Jewish calendar in setting the date for Easter. It is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the Spring Equinox which falls on March 21. Easter remains a 'moving target', but at least we can narrow the date for its celebration to a day between March 22 and April 25.

Many Catholic Home Missions-funded dioceses have small Catholic populations spread across vast territories, and the Diocese of Jackson is no exception. Spanning 37,000 square miles of northern Mississippi, the diocese is the largest territorial diocese east of the Mississippi River, with a population that is only about 2% Catholic. The minority status of



Catholics in the diocese affords them regular opportunities to witness their Catholic faith with family, friends, and neighbors who belong to other Christian traditions, As a result, the area's Catholics - particularly youth seeking the Sacrament of Confirmation - want to know their faith better to be able to share it. Another example of a Home Mission is the Eastern Catholic Melkite Eparchy of Newton. These Catholics are in full communion with the Holy Father and total about 85,000 members covering the entire United States. Despite the challenge of geographic distance communications through the internet and a diocesan quarterly magazine keep the members in touch with one another and their bishop.


