



Dear friends,



Some months ago I shared with you that I was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease. It is a progressive neurological disorder in which brain cells that produce certain essential chemicals begin to die off. Tremors and balance issues are the most noticeable physical signs of Parkinson's, but the disease also has many non-motor symptoms that affect memory, mood, concentration, speech, vision and sleep. Researchers have discovered drugs that help lesson some of the effects of the disease, but a cure has not yet been found.

Parkinson's affects people in different ways. In my case, the most prominent physical effect has been a continuous tremor on the right side of my body. My arm and my hand sometimes have a life of their own! While the tremors are becoming more pronounced, it is the non-motor symptoms that are most affecting

my ability to function well.

A series of neurological tests reveal that the cognitive problems most often associated with Parkinson's, especially short term memory and a series of abilities classified as 'executive functions' which limit the ability of a person to process several things at the same time, are present and pronounced in my case.

Over the past year, my doctors have recommended that I retire from active ministry in order to be able to dedicate time to some of the treatments that have proven effective in managing Parkinson's. Archbishop Thompson and the Personnel Board have notified me that, effective July 6, 2022, my request for early retirement will be granted.

I will turn 70 in November of this year. In the ordinary course of events, July of 2023 would be the time for retirement. Parkinson's is anticipating that time by one year.

It has been a wonderful privilege to serve as pastor of Christ the King. The announcement of the appointment of new pastors will be made sometime in May. In the meantime, members of the Personnel Board are meeting with the parish staff and the Pastoral Council to better know the needs of the parish to help Archbishop Thompson choose your new pastor.

I know that he will find a warm and enthusiastic welcome to Christ the King and will be blessed to serve at one of the finest parishes of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis.

Are there any ordinations to the priesthood this year? What are we doing to promote vocations? It looks like our priests are getting older and older. Shouldn't we be worried?

First, the good news. After two years without any ordinations, Deacon Michael Clawson and Deacon Matthew Perronie will be ordained to the priesthood on June 4th. This past Saturday, Archbishop Thompson ordained two men to the transitional diaconate. Deacon Jack Wright and Deacon Jose Neri will be ordained to the priesthood next year. Twenty-one other men are in the discernment process at Bishop Simon Brute College Seminary and Saint Meinrad Seminary. We thank God for these vocations.

Shouldn't we be doing more? Yes! In the coming weeks we will re-establish our Vocations Committee. Parishioners Jim and Trish Funk have accepted to lead the committee as we study best practices from other parishes and learn ways that we can promote vocations at Christ the King. Obviously, this is a very important committee for our parish and for the Church. Please be open to serving on the committee!

Let us not forget that fifteen men will be ordained to the Permanent Diaconate on June 26. The Permanent Diaconate has been a great gift to the Church since its re-establishment following the Second Vatican Council. There are currently sixty Permanent Deacons serving in parishes in the Archdiocese. We thank God for these men and their vocations.

Should we be worried. No. Concerned? Yes. May this concern lead all of us to pray for vocations each day and to promote and support vocations in our families and our parishes.


