



What is a Third Order? I was talking to a parishioner who is a Third Order Carmelite. What exactly does that mean?

A Third Order is made up of lay persons who strive to live the spirit or charism of a particular Religious Order in their everyday lives. Carmelites, Dominicans, Franciscans and Benedictines all have 'third orders.' Men and women who are members of a Third Order live and work in the world and gather at regular intervals for prayer and formation in the spirituality of the particular Religious Order to which they are associated. They participate in the good works of the Order. Third Orders offer laypersons the opportunity to grow in holiness. Third Order Carmelites, for example, dedicate themselves to prayer and contemplation and devotion to the Blessed Mother which is at the heart of Carmelite spirituality.

Many Religious Orders include a 'First Order' made up the male religious, often the first founded, and a 'Second Order' made up of female religious, and a 'Third Order' made up lay men and women.




Join the Sports Committee on Monday, May 23 at 7pm in Tuohy Hall as we celebrate all of our CYO teams and especially our graduating 8th graders.


