




Formation

No doubt we've all heard a comment similar to this from people we know. But what does it mean to be a "spiritual" person? Join us as we begin to explore the idea of spirituality through the writings of some well known and some not-so-well known individuals. On April 8th, at 6:30 PM we will begin our journey towards what we hope will help us to discover "spirituality" in our own lives.

Each month we will select a book that seeks to express one person's understanding of true spirituality and how it affected his or her life. Although we will explore a number of admired Catholic authors, the reading list will not restricted to writers exclusively from our faith tradition. We will read from the works of Flannery O'Connor, C.S. Lewis, Thomas à Kempis, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Richard Rohr, and the Dalai Lama among many others. 

Haiti—Sister Parish Update

Dear Fellow Parishioners.

On behalf of the Sister Parish Committee, we recently sent an email to Fr. Marc-Arthur, our contact at St. Therese Montessori and Pastor of St. Louis Cathedral, inquiring on their well-being and their progress after Hurricane Matthew.

We received the following email from Fr. Marc-Arthur providing information on their status. (The Sister Parish Committee will discuss the issue of broken pews and would hope to offer a small amount of money to aid in the restoration.)

Sister Parish Committee

Dear Sir,

I am pleased to write to you to give you the news of the parish of the cathedral Saint Louis King of France of Jérémie.

At first glance, I thank the parish of Our Lady of the Assumption Cathedral, our sister parish, for the attention it always gives to Saint-Louis Cathedral in Jérémie, Haiti. Thank you for the help you have given us for years to feed the children of École Sainte Thérèse. I also thank you for your support of the food project for people in difficult circumstances and homeless people. I hope you will continue to help us maintain these charitable and social works.

I take this opportunity to announce that the Rosebud Foundation, USA, will financially support the food project for the homeless and poor for a period of six months. The beneficiaries will be able to feast at our center seven days a week instead of three days

(Monday, Wednesday, Friday). At the second glance, I announce you a good news: the replacement of the false ceiling of the cathedral Saint Louis of Jérémie, destroyed by Hurricane Matthew, is now realized. We worked hard to get there. In the course of March 2019, work will begin on the replacement of the mosaic of the cathedral package. We found funding to redo the package. We hope everything will run smoothly.

The furniture of the Saint Louis Cathedral was badly damaged by Hurricane Matthew. The replacement of the false ceiling has aggravated the situation. We had to repair the decorative statues. As for the benches, they are in bad condition. Some are broken, others have holes. It is a necessity for us to replace them. As our financial means are very limited, we are looking for help in rebuilding the benches and chairs of St. Louis Cathedral. We estimate that we need \$ 50,000.00 USD to manufacture 100 benches at a rate of \$ 500.00 USD per unit.


We rely heavily on your prayers to be reborn from our ashes. On our side, we pray for the parishioners of Our Lady of the Assumption Cathedral and for its pastor.
