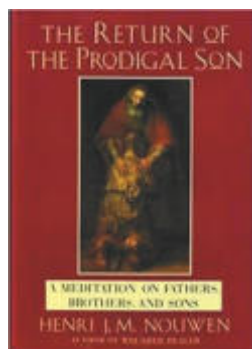

On April 8, at 6:30 PM we will begin our journey towards what we hope will help us to discover "**spirituality**" in our own lives.

Each month we will select a book that seeks to express one person's understanding of true spirituality and how it affected his or her life. Although we will explore a number of admired Catholic authors, the reading list will not be restricted to writers exclusively from our faith tradition. We will read from the works of Flannery O'Connor, C.S. Lewis, Thomas à Kempis, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Richard Rohr, and the Dalai Lama among many others. Participants will be encouraged to recommend books that have influenced and enlightened their own spiritual lives.

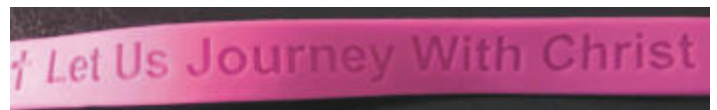
