been the ever-efficient coordinator of the hundreds of volunteers who prepare, serve, clean, pick-up donations, etc. She has been our lunch program's spokesperson at Catholic schools that participate in social service outreach programs. While Elaine will still be a lunch program volunteer, she is stepping away from her position as coordinator.

Elaine, thank you for your caring and enthusiastic stewardship of this part of our parish's outreach mission and ministry.

The new Lunch Volunteer Coordinator is Sharon Horn. She and Elaine have been working together for a smooth transition. Sharon usually works as part of the Wednesday lunch team. She is a long time parishioner, member of the Cathedral Singers, and a liturgical minister. Welcome aboard!

Our Cathedral Daily Lunch Program continues serving meals through the pandemic and the social unrest. Although some of our volunteers who are in the vulnerable category for Covid 19 have had to curtail their involvement for the time being, our lunch guests have received nourishment each day. Meals are placed on a tray for picking up at the door to Sandefur Dining Room while dining in has been halted due to the pandemic. For several weeks, Brown-Forman augmented our menu with a second bag lunch for each guest. Thanks to the generosity of donors, we have been able to continue adding an extra sandwich and snack to help ease the burden of hunger during these trying times. In the past few months, the majority of guests have been homeless.

The Cathedral State I.D. Voucher Program did not issue any vouchers in April or May while government offices were closed. In late June, as the offices opened, issuing vouchers resumed. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, 316 vouchers were issued; of those, 236 people completed the process of receiving a state I.D.

Update from Central Louisville Community Ministries

As the pandemic grinds on, we are continuing to help our neighbors meet their needs. There has been an ongoing mask-making effort through the Women's Alliance at First U, and they could use your help. Fabric, including gently used sheets, would be welcome, as well as small, soft elastic and, most importantly, people who are willing to make masks. Folks can contact me and I will connect them with help with patterns, materials, and advice. There is still a tremendous need for masks in the community, so please pass the word to anyone that you think could help.

In the office, we continue to distance into separate rooms, mask, wash hands, and sanitize our work areas. We need sanitizing wipes for every work station, and they are hard to come by. When you are shopping, if you see sanitizing wipes, please consider buying one for us--any additional would be much appreciated.

We continue to spend tremendous amounts of funding to keep people housed and their utilities on, and

we don't anticipate that this need will end any time soon.

Update on St. John Center

Each July, St. John Center begins a new fiscal year. This week, the staff spent a day evaluating our three programs; Street Outreach, the Day Shelter and Social Services Center, and the Permanent Supportive Housing Program. The onset of the global pandemic significantly changed many of the ways we are able to provide services. Still, every day our goal is to be a place people experiencing homelessness can seek help, find hope, and move home. In the last 12 months The SJC/UP Street Outreach team provided **4,770** services to **1,167** people living on the streets in our community. **2,101** different people visited the Day Shelter **60,153** times. That is an average of **164** visitors each day. And **96%** of the formerly homeless men living in our Permanent Supportive Housing program retained their housing for 12 months or longer. Legacy and Vision Campaign

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Two years ago, our parish set off on a course with a capital campaign known as Hail, Full of Grace! Legacy and Vision Campaign. This weekend marks the beginning of our third and final year of this journey together. We are blessed to have our new Rector, Very Rev. Martin A. Linebach with us now, to lead us in our final year of this campaign.

I am pleased to announce today that 93% of the Vision component of the capital campaign portion for capital improvements has been pledged. We are now so close to the \$3 million goal, that nothing should stand in our way this final year to achieve that goal. I am pleased to invite you to experience some of the projects that this campaign has facilitated for the replacement or repair of these needed systems. Initially, visible projects like the chairs, the sound system, the HVAC, and the carpet in the undercroft offered all of us the visual update we had anticipated. We are now moving forward with additional projects which could not have been realized without the financial commitment of this parish. In this final year we hope to surpass the \$3 million goal for projects as well as continue to invite all parishioners to consider ways that they can contribute to the endowment portion, formally called the Archbishop Thomas C. Kelly Legacy Fund for the future care of our beloved Cathedral. Again, it was our parish who came together to form the first endowment for the ongoing care of this nearly 175-year-old Cathedral. Currently 82% of that \$3 million goal has been pledged.

The past few months have presented unbelievable and unforeseen challenges. Despite these challenges, our beloved Cathedral has stood as a beacon of hope. She has shone her light in the past, and we have the responsibility to help the Cathedral light the way for future generations. In this final year, please join me in a prayerful effort to bring our community into this sacred space and to realize the blessings of the Holy Spirit and the watchful protection of the Blessed Mother – Our Lady of the Assumption, and to help us all get closer to Jesus Christ. In the coming weeks, we will be providing detailed information of the projects and the status of the Hail, Full of Grace Vision and Legacy Capital Campaign.
