Catholic School Tuition Assistance Applications Open



Copies of your 2020 tax returns and W2s are submitted with the application form. Go to: www.ceflou.org to apply online. Complete only one FACTS application for your family, including all students in the family (elementary and high school) on the same form. FACTS will send a need evaluation to all funding sources for which each family could qualify as well as the schools you have listed on the form.
