

Holy Family Parish Mission Statement: We are a welcoming community of disciples who proclaim the Word, prayerfully worship, and compassionately serve. LETTER FROM FR. TOM: This is our day! This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. This is the Feast Day of our parish. It is a bit sad that it is overshadowed by Christmas, which limits our celebration. When I think of "Holy Family Parish," I think of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, but I also think how each family in our parish is called to

become a holy family. We usually don't think of our family as having a "goal." Family is just family, but we should think about the role of our family. I hope that parents see their role as helping their children to grow in holiness, to become loving, and to know Jesus Christ. In other words, the family exists to help one another become saints.

When it comes to faith issues, families often turn to our parish. They send their children to Holy Family Catholic School or to our faith formation program. Our parish can help them to know their faith - that is true. We have excellent education programs in our parish; however, there are two things which can only happen at home, and which are normally taught by the parents. First, children will only learn how to live the faith - the habits of faith - in the home. Within the parish, we can talk about going to Mass, going to confession, and praying before bed, but unless this is practiced in the family, it will not

happen. Parents need to remind their children every night to say their prayers. Children will only learn the habit of going to Mass if their parents bring them to Mass. Children will only learn virtues and how to be loving if this is reinforced daily in the home. The home becomes the place where children learn to live their faith.

Secondly, in the parish, we teach about Jesus - his life, his teachings, his death and resurrection, but only parents can help their children to love Jesus. Parents, by their own loving actions and teachings, will help their children to love Jesus and want to be with Jesus.

This weekend, we are celebrating the "Feast of the Holy Family." Let us look to the family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as our model. Let us aspire and plan to make our families holy families!




